Chapleau High School campaign benefits hospital and Tsunami relief

G a i l Bignucolo, CEO, Chapleau Health Services (SSCHS) accepted the Chapleau High School student council donation from this year's Tree of Lights Campaign. The cheque, totaling \$1,400 and representing about half the total collected, will go towards the

Bignucolo Residence Courtyard Project. "The Board of Chapleau Health Services would like to express its deep appreciation for all the school council's hard work and generosity in raising funds for the Courtyard Project," said Bignucolo. This is the second time the Student Council has

assisted the hospital. Two years ago they donated to the Emergency Room renovation campaign and helped SSCHS in reaching that goal. The presentation marked the culmination of another successful year for the Tree of Lights effort. The approximately \$2,800 raised was up from previous years. The members of the student council met recently, and after a discussion concluded the funds collected would be split equally between the Courtyard project and the Tsunami Relief Fund. Meanwhile, interest in the Chapleau High School

Students Council has risen this year and there has been an increase in the number of students, particularly from grade 9, participating on the Students Council. There were several reasons for this, said Cheryl Boucher, Chapleau High School faculty member and Council advisor. She said the students realize that if they want a say, this is how to go about it. The Hospital Court Yard project will provide a secure environment in an outdoor setting for the seniors at the Bignucolo Residence.

"Province ready to take a role" in wake of Domtar closure says Brown

A delegation from Chapleau was to meet with the provincial Natural Resources Minister Friday as efforts continue to offset the effects of the announced closure of the Domtar mill in this community. The meeting, scheduled for David Ramsey's constituency office in New Liskeard, was arranged by his parliamentary assistant and MPP for Algoma-Manitoulin, Mike Brown. In preparation for the meeting, Brown spent last Monday in Chapleau consulting with the Township Council and others to

try and come up with some measures to counter the effects of the closure. D o m t a r announced on January 6 that effective March 6, 2005, it and Tembec, the community's two largest employers had concluded a deal which will close the Domtar operation and increase production at the Tembec sawmill. Although approximately 67 Domtar employees will be negatively affected, there will be a net loss of approximately 32 jobs. In the deal between the two forestry giants, Tembec will take over Domtar's current wood supply, and



Algoma- Manitoulin MPP Mike Brown discussed the Domtar Mill closure with Chapleau Mayor Earle J. Freeborn, the Chief of the Chapleau Cree First Nation , Wade Cachagee and Township Deputy Mayor Bud Swanson with Councillors Andre Byham and Richard Bignucolo create 49 new positions for a third shift. Of that number, a total of 15 Tembec employees, previously scheduled to be laid off this year, will fill the positions internally. 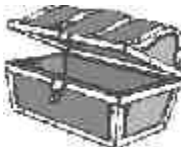

The start up date was revealed last Wednesday during a meeting of the Northern Mayors Group held in Wawa.

Adnet Communications Network

from Sault Ste. Marie presented an outline on the cell phone service initiative.

Chapleau Mayor Earle J. Freeborn said people on Superior Wireless Text are presently

receiving analog service. "However, it will be changed to Digital 1X, which is the latest cell service technology." For instance, it will provide email and call display.

"This digital network will begin in Chapleau first, in June 2005," stated the Mayor.

The service will be expanded to cover the Highway 17 Lake Superior route

from Sault Ste. Marie to Thunder Bay later.

Mayor Freeborn said there will be an information package sent out from AdNet to describe the technology and the service.

With this information, potential cell phone subscribers will be able to purchase equipment which will work elsewhere in the province.

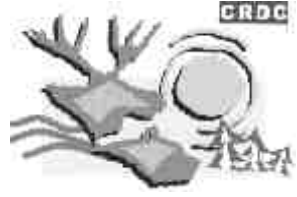

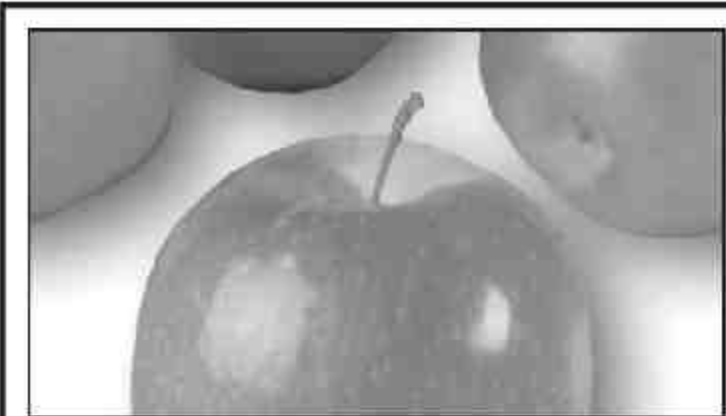

“This is serious,” stated Brown in an interview following a meeting with Chapleau Township Council.

At the same time Brown appeared to hold hope the province will step in to take a role in assisting the community at this time.

“The province is extremely committed. I had this conversation with the minister Mr. Ramsay before the mill closure

was announced and what we might do and he is excited about opportunities that are presenting themselves here and I want to leave it there. The province understands the severity of the hit here in Chapleau and will want to be part of the stabilization of the economy and hopefully a growth in the economy,” stated Brown in the interview.

The MPP said one of the first steps will be to dust off a list of projects that need to

be done. He added there is a possibility that other ministries can become involved.

The Chapleau Regional Development Corporation has been working on a number of initiatives to spur economic growth in the community and Brown said the Domtar closure gives added impetus to bringing some of these proposals forward.

Brown described the meeting Friday with Ramsay and the Township Council sitting down as a meeting of minds.

Brown said “I think there needs to be the direct reassurance of the minister he is going to work with the community to make sure that long term economic viability is here and that jobs are here. I think it’s good for him to hear first hand and it’s good for the minister to hear first hand some of the real numbers surrounding the closure and I think it will be good for the minister to hear about some of the community plans.”

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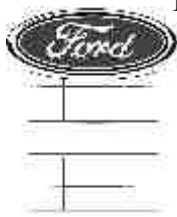

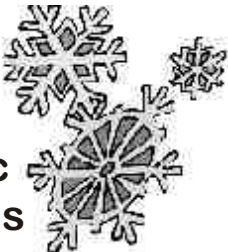
