November Marks Woman Abuse Prevention Month

Domestic violence is not a private matter. Everyone's entitled to live in safety and security in their homes and communities. It is only through families, friends, neighbours, communities and governments working

together can we prevent this violence. We must all play a part to prevent and stop violence against women. For many people, it is not just understanding what they are seeing, but also knowing what to do to offer help to a person in need.

In its 2005 report to the Chief Coroner, the

Domestic Violence Death Review Committee emphasized "that the greatest need continues to be educating all members of the community about the warning signs of domestic violence and the appropriate action necessary to prevent it."

The 2006 report also singles out the Neighbours, Friends and Families campaign as an example of how to raise awareness of the warning signs of woman abuse as well as safety planning and risk reduction.

Since its launch in 2006, over 70 communities have joined the campaign. The Neighbours, Friends and Families campaign is aiming to change people's attitudes so that everyone, whether friend, family, or workmate can recognize abuse and respond appropriately.

The Neighbours, Friends and Families campaign provides individuals and communities with information on how to properly identify the warning signs, support women and other members of the

The Sudbury & District Health Unit is a progressive, accredited public health agency committed to the concepts of workplace wellness. With a head office in Sudbury and four branch offices throughout the districts of Sudbury and Manitoulin, the Sudbury & District Health Unit delivers legislated public health programs and services under the leadership of the Medical Officer of Health and governance of the Board of Health. The Sudbury & District Health Unit is designated as one of five provincial teaching health units and is affiliated with Laurentian University.

This is a non-profit Board that acts as the governing body of the local public health unit. It ensures the delivery of all public health programs and services provided by the health unit and is accountable to the community and to the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care.

This position will afford the individual a special opportunity to learn about and work with public health issues. You should be able to devote a minimum of two hours per month to the position.

No person who is employed by a Board of Health is eligible for membership on a health unit board.

St. Denis tables Bill to ensure Northern Ontario gets its fair share

Liberal MP Brent St. Denis has tabled a Bill that would ensure Northern Ontario gets its fair share of the federal Members of Parliament in the House of Commons. If passed, this bill will guarantee that Northern Ontario will, at the very least, have 9% of the federal seats allocated to Ontario.

"This Bill is about ensuring that Northern Ontario has a voice that is loud and clear in the House of Commons. At a time when we are discussing the future of representation in Canada, I am taking an important step to ensure that Northern Ontario gets its fair share of federal MPs in Parliament" Mr. St. Denis said.

"Ridings in Northern Ontario cannot continue to

grow in geographical size. It is unfair for citizens who rely on the help of their MPs on a variety of issues." Mr. St. Denis continued.

Many provinces already have a guarantee of a minimum number of seats. Given the size of Northern Ontario it would be a mistake to reduce the number of representatives since many communities, a number of which are isolated, depend on federal representatives for access to government programs.

As he introduced his Bill, An Act to amend the Electoral Boundaries Redistribution Act (Northern Ontario), Mr. St. Denis said: "this bill would support all MPs, all ridings in Northern Ontario, which is a vast area. My own riding is 110,000 square kilometres and if trends continue, it will even get bigger, so

this is a bill to ensure that at the very least, 9% of the seats in Ontario are allocated to Northern Ontario."

Mr. St. Denis is committed to seeing this Bill pass. As he has previously done, he will work with Members of all parties in the House of Commons to gain their support and address any concerns they may have. Just this past week, Mr. St. Denis' Bill recognizing a National Peacekeepers' Day received unanimous approval in the House of Commons as it passed Third Reading. It is now on its way to the Senate for final

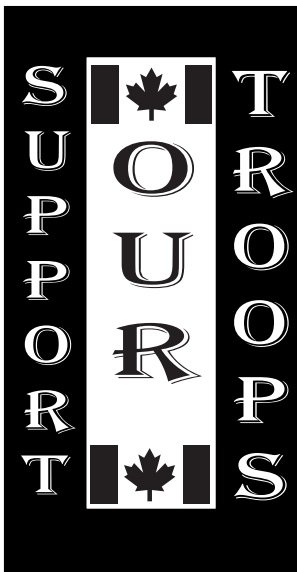

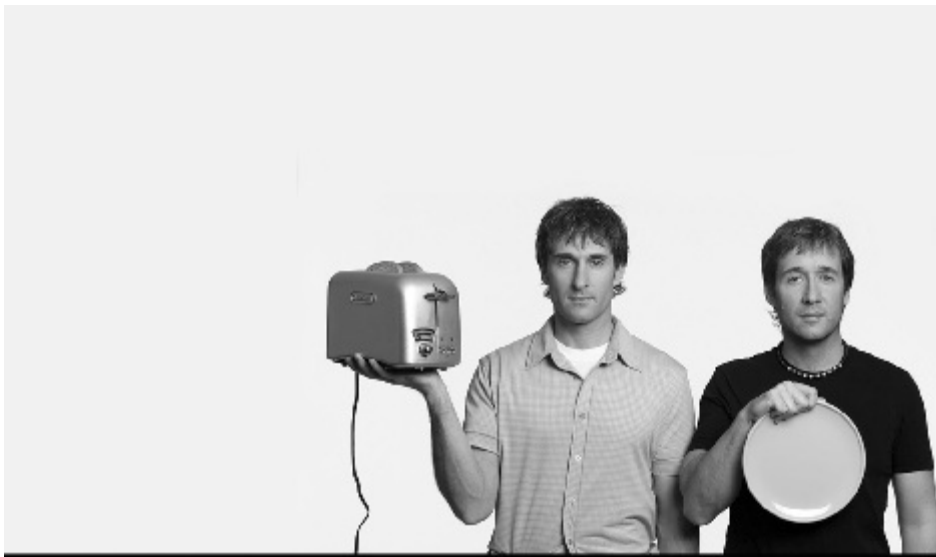

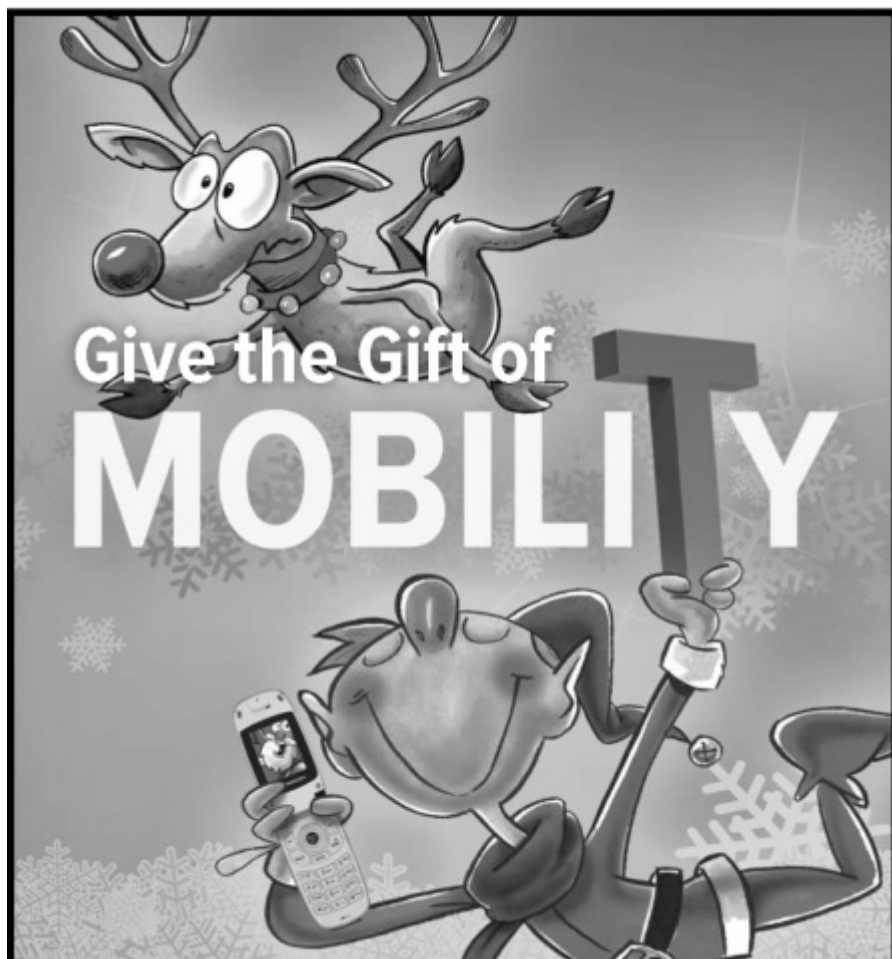

Waypoints of Interest - Repères d'intérêt

On Saturday, November 24th, for the third time since August, the Chapleau Innovation and Training Coalition Inc. ran the Introduction to the Global Positioning System (GPS) course. Wind and snow didn't matter to these outdoor enthusiasts since their objective was to learn the parts of a GPS and its key functions, mark waypoints, enter coordinates, track paths and lastly, to read coordinates on a map. For those of you not familiar with a GPS, through the use of satellites, it can give your location on the earth's surface and record a track of everywhere that you went. It also tells you how to get to a specific location or how far you are from a specific location.

The instructor, Mr. Eric Gervais, is a Geographic Information System Technician (GIS) for the Ministry of Natural Resources. He also was a Professor Collège Boréal in Sudbury and taught GIS to students in the Forestry Program as well as the Fish and Wildlife Program.

PROPOSED MINOR AMENDMENT ALGOMA FOREST MANAGEMENT PLAN (2005-2025)

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (OMNR) and Clergue Forest Management Inc. invite you to inspect and comment on a proposed minor amendment to the 2005-2025 Forest Management Plan (FMP) for the Algoma Forest.

The purpose of this proposed amendment is to add a primary road corridor from the existing Ripple Lake Primary Road, and de-commission the remaining portion of existing road south of the new proposed road. Both OMNR and Clergue Forest Management support the continued use of the de-activated road where possible. OMNR and Clergue will assess the crossings during the spring freshet for feasibility of creating fords. The forest companies have determined the proposed road will provide better access to present and future harvest areas.

The proposed minor amendment will be available for public review for a 15-day period from **December 1, 2007 to December 16, 2007** at the ministry's Sault Ste. Marie and Wawa offices. This amendment will also be available for review at the office of Clergue Forest Management Inc. in Sault Ste. Marie.

Further public consultation may be required if concerns are raised regarding this amendment. If there are no unresolved concerns received by **December 17, 2007**, the amendment will be approved by the ministry's Sault Ste. Marie District Manager.

At any time during the forest management plan amendment process, you may also make a request for an issue resolution process with either the plan author or the ministry's Sault Ste. Marie District Manager.

The MNR is collecting comments and information regarding this minor amendment under the authority of the *Crown Forest Sustainability Act* to assist in making decisions and determining further public consultation needs. Comments and opinions will be kept on file for use during the forest management plan period and may be included in study documentation, which is made available for public review.

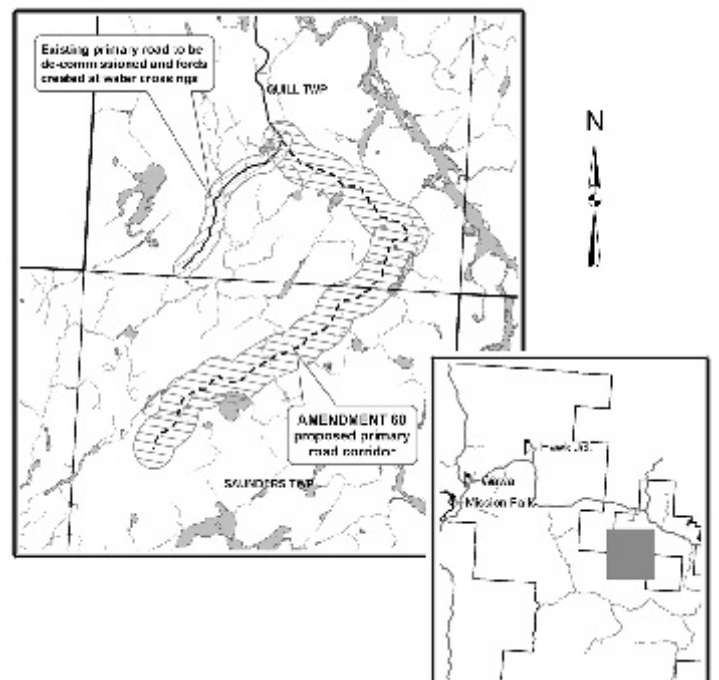

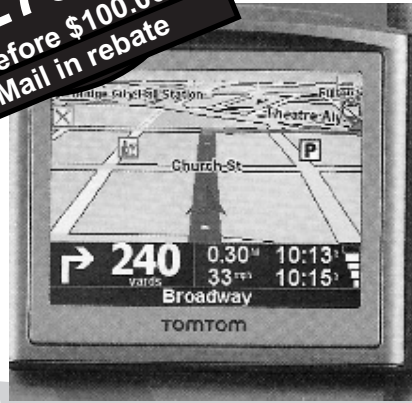
