


Canadian Hot Rod Tour contingent visits Chapleau

Gardening from the ground up

Just Mowing the Lawn



By Mary Lynne Ivey-MountjoyBelieve it or not, there is some science to having a perfect lawn. Mowing is a major part of lawn maintenance, and how it is done will affect the health of your grass.

Unlike most plants, grasses grow from the bottom, pushing upwards, rather than sprouting new growth from the top. When you cut grass, you are trimming away

the older, tougher in lawn mixtures are growth, leaving new, tender growth exposed. Cutting too much off at once leaves the tender part of the plant open to damage. For best results, when you mow a lawn, never remove more than 1/3 of the length. In other words, if your mower blade is set to 3 inches, you should cut your grass before it is 5 inches long.

Keeping your grass slightly long rather than golf-green short (ie. Setting your mower blades to their highest rather than lowest setting) is one way of reducing how much time you spend mowing, as many species of grass found

low-growing and will slow their growth after the first few inches. Slightly longer lawns are also more resistant to dryness.

Regular trimming encourages grass to send up new shoots, making a lawn thicker and more resilient. Properly trimmed grass will also be healthier and more resistant to damage and disease. Trimming too much off at once weakens the grass, but so does rough trimming.

Keep mower blades sharp and clean to avoid ripped, brown ends on the grass. The cleaner the cut, the better it heals, and the less chance there is for

dieback or infection. Cleanly cut grass also looks fresh and green, without any browning on the tips. Strimmers should only be used around the edges, as the spinning cord tends to tear rather than cut the grass. Rotary mowers (with blades that spin underneath like a fan) are the most common type, but reel mowers (with blades on a cylinder that turns against a cutting bar) give a much cleaner cut.

Cutting little and often also avoids the problem of thick piles of cuttings left behind. If left on the lawn, long cuttings will smother the grass underneath, leaving brown patches. Short cuttings can either be collected for composting, or left as "thatch" for the grass. There are arguments for and against either choice. Thatching acts as a mulch, retaining moisture and adding nutrients to the soil, but if it gets too thick, the thatch can block out moisture and sunlight. You can compromise either by only occasionally leaving the trimmings, or by leaving them after every cutting and then to mow!




