Families documenting their Chapleau history

A project now in progress will, when completed, articulate much of this community's history in a very personal way by families who have virtually lived the history of Chapleau.

The idea to publish a collection of stories told by the residents of the

community was proposed last year during an informal meeting in Mayor Earle Freeborn's office of a group, which included current and former residents.

As a result, Doctor Bill Pellow, who was a member of that group and who has also maintained a close relationship

with the community where he was raised is spear-heading the project, which is now in an advanced stage. Doctor Pellow, who has retired and spends summers at the family cottage on the Chapleau River, has received an overwhelming response from many families who have welcomed the opportunity to

share their family memories.

At the same time work continues on compiling the stories and photographs in advance of the final layout and design of the volume.

While many families have already contributed their stories, it is evident there is an increasing level of interest in this

project. Those who have not yet written their stories are urged to do so. Photos should also be considered.

A format letter has been sent out to numerous families and they are being requested to act now to facilitate the work in producing the book.

La planification stratégique est presque terminée

En 2007, les Services de santé de Chapleau Health Services (SSCHS) ont tenu des consultations communautaires auprès des parties intéressées, y compris les patients et les familles, les résidents de la communauté, les partenaires communautaires du domaine de la santé, les bénévoles, les médecins, le personnel et l'équipe de direction. Après compilation des données découlant de ces consultations

communautaires, le Conseil d'administration a utilisé ces précieux renseignements pour élaborer le plan stratégique des SSCHS. Les orientations stratégiques suivantes ont été cernées : 1) offrir d'excellents soins de santé de façon économique dans la communauté; 2) mettre sur pied un programme intégré de gestion de la qualité; 3) veiller à ce qu'il y ait un nombre suffisant de ressources humaines

professionnelles pour réaliser la mission de l'organisme; 4) accroître l'accès aux services communautaires à Chapleau et dans les environs; 5) collaborer avec les partenaires communautaires pour que la population vieillissante ait accès à des logements convenables; 6) mettre en place une bonne gouvernance et un leadership efficace.

Le plan stratégique en est à l'étape de la révision et de

l'approbation finales tandis que la direction et le personnel se penchent déjà sur les objectifs qui permettront aux SSCHS de réaliser leur plan. Voici quelques-unes de ces initiatives : 1) sortir du mandat de l'hôpital en recrutant et en maintenant en poste des médecins au profit de la clinique médicale de la communauté; le financement nécessaire au fonctionnement d'une telle clinique ne fait pas partie d'un budget hospitalier, ce qui plonge notre hôpital dans un important déficit financier et en matière de ressources humaines; 2) participer activement

et de façon continue au recrutement de médecins et d'autres professionnels de la santé; 3) créer des partenariats avec les programmes collégiaux et universitaires de formation de professionnels de la santé; 4) mener des consultations communautaires sur les services aux personnes âgées; 5) élargir et améliorer les programmes de services communautaires aux personnes âgées; 6) modifier les plans d'intervention en cas de catastrophe; 7) améliorer les programmes de gestion de la qualité; 8) continuer à respecter les normes nationales d'agrément; 9) offrir

des programmes de formation et d'éducation professionnels au personnel et aux membres du Conseil d'administration.

Fish licence-free on February Family Fishing Weekend

Minister of Natural Resources Donna Cansfield is inviting Ontarians to bundle up and take part in the second annual winter Family Fishing Weekend on February 23 and 24.

"The licence-free family fishing weekend is an opportunity for both

novice and experienced anglers to take part in local events where they can learn about ice fishing, ice safety and the importance of conservation," said Cansfield. "I am

pleased to join the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters and other partners in

encouraging everyone to get outdoors and enjoy this popular winter sport with family and friends where ice conditions permit safe fishing."

"Ice fishing is a great way to get the kids outside and connected with nature," said Ontario Federation of Anglers

and Hunters President Jack Hedman. "With more OFAH clubs coming on board to host local fishing events, we hope the winter family fishing weekend will grow to match the hugely popular summer version of this family friendly event."

During the

Ontario Family Fishing Weekend, Canadian residents can fish licence-free in any public waters across Ontario, except those with a closed season. Anyone fishing licence-free must follow the conservation licence limits set out in the 2008-2009 Recreational Fishing Regulations Summary.

Information on these limits will be available at each participating site. Anglers should also check the summary for regulations on season closures and gear and bait restrictions, which must be observed.

"I want to thank all of our

partners for continuing to support family fishing weekends," said Cansfield. "The Canadian Sportfishing Industry Association, the Canadian National Sportfishing Foundation, the Northern Ontario Tourist Outfitters Association, and Fisheries and Oceans Canada have all contributed to the success of the weekends, and their continued involvement is appreciated."

Student Achievement Begins At Home

CNW/ - Ontario students are getting more out of their school experience because families, schools and communities are more focused on reading and writing.

Education Minister Kathleen Wynne joined Gisèle from the TVO show Gisèle's Big Backyard to celebrate Family Literacy Day at Toronto's North York Central Library. The event kicked off Gisèle's TVOKids Library Tour presented in partnership with the Toronto Public Library.

"For students to succeed, they must be reading at school and at home," said Wynne. "Congratulations to ABC Canada for championing Family Literacy Day for 10 years. This is a wonderful opportunity to spotlight the importance of reading and learning together as a family."

Two- and three-year-olds who are read to several times a day do substantially better in kindergarten compared to young children who are read to only a few times a week or less. In

addition, children with early exposure to books and reading are better at performing mathematical tasks.

"Family Literacy Day celebrates parents and children taking the time to engage in learning activities that help all family members keep their reading, writing and math skills sharp," said ABC CANADA president Margaret Eaton.

"Parents who actively participate in learning activities are great role models for their children, encouraging them to become lifelong learners."

SPANISH FOREST 2010 - 2020 FOREST MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR), Domtar Inc. and the Spanish Forest Local Citizens Committee invite you to participate in the development of the 2010-2020 forest management plan for the Spanish Forest (see map). The purpose of this notice is to announce that work has started on the new plan and to encourage you to get involved at this early stage of planning. This forest management plan will outline the long-term management strategy and provide details of where harvest, planting and tending operations and access road construction will take place for the first five-year term 2010-2015. The plan will also identify, in a more general manner, the proposed areas of operations for the second five-year term 2015-2020.

At this stage of the planning process, we want you to tell us what kind of forest and benefits the plan should strive to provide in the short and long term. As well, we want you to know that background information that will be used during the preparation of the plan will be available for review by the public throughout the planning process. Any additions that you can provide to the background information will be appreciated. Your comments and information will help us to make balanced, well informed and fair decisions as we proceed through the planning process.


Summary maps showing information such as fish and wildlife habitat features (e.g. lake trout lakes, heronries), parks and protected areas, tourism facilities as well as many other features on the Spanish Forest are available on request. These maps, known as "values maps", will be useful for anyone with a general or specific interest in this management unit.

A formal issue resolution process, as described in the Forest Management Planning Manual (2004), is available on written request. A summary of all comments collected throughout the planning process will be made available to the public in a summary form during the planning process and for the duration of the approved ten year plan.

In addition to this invitation to participate, there are four other formal opportunities for you to be involved, tentatively scheduled as follows:

Public Review of the Long Term Management Direction	August 2008
Public Information Centre: Review of Proposed Operations	February 2009
Public Information Centre: Review of the Draft Forest Management Plan	August 2009
Public Inspection of MNR-Approved Forest Management Plan	December 2009

Comments are collected and documented as part of the public consultation process for forest management planning as required under the Crown Forest Sustainability Act. Under the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (1997) or FIPPA, personal information will remain confidential unless prior consent is obtained. However, this information may be used by the Ministry of Natural Resources as public input for other resource management initiatives.
