Tourism project receives Township support

Considering the possible positive economic impact any tourism development could have on the community, it is no surprise the municipal council has thrown its support behind a proposal to construct facilities for an All Terrain Vehicle(ATV) based enterprise which will also focus on ecotourism.

A local firm, "Ride the North," has

applied to erect two permanent facilities on Crown Land near Chapleau, and the Ministry of Natural Resources is in the process of gathering local input.

When it came to Chapleau Municipal Council last week, there was unanimous support in the form of a resolution sponsored by Deputy Mayor André Byham. It was noted the ATV's are used 11 months of the year and would be an asset in the local tourism package.

While there is continuing controversy over the status of the Chapleau Crown Game Preserve, the Ride the North proposal would include ATV guided tours of the Game Preserve. They would embrace hiking, biking, photography and animal viewing using existing roads and trails only.

The Ride the North development proposal includes two independent cabins, each with a four-person capacity. The









sites will incorporate modern facilities and offer housekeeping plan accommodations and guiding service, and equipment rentals.

If the proposal is successful, it would be taking advantage of two of the fastest growing sectors of tourism. Studies have

shown that both ecotourism and driving ATV's are at the top of the list when it comes to favoured outdoor activities.

Child Care services still an issue

Still smarting from the decision by one agency to shift its child welfare responsibilities in the township to another, the Chapleau municipal council continues to build support over its concerns to the recent move.

The Township is reacting to the decision in February by the Children's Aid

Society of the Districts of Sudbury and Manitoulin to close its office here. As a result, foster care cases have been shifted to The Kunuwanimano Children and Family Services, based in Timmins.

A resolution adopted at last Monday's regular meeting of Council will be circulated among the other district muni-

cipalities. In the resolution, the Province is chastised for allowing the decision to transfer responsibility for child care without input from the affected municipalities.


It accuses the provincial government of allowing the Sudbury Children's Aid Society to make a decision without any Township Council involvement,

knowledge or input. "This is a significant issue."

When the transfer of responsibilities was being made Mayor Earle J. Freeborn wrote Mary Anne Chambers, the Minister of Children and Youth Services, to say the move was totally unacceptable, claiming it would have a severe impact on child care services.

The Township is asking the other

municipalities under the jurisdiction of the Manitoulin and Sudbury District Children's Aid Society to tell the Minister they agree with Chapleau's concerns and its contention that a change of this nature is one that requires the knowledge and the involvement of affected municipalities before it is simply externally imposed.

Everyone deserves a beautiful smile: Health Unit's Message for oral health month

“Everyone Deserves a Beautiful Smile.” That's the message the Sudbury & District Health Unit is promoting during Oral Health Month in April. Even today, dental disease is still a very real problem. Research indicates that one of every four children aged three to six has experienced dental caries (cavities), and 80 per cent of these children have extreme

oral health needs. The health unit offers a program that pays for dental care for children with urgent dental needs if their families do not have a dental plan and cannot afford to pay for dental care. Preschool and elementary school-aged children may be eligible for the program, called “Children In Need Of Treatment” (CINOT), if they have dental

pain, infection, large cavities, bleeding gums or have mouth injuries.

The Ontario Association of Public Health suggests that children see a dentist by their first birthday. With this new approach, parents learn the proper steps to good oral hygiene for their children. Here are some things parents can do to help care for the oral health of children up to the age of four years:

- From birth, wipe your baby's gums after every feeding.
- Soon after teeth appear, brush your child's teeth twice daily, especially before bedtime. Use a small smear of fluoridated toothpaste on a toothbrush.
- Once your child can spit, use a pea-sized amount of fluoridated toothpaste.
- Avoid putting juice or other sweet drinks in bottles or sippy cups because children tend to sip from these for long periods of time,

which means their teeth are exposed to sugar longer. Offer water instead.

- If your baby goes to bed with a bottle, fill it with water.
- Limit snacks that are high in sugar.
- At least once a month, lift your child's lip to check for tooth decay. Look for changes in colour, lines or spots on your child's teeth as these may be signs of a potential problem.
- Stop your child's sucking habits before five years of age.

Did you know that it's possible for you to spread cavity-causing germs to your baby? To prevent spreading these germs, keep your own mouth healthy. Not kissing your baby on the mouth, tasting your baby's food or licking your baby's pacifier to clean it will actually help protect your child's oral health.

ODYSÉE EUROPÉENNE

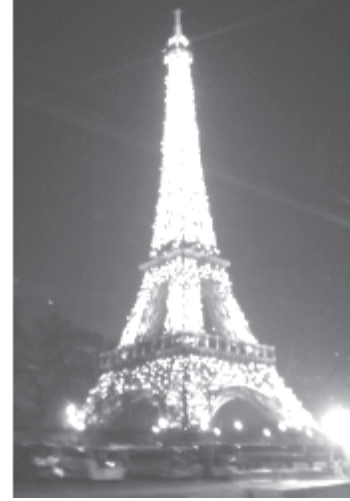

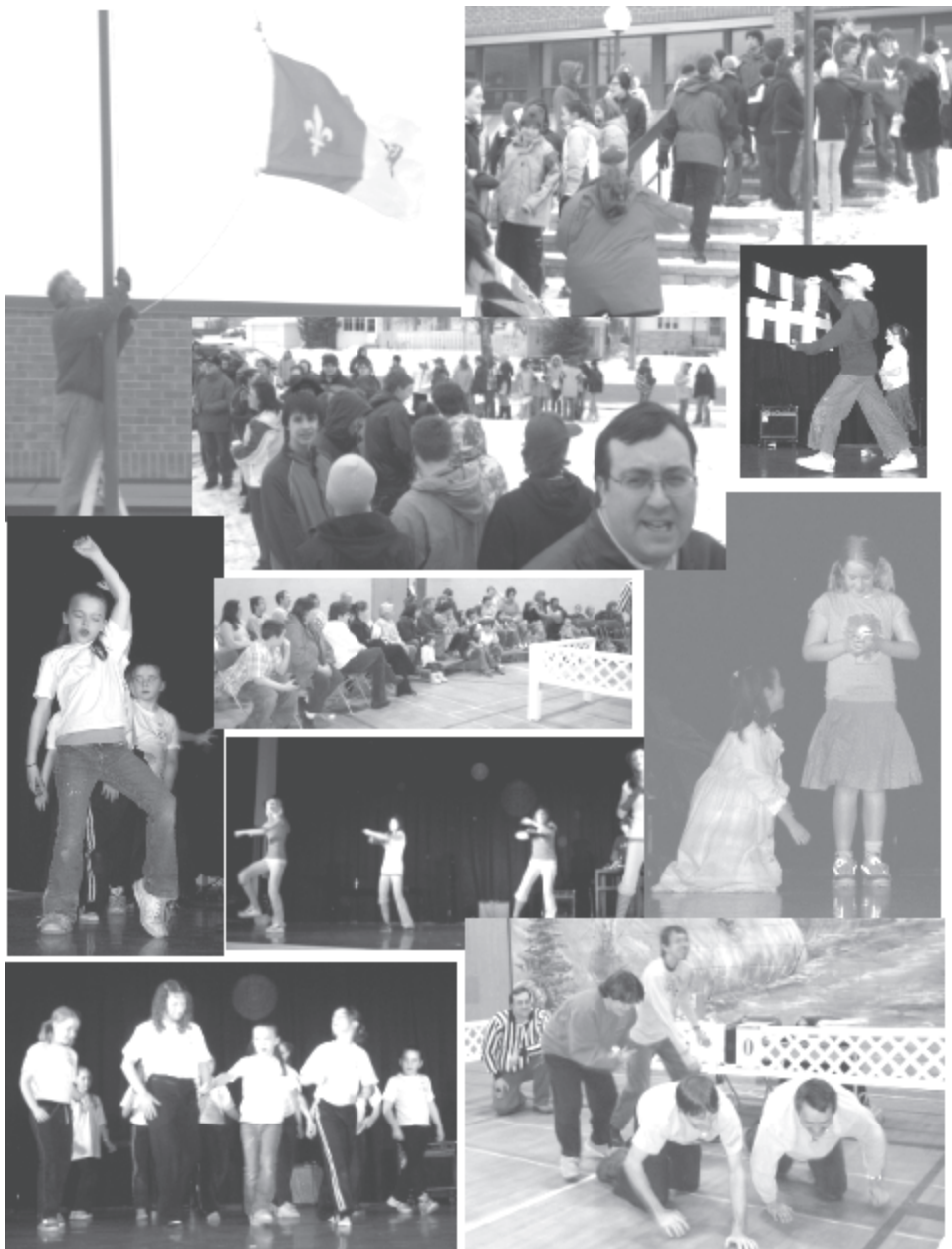
Christ. La visite du Vatican, qui est comme la Mecque pour les Catholiques, a su toucher le groupe profondément sur un plan spirituel.
