From the moment the clouds cleared and the rainbow appeared over the survivors, to the early hours of the morning when countless participants and volunteers were weary, sore and cold. Not a moment went by that we weren't remembering, celebrating and fighting back, as individuals and together as a community.

"When we started this project," says Event Chair Gisele Barlow "we

knew it would be a wide spread effort and we knew that it was an event that would touch many people. The passion, commitment, dedication and generosity of our community has been astounding."

Entertainment by 'On The Mark' and guests played through the night, delighting crowds who gathered in front to listen and dance. The survivors' whose survival time varied from 3 weeks to 33 years walked the victory lap while spectators and partici-

pants lined the track to support them with applause and admiration. There was not a dry eye in the vicinity as the sun went down, the candles were lit and Mr. William Ivy played Amazing Grace on the Bag pipes. We stood in awe as over 600 luminaries glowed in honour and memory of our loved ones.

"We have all faced cancer individually in our lives in one form or another, On Friday June 20th, we came together and faced it as a community." says Mrs. Barlow.

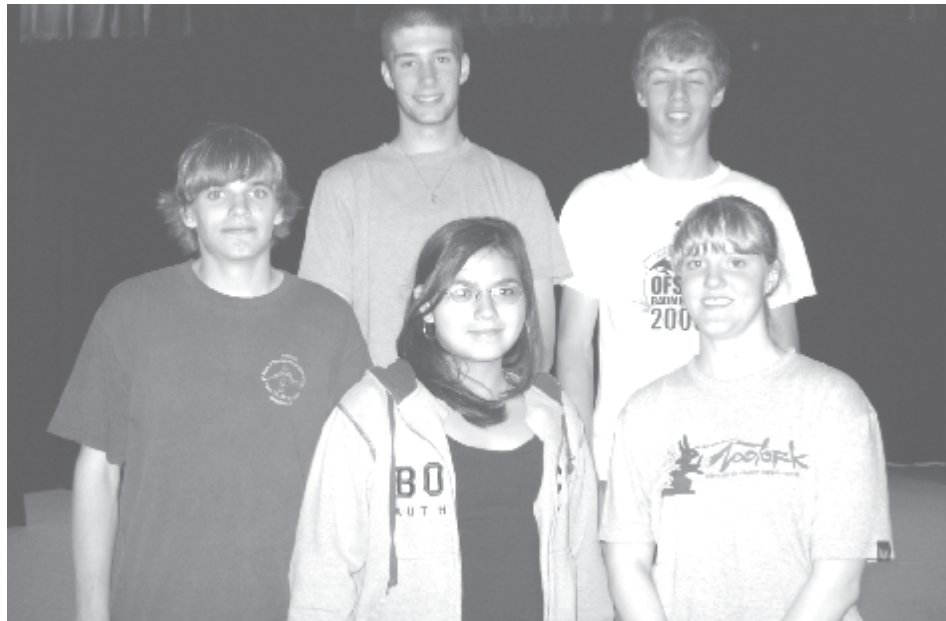

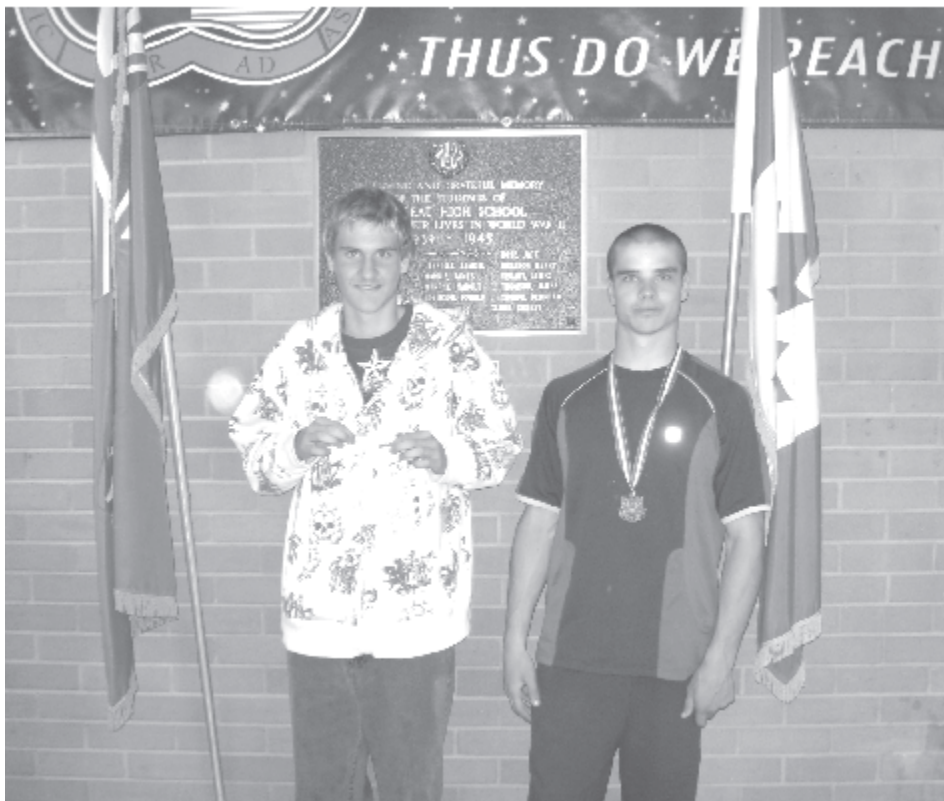
CHS Student Runs for Gold

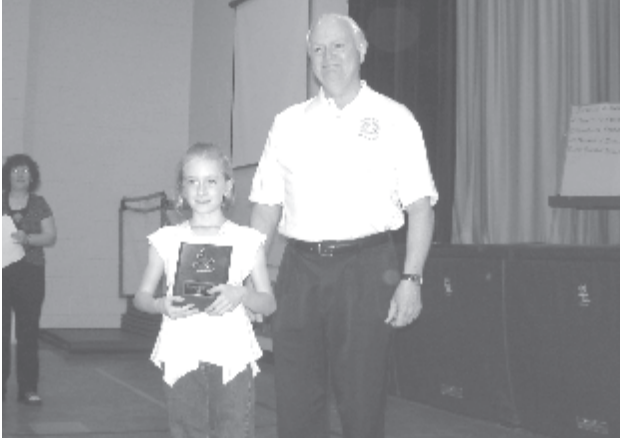

Mr. Boucher and Ms. Fenlon presented aboriginal awards demonstrating unity, strength and success to Emma Morrisson, Primary

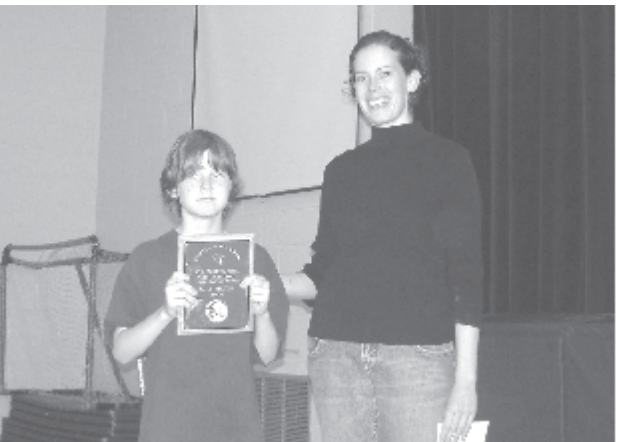

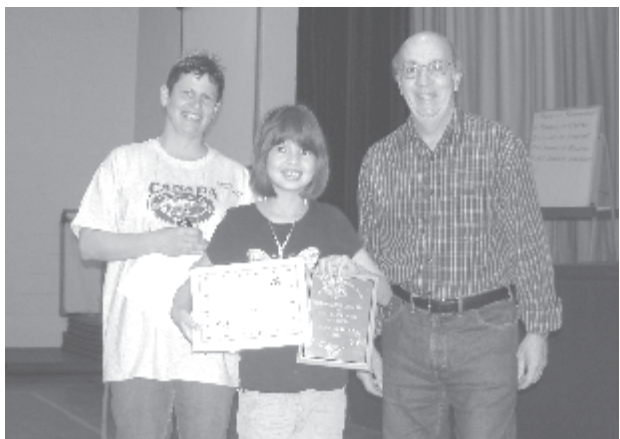

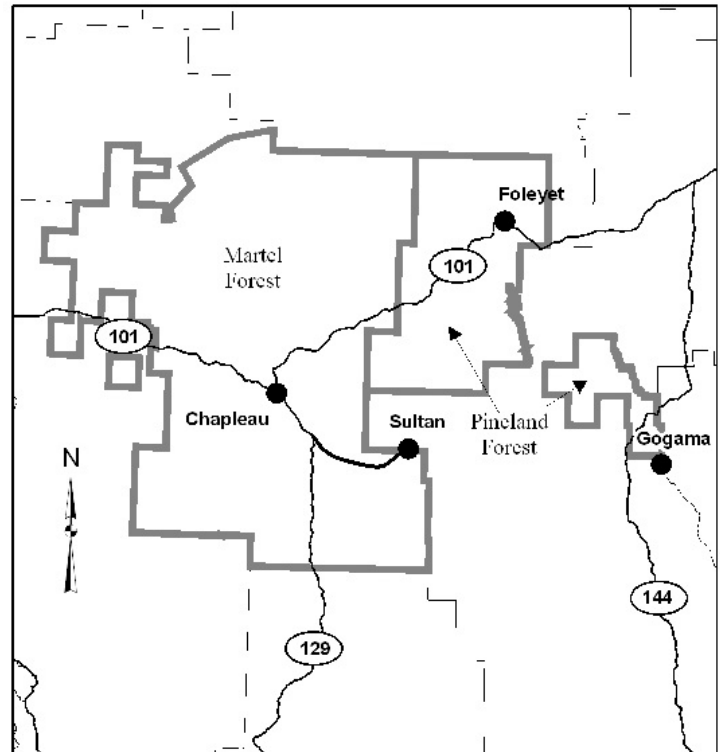

What you need to know about Ontario's health insurance card

Your Ontario Health Card is a very important piece of your personal information

that should be carried with you at all times.

You need to bring your OHIP card each time you come to the Hospital or Medical Clinic to receive services (i.e. laboratory, X-Ray, doctor's appointment). Health agencies are required to validate individual health cards on each visit regardless of when the last visit occurred. People who present without their health cards will be required to complete a Ministry of Health card documentation form at each visit without their card.

The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care and the Canada Health Act dictate that any individual who

receives medical care but cannot show proof of valid Ontario health insurance can be billed personally for both hospital and physician services provided. Chapleau Health Services recognizes that in an emergency, you may not remember to bring your health card. If this is the case, you will have an additional 24 hours to provide. Regardless of whether you have a health card with you, you will receive treatment in an emergency situation.

If you do not have a valid Health Card or have lost it, please contact the Ministry of Health at 1-888-314-4442.
