Nature Festival breaks even Looks good for next year

The community proved, one again, it knows how to throw a party, and with accolades from many of the visitors, the Chapleau Nature Festival was basking in the knowledge it also achieved something few other festivals in the north can boast.

It put on a four day celebration July 22-25, featuring some of the best known Canadian talent, and ended up breaking even.

"It has been a lot of dedication and hard work," stated Don McEachren, chair of the Festival steering committee at the conclusion of the festival,

which sold more passes than last year.

The festival may not have even gone ahead this

year, was in not for the intervention of Mayor Earle J. Freeborn and the

municipal council, who agreed to underwrite any losses. This, while local businesses and industry

got behind the Mayor's appeal to financially support the Festival, in a year when support from federal and provincial levels, used as seed money in the previous years, was not continuing.

The sponsoring organization., Centre culturel Louis Hémon also played a huge role in maintaining the Festival for another year.

A total of 1290 festival passes were purchased this year and while the number of passes sold locally

dropped, out of towners picked up the slack.

Although the actual number of entries in the fiddle and step dancing contest was down, an advertising blitz in media devoted to fiddling appears to have paid off.

Don and Becky Cardwell travelled from Tennessee in the United States in response to advertising about the fiddle contest.

At least 15 percent of total ticket sales were to out of province residents.

McEachren, who headed a steering committee of local volunteers was pleased with the Festival.

"It's turned out to be an amazing success this year," he said. Pointing to the fact all VIP passes were sold out, McEachren said sales this year were absolutely phenomenal.

The core group of volunteers was singled out as a key group in staging this year's festival. "The ones who worked all year and those who worked the week of the Festival are to be commended," stated McEachren.

He also credited the Centre Culturel Louis Hémon for its continued support, "for its dedication and sound financial management

over the past years." "Its been a lot of dedication and hard work," concluding, "we regained the spirit of the first year."

Public Unaware of Devastating Cuts to Children's Psychiatric Services in the North

I am writing to express continued concern and dismay over the loss of mental health/psychiatric services to children in Northern Ontario. Although an outraged public has received support to increase funding for adult mental health services, the Ministry of Children and Youth Services (MCYS) seems to be flying under the public's radar. The Regional Children's Psychiatric Centre, based in Sudbury, is the only Northern site that provides specialized psychiatric services to children from across Northern Ontario (i.e., suicidal, schizophrenic, and depressed children). Instead of covering its \$200,000 deficit, the Ministry offered the Centre \$60,000 knowing this amount wouldn't even save one program. Even worse, the Ministry

is considering CUTTING over \$100,000 from the underfunded agency. What is also disturbing about the Ministry's actions is that it seems to be ignoring staff, administration and Board's input regarding program cuts. Despite staff protest, the Ministry is currently considering "approving" the closure of the Regional Children's Family Program – a unique service where an entire family resides for one week to receive intensive, specialized parent training from a team of professions, led by a Child Psychiatrist. The Ministry is also considering "approving" the loss of inpatient child psychiatric beds designated for children throughout the North. Of further disregard to the Ministry is the reduction of bilingual family services, since the only bilingual family therapist is slated for lay off. This, in itself, is a gross oversight and is another example of a Ministry that doesn't fully understand the impact of reducing Francophone services in the North.

One has to wonder, if MCYS secretly dictates and overrules any decision made by the Board, who are attempting to do the "right thing" clinically, then why should the Centre have a Board? If the local MCYS officials run their business with secrecy and bullying tactics, do they do so with the approval of their Minister, Dr. Marie Bountrogianni? Is the Ministry trying to close down RCPC and force Northern children away from their families and communities to instead travel to Southern Ontario? Perhaps MCYS is feeling untouchable and unaccountable to public scrutiny. We need to speak up and stand up to government bullies. We need to save psychiatric programs for our children in the North. Is \$200,000 really too big a price to help preserve our already depleted services? What will the ultimate cost be for children and families?

High-speed Internet coming soon

In fact, approximately 22 per cent of the population and nearly 4,781 communities are without high-speed Internet access.

"We are thrilled to be able to bring wireless high-speed Internet services to communities that currently don't have access to this technology," said Bruce Barr, President of

Xplornet "Businesses, residences and schools in rural communities and First Nation communities now have the opportunity to connect to the worldwide web and explore in a faster, more efficient and more cost-effective way than ever before."

Xplornet is superior to alternative technologies as it delivers Internet data in small packets that reduce interference and use a fraction of the airtime of other systems. Users will receive fast, reliable and secure Internet access at an affordable rate. Only taking one day for full implementation, Xplornet is comprised of

three basic components: The access point, the backhaul unit and the subscriber module. The access point distributes the service to the surrounding community; the backhaul unit provides the Internet feed from a remote location; and the subscriber module is installed on the user's computer to receive Internet access. Province provides better access to services for people with mental illness in Algoma-Manitoulin

The provincial government is giving mentally ill people in Algoma-Manitoulin better access to quality community care with new funding, MPP Mike Brown has announced on behalf of Health and Long Term Care Minister George Smitherman.

"Our government is reaching out to people with mental illness in Ontario and expanding services where they need them, closer to home," Brown stated in a news release. "We are ending years of stagnant funding in mental health by investing in community

services so that people with mental illness can find the care they need and avoid being hospitalized."

The government is increasing its funding to community health services across the province by \$65 million in 2004/05 for a total of \$463 million. This funding will rise by another \$120 million over the next few years, reaching \$583 million by 2007-08.

The increased funding will assist people with a full range of chronic and severe mental illnesses and provide much needed support to families and care givers. It

will result in expanded case management, crisis response and early intervention services, and more accessible services for people with severe mental illness.

It is expected that more than 78,000 Ontarians with mental illness will benefit from these expanded services.

"Mental health is as important as physical health," Brown said. "This investment will help break down the barriers between people with mental illness and the services they need. It is also another example of how our government is investing in community

care so that we can have a more effective and sustainable health care system. This will lead to healthier Ontarians and healthier communities.

The news release states driving care to the community level is fundamental to the government's plan to reform health care in Ontario. This will allow people who are able to receive the care they need in the community to stay out of hospitals, reducing the stress on these institutions and allowing them to concentrate on the acute care services they provide so well.

Baitfish harvest and sales

To ensure an enjoyable, trouble-free fishing experience, anglers should remember the following basic rules for catching and purchasing bait fish.

- Resident anglers who want to catch baitfish for personal use must have a valid fishing licence and keep it with them while fishing. Resident anglers may have up to 120 baitfish, that they have caught themselves, in their possession at any time.
- Non-resident anglers may not catch baitfish or leeches for personal use. Non-resident anglers can purchase bait from any of the more than 800 licensed bait dealers throughout the province.
- To catch bait, resident anglers may only use one baitfish trap that is no bigger than 51 cm (20 in.) long by 31 cm wide (12.2 in.). The trap must be clearly marked with the angler's name. Anglers may not set or check traps for someone else.
- Only holders of commercial bait licences may sell baitfish, crayfish, leeches, frogs or spawn.

2005-2025 Forest Management Plan

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) and Domtar Inc. and the Spanish Local Citizens' Committee (LCC) invite you to review and comment on the draft 2005-2025 forest management plan for the Spanish Forest.

The draft forest management plan outlines the long-term strategic direction for the management of the forest, and the details of harvest, renewal and tending operations and access road locations for the first five-year term 2005-2010.

The purpose of this public consultation opportunity is to provide the public with an opportunity to review and comment on the proposed operations before the ministry finalizes its review of the draft plan. There is an opportunity at any time during the forest management planning process for interested persons to seek resolution of issues with the plan author. If there is still dissatisfaction with the results of issue resolution with the plan author, the ministry's Sudbury District Manager and/or the ministry's Regional Director will attempt to resolve the issue.

There is also an opportunity at any time during the forest management planning process for interested persons to make a request to the Minister of the Environment that specific forest management activities require an individual environmental assessment under the *Environmental Assessment Act*.

The Ministry of Natural Resources is collecting comments and information regarding this forest management plan under the authority of the *Crown Forest Sustainability Act* to assist in making decisions and determining further public consultation needs. Comments and opinions will be kept on file for use during the operating term of the forest management plan, and may be included in study documentation which is made available for public review.

Under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (1987)*, personal information will remain confidential unless prior consent is obtained. However, this information may be used by the Ministry of Natural Resources as public input on other resource management surveys and projects. A summary of the draft forest management plan may be obtained from the office of Tembec Forest Resource Management (on behalf of Spruce Falls Inc.) or the ministry's Kapuskasing Area Office (see addresses below).

Comments and submissions on the draft forest management plan and MNR's preliminary list of required alterations, and suggestions for additional alterations, must be sent to **Daniel Kott** of the planning team at the ministry's **Kapuskasing Area Office**, by **November 9, 2004**.

The final formal public involvement opportunity for the forest management plan is tentatively scheduled as follows:

There is also an opportunity at any time during the forest management planning process for interested persons to make a request to the Minister of the Environment that specific forest management activities require an individual environmental assessment under the *Environmental Assessment Act*.

The Ministry of Natural Resources is collecting comments and information regarding this forest management plan under the authority of the *Crown Forest Sustainability Act* to assist in making decisions and determining further public consultation needs. Comments and opinions will be kept on file for use during the operating term of the forest management plan, and may be included in study documentation which is made available for public review.



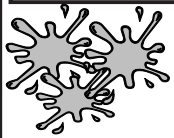

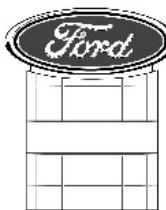
