
GRADUATION

On June 2, 2009, Nelson M. Lafrenière graduated from Laurentian University with a Bachelor of Science (Honours) in Forensic Science with Distinction.

Throughout the course of his undergraduate studies, Nelson has received a variety of a wards and bursaries acknowledging his outstanding academic achievements, including four consecutive appearances on the Dean's Honour List, four consecutive Queen Elizabeth II Aiming for the Top Scholarships, and four consecutive Anne Crichton-George Memorial Bursaries. Additionally, in 2007 and 2008,

Nelson was awarded an Undergraduate Student Research Award (USRA) by the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada (NSERC), which provided the funding necessary to gain practical hands-on research experience in a laboratory.

The experience Nelson gained throughout the years was put to good use in the final year of his undergrad, as he completed his fourth year thesis entitled: "The Effect of Tissue Type, Dose, and Dose-Death Interval on the Detection of Acute Fentanyl Exposure in Fresh and Decomposed Skeletal Tissues". Part of this thesis research was formally published in February 2009, in the academic journal 'Forensic Science International'.

De plus, en 2007 et

2008 Nelson fut le récipiendaire d'une Bourse de recherches en premier cycle du Conseil de recherches en Sciences naturelles et en génie du Canada qui l'a aidé financièrement à obtenir une expérience pratique en milieu de laboratoire.

Nelson a mis l'expérience acquise au cours des années au profit de sa thèse de dernière année intitulée: "L'effet du genre, de la dose et de l'intervalle de la dose mortelle sur le dépistage de tissus squelettiques frais et décomposés exposés de manière aiguë au fentanyl". Une partie des recherches pour cette thèse a été publiée en février 2009 dans le journal universitaire 'Forensic Science International'.

Dans son temps libre Nelson a participé à plusieurs pièces de théâtre avec la troupe de théâtre de Shakespeare de l'Université Thorneloe (y compris Hamlet et Macbeth), a animé une émission radiophonique hebdomadaire intitulée "Non-Sequitur Radio" aux ondes de CKLU 96.7 FM, et a coproduit un court métrage qui remporta le deuxième prix à la compétition de courts métrages 'Best in Shorts' de CTV dans la catégorie étudiant au Festival du film de Sudbury en 2008. À présent Nelson a accepté de travailler en stage d'emploi à l'Université de Toronto sous le tutorat du Dr. Aaron Wheeler, en vue d'avoir une grosse avance sur l'obtention d'une Maîtrise en chimie qui commencera officiellement cet automne au campus St. George. 

As the boat was maneuvered around the end of the island to get another glimpse at the cow and her calf, they noticed that the cow was almost at destination but that the calf wasn't even halfway to shore yet.

vocalist and "Plus Rien" by Les Cowboys Fringants accompanied on the guitar by Michel Martel and the bongo drums by Joel Godbout.





These shortfalls add up to a total of 988.5 hectares. This additional area is required to meet the volume requirements of the Chapleau sawmill.




