The goal of this program is to offer activities that encourage participants to take a more active role in maintaining and improving their current health and

wide range of activities are to be offered, and include physical activities, such as line dancing, fitness classes, provided by Sylvie Lapointe and Shannon Fuller, respectively, walking rounds, and general recreational activities through interactive console games, i.e., the Wii system. In addition, healthy eating workshops will be offered with the help of Chef Padraig Taaffe (volunteer) and Registered Dietician, Robin Greer. These workshops consist mainly of cooking lessons to teach healthy eating, food preparation, and food handling techniques. The program also focuses on injury prevention by exposing participants to educational sessions by physiotherapists to show the importance of good posture, musculature, and to give insight as to ways to prevent and limit physical illnesses. Blood pressure and blood sugar screenings will also be available to help some participants monitor their health and prevent health complications.

Within this community-fostered environment for good health, participants will also benefit from social interactions with other community members, thus, reducing the risk of social isolation, and increasing citizen and community participation in order to better their concept of self and social environment. This unique program will be in the community until March 2012, with a

potential renewal through local sustainability strategies.

All activities will be held at the Cedar Grove Apartment Complex, and will be administered by Turning Point. Due to the limited space at Cedar Grove, enrolment to the activities will take place on a first come, first served basis. The cost of each activity

will be based on a "geared-to-income" basis, and financial subsidies for activity involvement will be available for eligible participants. Revitalizing Our Community

As an active long time resident and ratepayer, I wish to dedicate this week's article to the Community Revitalization Plan that was a project undertaken by the Chapleau Economic Renewal Committee (CERC) which I am a member and that was completed at the beginning of June 2010. This is a two part article so it will be essential to also read next week's article to be well informed on this subject.

The Chapleau

Community Revitalization Plan was presented to the community in a public meeting held on June 9th. The plan showed promise and the revitalization plan was accepted by the Chapleau Economic Renewal Committee and by Municipal Council.

This plan focuses on growth and development, including the following elements: downtown revitalization, waterfront revitalization, cultural initiatives, tourism attractions, marketing and promotion, and community wide

revitalization. Here are some of the elements of the plan.

Downtown Revitalization:

The plan includes streetscaping, façade improvements and theming. Vacant lot landscaping and seating areas are considered within a town square. There is also a proposed relocation of the Vault for youth activities and parkettes as well as other features. Let us say that the downtown core is the central vision to be both an area of wellness for the citizens as well as an inviting tourist and business area.

Waterfront Revitalization:

There is a need for enhancement of the waterfront and although there are motivated persons already pulling weeds manually so as not to leave any environmental footprint that a tiller would leave, we must envision more uses of the waterfront such as having additional picnic tables, playground equipment or using the gazebo for monthly structured events. More ideas are in the plan such as having change rooms and washrooms.

Tourism Attractions:

Gateways, directional signage, including specific points of interest have been included within the plan. We are already a tourist destination for activities such as fishing, hunting, snowmobiling and other outdoor activities. We must endeavour to develop different cultural and social activities so that people of the region and surrounding areas would be attracted to our municipality. Partnerships with our surrounding First Nations would strengthen our ability to be an excellent host community. Celebrating our multicultural heritage in Chapleau, using the resources we have available, would also be of great benefit.

Next week, I will be discussing the three other parts of Chapleau Community Revitalization Plan and how this project can be implemented. 

Chapleau High School principal Dr. Karl Hackstetter challenges teachers, parents and students as 'laziness, disregard of discipline' will not be tolerated in 1963

Chapleau Moments

In 1963, after returning to Chapleau as principal of Chapleau High School, Dr. Karl A. Hackstetter spoke at the public school graduation ceremonies, directing his remarks at teachers, parents and students.

Forty-seven years later as schools prepare to open for another year, I found it interesting to reflect on Dr. Hackstetter's observations as reported by Margaret Costello in the Sudbury Star and think about their relevance to education in the 21st century. I will leave it to the reader to decide.

Dr. Hackstetter first taught at Chapleau High School from 1954 to 1957, left and returned as principal in the Sixties. Although he was involved in the planning of the new high school, he left before it opened in 1966.

Referring to public school teachers, he said he felt they were more important than any others.

"You (public school teachers) can still mold what is given to you -- your personal example is imitated. We of the high school are technicians, specialists in the field of education. It is my sincere belief that your job is more difficult than ours. Also, if you fail, the consequences are more disastrous."

He also said it was rather sad that the high school teachers do not seem to have much in common with the public school teachers adding that when he suggested the two staffs meet together, he was told that such a meeting would be "frowned upon."

Addressing parents, Dr. Hackstetter said (and remember this was in 1963), "today - both inside and outside of school - are in no way comparable with what confronted them when they started high school or a job."

He added: "This means that you have to insist on the control of homework. Do not let yourself be talked into 'we have no homework today.' This is never true. There may be no assignments for a particular day but there is always homework..."

He felt that weekends should be kept for recreation except for a couple of hours on Sunday night to prepare for Monday. "Remember," he told the parents, "you are educating with us and don't shrink from this responsibility. If you parents fail you will have ruined your child's future and can blame no one but yourselves."

To the students, Dr, Hackstetter told the Grade 8 graduates that. "the toughest part of your life starts in September. Today you will have to give an honest day's work when you come to high school. Laziness, disregard of discipline will not be given the kid glove treatment, and the sooner this is learned the better.

"Each one of you is just one of 250 next year. You must realize the 250 will pull together in one direction toward a better life, and don't you dare to slow down 249 just because you don't want to pull hard. We would like you to remember that, we, who know a little bit about life, always have the best for you in mind. I hope you believe that."

When Dr. Hackstetter first arrived in Chapleau in 1954, there were about 120 high school students. About 10 years later, it had doubled and a new school was needed.

Evelyn Lemieux was a CHS student in 1963 and shared some memories of the school and Dr. Hackstetter as principal. Evelyn recalled that he was really strict but an excellent math teacher, adding "actually I really liked him." She also noted that he was "fair, strict and a great teacher." I can second Evelyn's comments having been a student at CHS when Dr. Hackstetter first taught there.

"I remember in the fall all of a sudden he would take the whole school for a nature walk. I also remember once we wanted to go jogging for gym but we needed a teacher to go with us - he came with us and boy we jogged. I remember to this day I almost died. He wouldn't allow us to take a break." Actually Dr. Hackstetter became famous for his "walks" which usually meant leaving from the school on Pine Street, where the Chapleau Civic Centre is now, over to the golf course and back to the school -- non stop of course.

During his time as principal, the school

had no gymnasium as it was being used for classrooms. For a time. St. John's tennis court was used then he managed to rent a vacant room above the old Dominion store later Bank of Montreal building at Young and Birch, installed ping pong tables and everyone played. Evelyn also recalled that he held regular assemblies to keep students informed.

Charlie Purich,

who in 1963 was referred to as 'the catalyst' of the hockey team said: "He was a great principal. loved hockey and was a huge fan of CHS TEEM. He attended every game and would come over to the Redwood with us after the games. He was one of those "genuine" fans who never played the game but knew the value of sports and school. Even though he was a strict disciplinarian he was consistent with praise and students knew it was well meaning. The hockey team members were always inspired because of his interest."

Dr. Hackstetter taught me when I was in

Grades nine and ten, and as I reflect back over 55 years and all the teachers I ever had, he was among the very best. The last time I visited with him was when he returned to Chapleau in the seventies in charge of a Ministry of Education reading van. I was teaching at CHS, and pouring myself a cup of coffee in the staff room with my back to the door when suddenly a voice from the past, instantly recognizable, shouted, "MORRIS" and I froze -just like old times., but somehow I managed not to spill the coffee.

As Charlie and Evelyn noted Dr. Hackstetter was very much involved in school activities when he was principal and in 1956, as a teacher he directed 'Dough Crazy', comedy in three acts, presented in conjunction with the school's annual commencement. cast included Margaret Rose Fortin, Phyllis Chrusoskie, David McMillan, Harry Pellow, Loraine LeClerc, Robert Glowacki, James Evans, Donna Veit, Mary Serre and Michael Leigh.

The school choir under the direction of Miss Joan Lee also performed. Soloist was Carmen Pilon while a duet was presented by Rita O'Hearn and Bill Kemp. Pianist was Alison McMillan. Choir members included Theresa Donivan, Anne Marie Goldstein, Anne Lemieux, Shirley Potts, Madeleine Carroll, Gail Leon, Naomi Mizuguchi, Audrey Newman, Marion Pellow and Pauline Pilon.

Honour Secondary School Graduation diplomas were presented to Sadie Doyle, Phyllis Evans, John Futhey, Richard LeClerc and Gaetan Roussel, by Clarence Fiaschetti of the teaching staff, and the first CHS grad to return to teach at the school.

At the public school graduation ceremony where Dr. Hackstetter spoke in 1963, Ted Eveline was presented with the new best school citizen award by Mrs. Olive McAdam, noble grand of Sincerity Rebekah Lodge. My email is mj.morris @live.ca

Community Entrance Signs. I personally researched 18 communities using community entrance signs. provided this information to Mayor Freeborn with a detailed list of pros and cons and with recommendations. Result we have a sign that is well done and placed on the MUSEUM grounds. We should review the placement. The purpose of

these signs is to lure tourists and visitors into Chapleau. The sign in its present location loses some of its impact resting within town limits. We should have two more identical signs and each placed on the highways leading into Chapleau.

Adopt a Highway Signs. FREE Ontario government advertising signs. I instigated interest in the Museum placement

and three other placements on 101E, 101West and 129 South. My family has maintained the site for 8 years and continues to maintain the 101E site. "A roll up your sleeves project".

These signs advertise some of the amenities in Chapleau and at the same time contribute to a cleaner and a more esthetic environment.

Other Highway Advertisement.

I researched and cost quoted for highway billboard signs for all three principal highways accessing Chapleau PLUS a banner sign on Monk Street advertising our beautiful Museum. Tourists fly by the museum because nothing has alerted them to slow down and visit the Museum. It pays to advertise and any business man will confirm. The more outside money that filters into Chapleau, the spin off means less taxes the citizens will have to pay to meet normal town expenses. With enough "NEW MONEY" your property taxes in the future could be reduced. IF we are going to produce worthwhile activities to lure retirees to come to Chapleau and stay in Chapleau, WE MUST ADVERTISE WHAT WE HAVE TO OFFER. And come through with and keep our promises."

Establishment of a High School Bursary.

In 1988 a High School Bursary was established in my name. Seven years ago Principal Ross Hryhorchuck asked if I would consider increasing the Bursary or amalgamate our Bursary with another since there were over 40 small gifts and bursaries to be presented at the annual convocation. We retaliated And increased our annual award from \$300 to \$3000, a ten fold increase. A successful capital funding drive was instigated immediately. I took over the administration seven years ago and the capital base went from \$600 to \$50,000. I personally set up the investment portfolio

and it has double in value using medium to high risk equity investments. We have a paid up life insurance policy for \$12,000 beneficiary the High School Bursary. 90% of the active donors are ex-Chapleauites. They are still aggressively active and interested in what happens in our old home I have verbal town. pledges from several to continue to support Chapleau projects. Together with 60 authors we wrote CHAPLEAU TRAILS a book with 540 pages with over a 1000 pictures, the size of a telephone book. I edited financed and published this book. This book was authored, financed, edited and published in three and a half months. All publishing expenses have been paid and all sales now go directly to augment the capital fund of the Bursary.

Together with staff and administration of the Chapleau General Hospital I will promote diligent research to get an MRI placed in Chapleau.




Un partenariat avec les premières nations renforcirait notre habileté d'être un hôte excellent.
