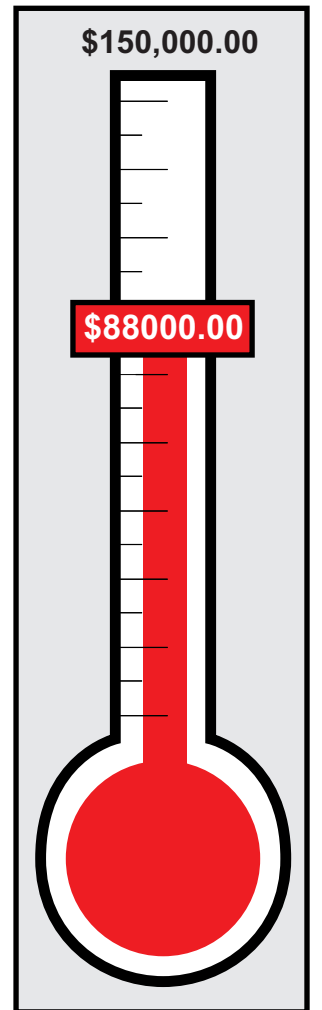

As part of a 4 week program aimed at educating students about healthy snacking and implementing this knowledge into their daily lives, Mrs. Betty O'Hearn's class had a weekly visitor to their classroom.

Robin Greer, of the Chapleau Northwoods Heart Health Coalition, spent 1 hour every Friday, at the Chapleau Public School making

learning about nutrition and snacking fun.

The first week was spent discussing what types of things the students are eating and how they rate as healthy snacks. Robin presented a 27 item list of everyday healthy snacks such as light popcorn, whole grain crackers, and yogurt tubes. They made a chart of healthy snacks and of course brought in healthy snacks for the kids to sample.

"Some of the kids had never been exposed to some of the things we tried and once they gave them a try, they liked most of them. The only things which really didn't go over well were tomato juice and raisins," reported Robin Greer.

Week 2 was spent learning about juices. The students were taught how to look for 100% fruit juice.

The third week the group talked about shopping and menu planning as they munched on tangerines supplied by Robin. They made a shopping list for the following week when they would visit the grocery store together to make their health smart purchases.

Betty and Robin, as well as two volunteers, accompanied the class to Valu-Mart to gather what they needed from their list. The class

was split into groups and each group was responsible for a particular food group. Once back at school, the class snacked from a big buffet of bagels, lean meats, fruit and juices.

The Heart Health Coalition had supplied each of the kids with litterless lunch kits to help them fill their lunch boxes with the appropriate amount and portions of snacks. The program encouraged them to eat the snacks that they brought even if it wasn't particularly healthy and ensured them that it is alright to have unhealthy snacks on occasion.

Betty O'Hearn is very proud of her class's achievements. "Little people are very enthusiastic, they were right on board with the program," she shared. "There is definitely more physical activity among the children.

Less access to sweets allows them to learn and concentrate better."

Robin and Betty both commented on how parents have been very supportive of the program. As an added bonus, parents have reported better attitudes, behaviour, and habits at home

since the program began in the school.

Chapleau Public School has shown interest in expanding the healthy snack program school-wide and the Northwoods Heart Health Coalition plans on co-ordinating a program with our other schools next.

Chapleau's youth dance to a new beat

On the evening of Friday, November 25th, 2005, young citizens of Chapleau had the opportunity to experience the very first, state of the art video dance at the Community Hall.

The Chapleau Recreation Centre hosted the video dance for youth between the ages of 10 and 18. The 63 kids up to the age of 12 were the first to experience the brand new 22 foot wide video screen where the awesome larger than life music videos made a huge impression on them. "A lot of them just sat there watching the screen since a lot of them have never been to a video dance," reported Kevin Morris Chapleau Recreation Director.

After 9:00

p.m., the 13-18 year old crowd of 133 who were waiting in line anxiously, got their chance to see for themselves what all the hype was about. Many were quoted as saying, "That was the best dance I've ever been to...I can't wait until the next one!"

The next dance is already in the works for Carnival weekend due to the enthusiastic response of our young people. According to Kevin Morris, there will probably be 3-4 video dances per year, including dances for adults, as well as other events such as Superbowl and Wrestling. "Hopefully, in the near future, video-conferencing soon be available," shared Mayor Earle Freeborn.

Once a licence

is purchased enabling the township to show movies in the Community Hall, Kevin is anxious to offer movie nights on the big screen. With the access to the arena canteen and the Community Hall kitchen, the Recreation centre will be able to be transformed into a movie theatre, which is something that Chapleau hasn't had since the closure of The Fox Theatre on Main Street, approximately 30 years ago.

The Video Dance was made possible by the purchase of a permanent 22 foot wide video screen to compliment the sound system, which was installed by Bell/Nortel for the

launch of the High Speed Internet. The sound system was generously left here for the use of the community.

Licensed Disc Jockey (DJ), Bizick, was hired to play the music and videos for the event from his extensive up-to-the-minute collection, which he purchases for this purpose. Age appropriate music was selected for each of the two dances and requests were more than welcome.

Of course, the time, generously donated by a faithful group of volunteers, helped make the first video dance a huge success. "We didn't have any problems...everything went really well," reported Kevin Morris.

Each school was also given a parachute game and sports equipment to encourage physical activity.

Although Principal Michael Levesque of Our Lady

of Fatima School was unable to attend due to prior commitments, he is also a member of the Heart Health Coalition. Public Health Nurse Rachelle Martel accepted on behalf of Ecole Sacre Coeur as she is the French speaking staff member who has been working with the school.

Betty O'Hearn was present to accept for Chapleau Public School. Her class has also been involved with a pilot project concerning healthy snacks with Robin Greer Chair of the Northwoods Heart Health Coalition.

Master of Ceremonies for the evening, Public Health Nurse Mary Boucher, gave a presentation on a large coloured target which was purchased and will be shared among the schools. She suggested that they could display it to

represent what kinds of snacks are being consumed by the students and how they rate health wise. The target is separated into three colours with the outside red ring representing very occasional snacks, the inner yellow ring for sometimes snacks, and the green bull's eye for anytime snacks.

Mary Boucher commented about the Northwoods Heart Health Coalition, "Although we are a small group, we are a very hard working group."

The group, which has accomplished many heart healthy projects in our community, was served a very well deserved holiday dinner, complete with festive decorations and music before they went back to work planning their next move.
