## NESMG hoping to develop a New Economy for Superior East Region

The Mayors of Chapleau, Dubreuilville, Hornepayne, Manitouwadge, Wawa and White River are today announcing the development of a partnership with INORD (institute of Northern Ontario Research and Development) to work towards a New Economy for the Superior East Region.

INORD was established in 1986 by Laurentian University to promote economic and social research on Northern Ontario.

The communities of the Superior East Region, like the remainder of Northern Ontario, are in crisis.

Employment, particularly in the forest Industry is in steep decline having been dealt a devastating blow by high energy rates and high US import Tariffs. Many mills, dependant upon the forest for much needed raw materials have closed while others hover dangerously close to a similar fate. The forest industry meanwhile, continues to consolidate in an attempt to save the forestry sector from total collapse.

While all communities in Northern Ontario have been affected by economic downturns it is the smaller, more

rural communities, like those in the Superior East Region that are on the verge of collapse. While some help is available it is simply not enough to develop a more secure economy for the communities of the Superior East Region.

Formed in March 2000, the Northeastern Superior Mayors Group has worked successfully with both the Federal and Provincial Government on a number of projects.

However, Spokesperson Mayor Earl Freeborn of Chapleau says that "there may be a recovery strategy for the economy of small

town Northern Ontario but the implementation and success of any such program will not come at the pace necessary to save our respective communities."

Mayor Réjean Raymond of Dubreuilville adds "our group is of the opinion that the development of our strategy will move much more quickly by transcending the boundaries created by the bureaucracies of the senior levels of government"

Over the course of the past several months the NESMG has been working with the publisher of Northern

Ontario Business, Michael Atkins, Laurentian University economist Dr. David Robinson and business owner Karen Lacasse on a strategy for the region. The result was a document entitled 'Make Your Elephant Work for You - A Development Strategy for the Northeastern Superior Mayors' which would result in the development of a new and sustainable forest and energy economy for the region, The NESMG has now engaged INORD to turn the strategy into a practical plan and to help get the funding necessary to implement the plan.

Funding for the

Strategy and Plan Development is being provided solely from the member communities of the NESMG and will be administered and coordinated by INORD over the course of the next twelve (12) months.

Mayor Roger Drolet of White River summarizes the effort by stating "this is a step that we all must take if we are to hope for the survival of our communities into the future. It is both unique and very necessary. We believe that others may follow our direction once implementation begins."

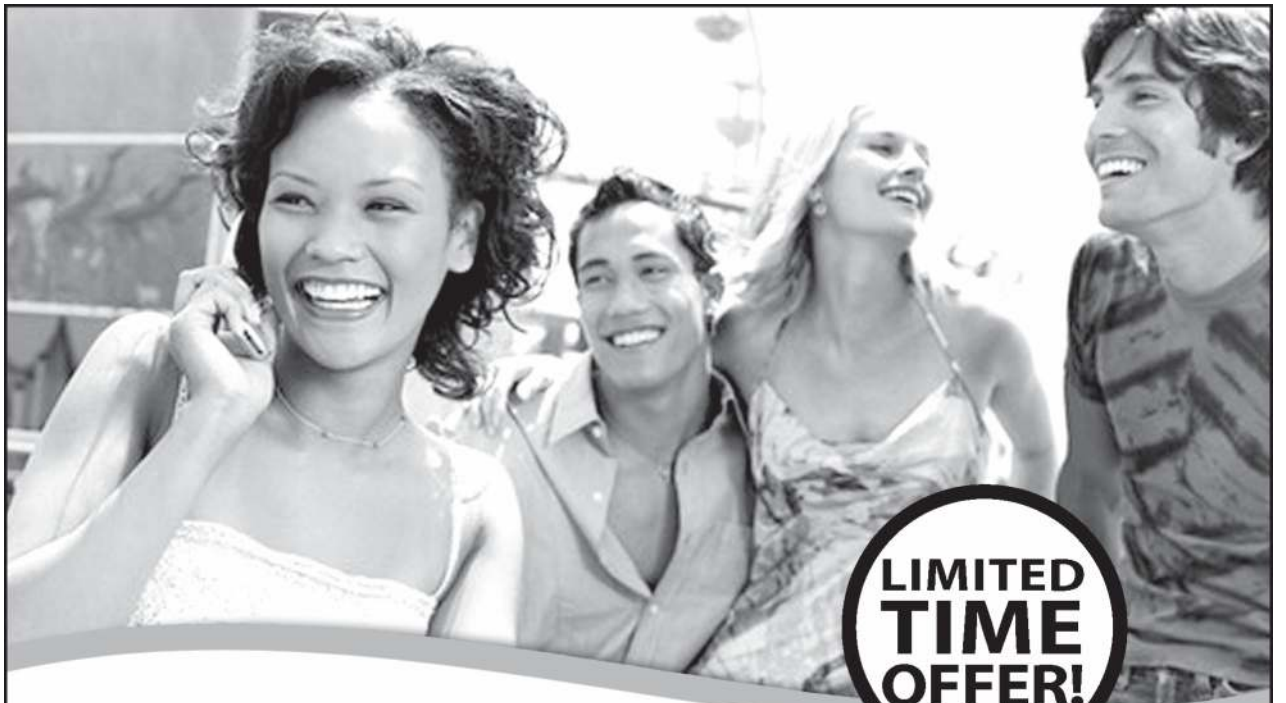

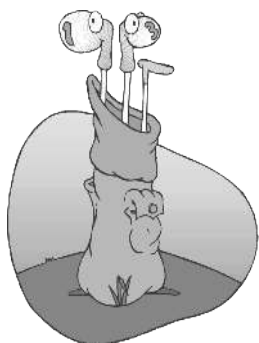

## East Fire Region Situation Update

Thursday, July 20, 2006 12:00

### HIGHLIGHTS:

25 new forest fires yesterday

### DETAILS:

There were 25 new forest fires yesterday in the following areas: 6 each in Sudbury and Parry Sound, 3 each in Sault Ste. Marie, Cochrane and North Bay, 2 in Wawa and 1 each in Algonquin Park and Bancroft. There are currently 40 active forest fires in the Hearst, Cochrane, Wawa, Timmins, Sault Ste Marie, Sudbury, North Bay, Parry Sound, Algonquin Park, and Bancroft areas. No problems are anticipated with these

fires at this time.

As of April 1st 2006, there have been 321 forest fires in the East Fire Region.

There are currently 15 FireRanger crews from the East Fire Region in the West Fire Region assisting with their escalated fire situation.

As a result of a major wind storm that passed through parts of eastern Ontario this past Monday, many communities were affected by damaging winds. The Ministry of Natural Resources would like to remind public, especially in those areas, that before burning any debris from the major storm event check

with your municipality to be advised of their burning regulations. Please use extreme care and caution with outdoor fires. Never leave your fire unattended and make sure it is completely extinguished before leaving. By eliminating human caused fires that result from carelessness the Ministry of Natural Resources can focus its resources on responding to new lightning caused forest fires.

The Library Staff would like to welcome all children to embark into this summer's "Quest for Heroes!"

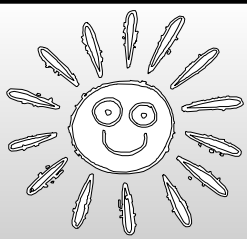
The Summer
