Momentum building for local Relay For Life

For the first time the Canadian Cancer Society Relay for Life will be held in Chapleau, and with less than three weeks to the event, excitement is building as organizers are reporting a flood of entries from local residents.

In the past, participants from Chapleau travelled to Sudbury for the Relay for Life event in that City and more often than not, the trip was made in snow and rain. When the decision was made to host a relay here, early on it became evident this was the right move as a

dozen teams signed up for this year's version of the Relay, to be held at the Earle J. Freeborn Field of Dreams at the Chapleau High School.

The Canadian Cancer Society Relay For Life is more than just a fundraiser. It is an opportunity to get together with family and friends and celebrate cancer survivors, remember loved ones lost to cancer, and fight back in the hope of finding a cure for this terrible disease. Anyone who has participated in previous Relays will

attest it is fun, fulfilling, and participation gives strength to the mission to eradicate cancer.

Although teams sign on for what is described as an inspirational 12-hour overnight walking event of coming together in the fight to make cancer history others show up just to walk on their own and show their support as well.

Mrs. Giselle Barlow is the chairperson for the Chapleau event. "It is held to honour all cancer survivors and

raise money for research and at the same time, participating is fun," she said. "While more teams are adding their names to participate, the event already has a dozen teams signed up."

Each team is comprised of 12 persons, who have paid ten dollars each to register. The enthusiasm is such that each team member has raised at least an additional one hundred dollars, which already guarantees the Chapleau Relay will be a financial success.

The teams are

encouraged to set up tents on the infield of the walking track in support of the participants. Adding some fun to the event, prizes will be awarded including those for best-decorated tent and best-dressed team.

The Relay for Life also puts the spotlight on those who have survived a battle with cancer and a highlight of the early evening is the Victory Walk by survivors who will lead off the activities at 7:00 o'clock. Cancer survivors join together

OEB issues decision on 2008 electricity distribution rate application for Chapleau Public Utilities Corporation

June 2/CNW Today the Ontario Energy Board (the Board) issued its Decision on an application by Chapleau Public Utilities Corporation (Chapleau PUC) for 2008 electricity

distribution rates. New rates will take effect the date the final Rate Order is issued.

Distribution rates are set to recover the cost to deliver electricity to consumers and reflect an individual utility's cost of service. Utilities apply to have their proposed rates to deliver electricity reviewed by the Board through a public process to determine what costs can be passed on to consumers. Distribution rates are reflected in the "Delivery" line of consumers' bills.

In 2006, the

Board developed a revolving three-year plan to set electricity distribution rates using two different, alternating methodologies. Under the plan, in one year out of three, utilities would typically have their rates set by way of a public review, known as a cost of service review, in which the utility applies for rates based on the costs it incurred to deliver electricity. In the other two years, utilities would typically have their rates set by way of incentive regulation guidelines. These reviews, which were



first used in 2007, provide a standard rate adjustment that accounts for inflation and productivity improvements.

For the rate

year which starts on May 1, 2008, 20 utilities are having their 2008 rates set by way of a cost of service rate review. 60 utilities are having their 2008

rates set using the Board's incentive regulation guidelines. Chapleau PUC's rates are being set by way of a cost of service review. Cont'd on P.6

OEB issues decision on 2008 electricity distribution rate application for Chapleau Public Utilities Corporation

Cont'd from P.1

In its Decision, the Board:

- Ordered a small reduction in the total OM&A expenditures Chapleau PUC applied for
- Directed Chapleau PUC to restate its Rate Base using the average of the opening and closing asset balances for the test year, to comply with Board Policy
- Ordered Chapleau PUC to maintain its current smart meter rate adder of \$0.26 per month per metered customer
- Allowed Chapleau PUC to clear its deferral and variance accounts over a three year period on an interim basis and suggested a review of

these accounts by the Board's Regulatory Auditor to finalize the amounts

- Directed Chapleau PUC to adjust its revenue to cost ratios for those classes which are outside the Board's target ranges to bring them in line with these ranges.

The Board directed Chapleau PUC to file a draft rate order, reflecting the findings in this Decision, and a schedule of proposed final distribution rates for 2008.

Bill impacts resulting from 2008 distribution rate decisions will be announced in the coming weeks after the utilities have submitted draft rate

schedules to the Board reflecting today's decision. The Board will announce the rate impacts when it approves and issues final rate orders to the utilities.

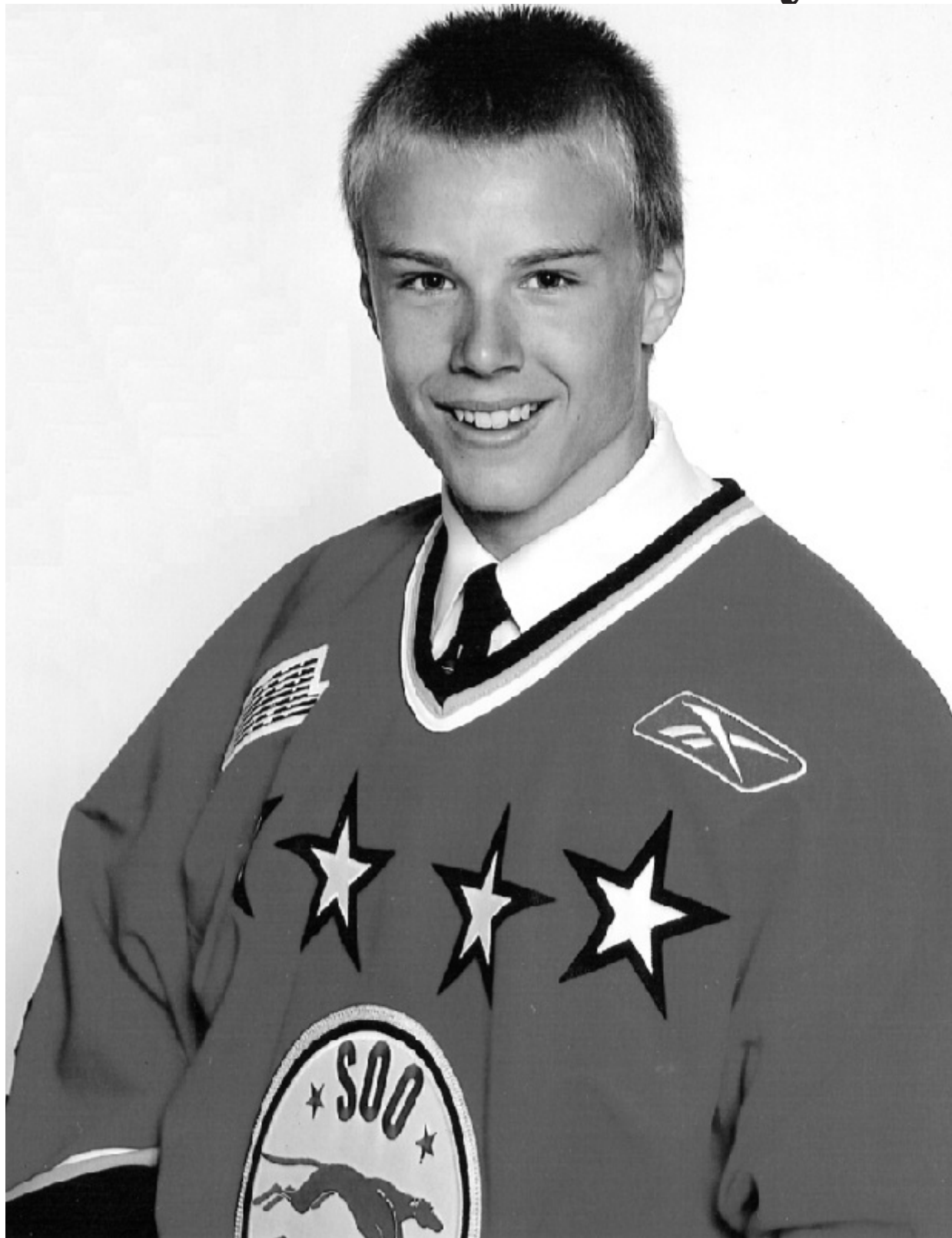
