A New Year's Message



Your Council heads have completed their first year of its four year mandate. We look forward to the challenges of the next three years. The dedication and hard work of your Council and the administrative and municipal staff will make the job both interesting and rewarding.

Once again your Council will try to hold the line on

property taxes although some new assessments could result in increases that the Municipality has no control over. We also look forward to being able to do some water, sewer and paving projects depending on our successful funding applications.

The year 2007 has seen improvements to our Monk Street Bridge at long last and other improvements have been completed at the airport, public works garage and arena maintenance machinery.

Cellular phone service is available along Highway 101 west between Chapleau and Wawa. Work is underway to have cellular telephone service available along Highway 101 east between Chapleau and Timmins. The cellular service planned for Highway 101 east is being administered by NEOnet of Timmins and the initial plans call for the service to

be available in the spring of 2009.

Our economic development office has now been established on Birch Street in the old Bank of Montreal building with staff in place to assist anyone with advice and information on business development and funding applications. The economic development staff are under the direction of the Chapleau Economic Renewal Committee who are local business men and Council members who dedicate their time working on projects to build a new economy for our community. Hats off to the managers and staff of our local lumber mill who have kept our mill working throughout this time of uncertainty related to the Canadian lumber industry. It is because of their dedication and concern for our community that has kept our economy stable.

The Liberal Government of Ontario will be lobbied by your Council throughout our mandate for the inclusion of the Ramsey Industrial Road into the Northern Ontario Highway System. Your Mayor continues to represent Chapleau at the Manitoulin-Sudbury District Social Services Administrative Board at monthly meetings held in Espanola. Chapleau is also a member of the Mayors group that

meets monthly with neighbouring communities of Wawa, Hornepayne, Dubreuilville, White River and Manitouwadge, where issues of regional concern are discussed and collectively addressed with different levels of Government.

Your Council is ready for the challenges of 2008 and I take this opportunity to wish you all a very Happy and Prosperous New Year.

The Sudbury & District Health Unit is advising people about how to protect themselves from the cold. This public education bulletin is part of the City of Greater Sudbury's Extreme Cold Weather Alert initiative ensuring the well-being of all citizens during periods of extreme cold.

“Hypothermia and frostbite are the most common but preventable injuries that result from being exposed to the cold.”

says Annie Berthiaume, a public health nurse with the Sudbury & District Health Unit.

Frostbite is the freezing of a body part. The nose, cheeks, ears, fingers, and toes are usually frostbitten first. The skin feels cold and may feel numb. If frostbite is suspected, cover the area immediately. Do not rub or massage the skin. This can cause tissue damage. If possible, gently place the affected area in warm — not hot —

water until it is warm and no longer numb. Apply a sterile dressing to the area. Put dressings between fingers and toes if they are affected. Medical attention is recom-



NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND ORAL HEARING APPROVING PAYMENT AMOUNTS FOR PRESCRIBED GENERATING FACILITIES

Ontario Power Generation Inc.

The Ontario Energy Board (the Board) received an application from Ontario Power Generation Inc. (OPG) on November 30, 2007, under section 78.1 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, 1998, S.O. 1998, c.15, Schedule B, seeking approval for increases in payment amounts for the output of certain of its generating facilities, to be effective April 1, 2008. The Board has assigned the application file number EB-2007-0905. The Board's decision on this application will affect most electricity customers in Ontario.

This is OPG's first application for an order from the Board approving payment amounts for output from generating facilities prescribed by Ontario Regulation 53/05. Those facilities are OPG's nuclear generating stations at Pickering and Darlington, and the following hydroelectric facilities: Sir Adam Beck I, Sir Adam Beck II, Sir Adam Beck Pump Generating Station, DeCew Falls I, DeCew Falls II, and R.H. Saunders. In 2006, these stations generated over 40% of the electrical energy consumed in Ontario. The payments OPG currently receives for these generation facilities have been fixed under Ontario Regulation 53/05 and remain in effect until the Board determines other payment amounts on or after April 1, 2008.

OPG indicates that, if the application is approved as filed, there would be a 14% increase in the payment amounts. According to OPG, for a residential customer consuming 1,000 kWh per month that would mean an increase of approximately \$2.75 in the monthly electricity bill. As part of the application, OPG is also seeking an interim payment amount adjustment to take effect April 1, 2008, to allow for recovery of its requested payments if the Board's final decision is not made by that date.

The Board has decided to proceed with this application by oral hearing.

mended for frostbite.


To prevent frostbite, always wear hats, mittens, and scarves. Avoid tight-fitting boots because they make the feet more vulnerable to frostbite. Wear several thin layers of warm, dry clothing.

Hypothermia is a life-threatening condition. It happens when the body is exposed to the cold for a long time and the body loses more heat than it can generate. The individual may be shivering, drowsy, and confused, and have slurred speech, loss of coordination, and have pale and bluish lips. The condition becomes severe when the victim stops shivering.

Unconsciousness may soon follow. Treat hypothermia by moving the victim to shelter, replacing wet clothing with dry clothing, and wrapping them in warm blankets. Keep the person lying flat and get immediate medical attention.

To stay safe in cold weather, pay attention to weather reports, dress warmly, keep active, and avoid alcohol and caffeine.

Ministry makes minor changes to fishing regulations

A number of minor revisions are being made to the new 2008-2009 fishing regulations, Natural Resources Minister Donna Cansfield announced today.

“The early release of the new streamlined 2008-2009 Fishing Regulations Summary gave members of the public a chance to identify some clarifications and additions,” said Cansfield. “We are moving quickly to fix those to ensure the rules and regulations that come into effect on January 1, 2008, are clear.”

The revision of the Ontario Fishery Regulations is an important part of implementing Ontario’s new Ecological Framework for Recreational Fisheries Management. This will improve sustainability of fisheries and increase public participation in fisheries management with the establishment of Fisheries Management Zone Advisory Councils.

The ministry is

now managing fisheries on a zone basis rather than on an individual lake basis. This has reduced the number of fishing zones to 20 from 37 divisions, requiring revisions to Ontario’s fishing rules.

In rewriting the regulations that govern fishing in Ontario, some omissions were made. As a result, the ministry is implementing a small number of changes in nine Fisheries Management Zones. Some of the changes

include:

Allowing fishing of lake trout during part of the year on Commando Lake in Zone 8, which lets a traditional winter lake trout derby continue to take place

Opening Bill, Wreck and Dog lakes for fishing brook trout all year in Zone 4

Allowing fishing for brook trout all year on Tailleurs Lake in Zone 8.

A list of all the changes are available on the ministry’s website at ontario.ca/fishing.

“We know how popular angling is across the province, and as always we appreciate the benefit of the public’s comments,” said Cansfield. “As a ministry, we are working to ensure the health and sustainability of the province’s fish populations.”

Before going fishing, anglers should carefully review the information outlined in the summary and check the ministry website for updates.

La Commission de l'énergie de l'Ontario (ci-après, la « Commission ») a reçu une requête d'Ontario Power Generation Inc. (ci-après, « OPG ») le 30 novembre 2007 aux termes de l'article 78.1 de la Loi de 1998 sur la Commission de l'énergie de l'Ontario, L.O. 1998, c.15, Annexe B, en vue d'obtenir l'approbation d'augmentations du montant des paiements pour la production de certaines de ses installations à compter du 1er avril 2008. La Commission a assigné à la requête le numéro EB-2007-0905. La décision de la Commission concernant cette requête aura une incidence sur la plupart des consommateurs d'électricité en Ontario.

Il s'agit de la première requête d'OPG afin d'obtenir une ordonnance de la Commission approuvant le montant des paiements pour la production de ses installations visées par le Règlement de l'Ontario 53/05. Ces installations comprennent plus spécifiquement les centrales nucléaires exploitées par OPG (Pickering et Darlington), ainsi que les installations hydroélectriques suivantes : Sir Adam Beck I, Sir Adam Beck II, la centrale de pompage Sir Adam Beck, De Cew Falls I, De Cew Falls II et R.H. Saunders. En 2006, ces centrales ont produit plus de 40 % de toute l'énergie électrique consommée en Ontario. Les paiements qu'OPG reçoit actuellement pour ces installations de production ont été établis aux termes du Règlement de l'Ontario 53/05 et demeurent en vigueur jusqu'à ce que la Commission détermine d'autres montants pour les paiements le 1er avril 2008 ou après cette date.

OPG indique que si la requête est approuvée telle que déposée, le montant des paiements augmenterait de 14 %. Selon OPG, le consommateur résidentiel qui utilise 1 000 kWh par mois verrait une augmentation d'environ 2,75 \$ sur sa facture d'électricité mensuelle. Dans le cadre de la requête, OPG demande également un rajustement du montant du paiement intérimaire qui prendra effet le 1er avril 2008 afin de permettre le recouvrement des paiements demandés si la décision finale de la Commission n'est pas rendue à cette date.

La Commission a décidé de tenir une audience orale pour traiter cette requête.

Report From Ottawa: Aboriginal history in our primary and secondary schools in an effort to bridge the gap and promote understanding. Busy Year for Brent St. Denis and the Liberal Team: 2007 has been a very busy year. We achieved a great deal. In the last year, I introduced two new Bills in the House of Commons – one Bill to ensure that Northern Ontario gets its fair share of federal seats in the House of Commons, and a second Bill to promote the teaching of

For a fairer Canada, our team has proposed a plan to reduce the number of people living in poverty by 30% and cut child poverty by 50% within five years of being elected to office. NDP "Year of the Smear": with startling reliability, Jack Layton's NDP has been forced to apologize several times for misfired attacks and smears against their political opponents.

NDP MP Irene Mathyssen had to apologize after falsely accusing a government

The Afghan Ambassador to Canada is still waiting for an apology from NDP MP Dawn Black after she accused Canada's Defence Department of writing Afghan President Hamid Karzai's speech to Parliament.

NDP MP Judy Wasylycia-Leis tried to smear Liberal MP Ralph Goodale by implicating him in an RCMP investigation concerning Income Trusts. Mr. Goodale was unequivocally exonerated by the RCMP and Ms. Wasylycia-Leis has yet to apologize.

Being an effective opposition in the House of Commons demands integrity and responsibility – which means getting your facts straight.

Conservative Failed Record: The Conservatives have had a very difficult year

under Stephen Harper. In October, the Conservatives celebrated the one year anniversary of their broken promise not to tax Income Trusts. This broken promise saw many seniors lose their retirement savings.

Suddenly and without debate, the Conservatives reversed a long standing policy to seek clemency for Canadians facing the death penalty in other countries. To add insult to injury, the Conservatives dropped Canada's sponsorship of the United Nations declaration calling for a moratorium on the death penalty worldwide.

The Ontario Provincial Police charged Ottawa Mayor Larry O'Brien into allegations of bribery.

OPP evidence suggests several members of Mr. Harper's inner circle including the Environment Minister John Baird have played a role in this affair. On top of this, the

Commissioner of Elections is investigating a multi-million dollar "in and out" scheme where the Conservative Party allegedly broke Elections Canada laws.

In addition, Mr. Harper seems to be flip flopping on calling for a full judicial inquiry into the Mulroney-Schreiber affair. Questions have been raised about what was discussed at meetings between Mr. Harper and Mr. Mulroney, and what Justice Minister Rob Nicholson – who served in the Mulroney government – knows about the Harper government's decision to scrap an ongoing review by the Justice Department into the Mulroney settlement upon taking office.

I look forward to continuing to work for the people of Algoma-Manitoulin-Kapuskasing in 2008. I encourage anyone who wants to discuss any issue with me to please contact my office.




