LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Last week in the Chapleau Express I read that our hospital recently asked a recruitment specialist to speak to the Board of Directors at the Annual Assembly to inform them about the importance of planned recruitment of physicians and other health care professionals. I wonder how many people in Chapleau are aware that

we have three former Chapleau residents currently enrolled in the Northern Ontario School of Medicine (NOSM). These three students are entering into their second and third years of medical school, they are all doing very well and are scheduled to graduate in 2009/2010. From what I understand our community has yet to acknowledge these students in any significant way, let alone contact these students with a recruitment package to consider.

Currently students from all across Canada are being recruited earlier and earlier, with several students signing return of service agreements in their first year of medical school. Rural areas in Southern Ontario have been very successful in their recruitment attempts because they realize that they need to talk to students early in their training and they need to invest in medical students for long term health care stability. For a single student, four years of medical school costs upwards of \$150,000.00. This accumulating debt can weigh heavily on the minds of students and is even more challenging for the students returning to school with young families. The parents and extended families of all three of these students reside in Chapleau and know the considerable challenges that each student faces as they progress through school.

We need to remember that the competition to get into medical school is

considerable. NOSM receives over 2000 applicants every year and has only 56 seats to fill. This community has done nothing to acknowledge the three Chapleau students for getting into the school, let alone find out how they are doing and what their needs might be. The majority of the students at the Northern Ontario School of Medicine are from their own rural and remote areas across Canada and have their own home communities to consider when deciding where to open up a practice in future years. As our students go off to visit other communities this summer to see what they have to offer, we need to look at what we have done to entice future doctors into our community. We also need to think about why other medical students should consider Chapleau, when we have yet to acknowledge our own.

In closing, I often hear people say that the Northern Ontario School of Medicine is going to help Northern Ontario address some of the challenges of recruitment and retention of physicians in Northern Ontario, and I hope this to be

true. During the first and second years of medical school NOSM students have 3 four week long placements in rural and remote areas. Many of these communities like Kapuskasing and Elliot Lake are bringing in students annually to

show them what their community has to offer. That sounds like an ideal recruitment opportunity to me. Maybe it is time Chapleau started thinking further into our future!

Gardening from the ground up

The Tools Of the Trade

Having the right tools can make the difference between gardening being a frustrating chore or a rewarding and invigorating hobby. A gardener's five primary tools are: spade, fork, trowel, pruners, and saw. Tools need not be expensive, but quality does count. Cheaply

made tools often break easily. Tools should be matched to the job, but also to the user. Make sure they are a comfortable size to use, or you might find yourself working much harder than you need to.

A spade is basically a shorthandled shovel with a heavy blade used for cutting and digging. A gardening spade has a fairly flat, rectangular blade, usually with a flat edge at the top, used to push it into the ground with your foot. It is used for digging and lifting. Spades come in different types: digging spade is wide and heavy, used for

heavy work; a border spade is the same shape but smaller, used for digging or for lifting perennials and small shrubs; a rabbit spade is smaller still, with a slightly curved edge, used for working in tight spaces, but not for heavy lifting. Any of these three types can be used as the main tool in the garden, according to the size and strength of the user.

A garden fork has a short handle, like a spade, with heavy, nearly-straight tines that can be pushed into the ground and then prised upwards to lift soil, stones, or plants. A manure fork looks similar, but the tines are

more widely spaced and have more of a curve, making the fork too weak for digging, so it should not be used in place of a proper garden fork. It is used instead for turning and spreading compost or manure. A garden fork is used for lifting plants and loosening or turning the soil. Garden forks come in two types: a digging fork is larger and used for heavier work; a border fork is used for lighter work, ideal for tight spaces or smaller gardeners.

A trowel is a like a mini-shovel, used in one hand. It is used for planting small Trowels are things.

often sold as a set with a hand-fork, which is basically a mini garden fork. These are useful for loosening soil and popping weeds out.

Pruners come in many styles and sizes, and what kind works best depends on how big and strong your hands are, and what you will be cutting. Ratchet pruners or long-handled pruners are best for cutting larger branches, but will damage the plant if used for more delicate work. Likewise trying to cut big branches with small pruners will bruise and tear the plant, and is not good for the tool either.

A good saw is essential for pruning

trees and large or medium-sized shrubs.

If anything is too big to cut comfortably with pruners, use a saw. A pruning saw has a narrow, slightly curved blade. It is designed to make a clean, straight cut through round wood, and allow accurate cutting in tight spaces. Handsaws are not a good substitute, as they tend to bind in large pieces, and are clumsy to use among branches and stems.

There are of course many other gardening tools available, and each has its use, but these five basics will get most jobs done.



NOTICE OF AERIAL SPRAYING 2007 HERBICIDE PROGRAM

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) has approved the proposed chemical site preparation and tending operations of Nagagami Forest Management Ltd., Dubreuil Forest Products Ltd., Great West Timber Ltd., and Marathon Pulp Inc./686860 Ontario Ltd., as outlined in their 2007-2008 Annual Work Schedules. Domtar Inc., Sustainable Forest Licence holder of the White River Forest, will not be implementing the aerial spray program summarized in the 2007-2008 Annual Work Schedule. As part of their ongoing program to regenerate and protect our forests, the companies will conduct aerial spraying on selected forest stands in the Wawa District with herbicide to control competing vegetation, starting on or about

August 1 to September 15, 2007.






