

participating in annual Terry Fox Runs and other events, Jessica made the decision to offer her hair on her own.

And Lauren, despite her young age, has an equally strong commitment to helping others and the Cancer Society. She has forsaken Christmas presents over the past four years, and instead has asked that their cash value be donated to the Terry Fox Foundation in support of Cancer research. Now, Lauren is likely to show up at your doorstep out collecting pledges she hopes will amount to at least one thousand dollars in the next week and is quietly confident residents here will ensure she meets the goal she has set to have her hair sheared off. "I've already raised over one hundred dollars," she said following just a few days into her efforts which will include door to door canvassing of the community.

It takes approximately 12 donations of unprocessed hair and costs about \$1,200 to craft a single handsewn wig for a child.

The efforts by the two girls are part of what is shaping up to be a huge event on June 20th when a large crowd of participants is expected to accompany the girls for the Relay for Life to be held at the Earle J. Freeborn Field of Dreams at the high schools.

The 12 - hour Relay commences 7 oclock with the Victory Walk by survivors. Then at 10 o-clock candles, which have been purchased earlier at a special tent, are placed around the perimeter of the field and lit in memory or in honour of friends or family who are battling cancer or who have passed away because of the cancer.

In preparation for the expected large turnout, the Cancer Society has arranged for the Independent Order of Odd Fellows and the Rebekahs to be on site serving food and beverages.

Canadian Cancer Statistics 2008 highlights:

* This year approximately 166,400 Canadians will be diagnosed with cancer and about 73,800 will die from the disease.

*The five-year relative survival rate for all cancers combined is 62 per cent (excluding Quebec**).

* Lung cancer remains the leading cause of cancer death for men and women.

* Almost 40 per cent of Canadian women and almost 45 per cent of men will develop cancer during their lifetimes.

* About 24 percent of women and almost 29 per cent of men, or approximately 1 out of every 4 Canadians, will die from cancer.

For all childhood cancers combined, the five-year survival is estimated to be 82 per cent an increase of 11 per cent over 15 years.

* Since 1985, there has been a dramatic decline in childhood cancer death rates (dropping from approximately 40 to 20 per million

* Childhood cancer incidence rates have remained relatively



Community partnership grant for access to health care services

Services de santé de Chapleau Health Services and the Township of Chapleau have teamed up to take advantage of a grant available from the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs called the

Development (RED) Through Program. this program Services de santé de Chapleau and the Township of Chapleau will be applying for funds for a project to improve access to health care services. The funds

Rural Economic for the Chapleau project would be used to (1) enhance the student bursary program, (2) enhance and expand recruitment activities, (3) develop a program to encourage youth into health careers and (4) train a local recruitment coordinator. This project consists of both short and longterm strategies to deal with Chapleau's health care recruitment recruitment/job fairs. problem.

Chapleau, like the rest of Ontario, is in need of physicians, nurses, physiotherapists, occupational therapists etc. Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care does not give funds to hospitals to recruit health care professionals. Instead, funds intended for hospital services must be used to pay for recruitment activities.
