



Freeborn accompanied Sapper Joel Lafreniere as he laid a wreath in their honour as piper Tom Luke from Timmins played the touching lament "Flowers of the Forest".

The occasion for this tribute was the safe return home of Sapper Lafreniere from a six month tour of duty in Afghanistan.


Public Inspection Approved 2007/2008 Annual Work Schedule **Spanish Forest**

APANO's Community Wellness Worker Program

As identified in earlier APANO articles submitted to this newspaper, the Community Wellness Worker (CWW) Program is one of A PANO's most recently sponsored programs in Chapleau.

The CWW program is funded through the Aboriginal Healing and Wellness Strategy (AHWS), which was developed in 1994. The Strategy is a policy and service initiative that brings together Aboriginal people and the Government of Ontario in a unique partnership to promote health and healing among Aboriginal people. The AHWS is managed by a Joint Committee, representing fifteen Aboriginal partners and four provincial ministries. One of its major accomplishments is the creation of a management structure that reflects Aboriginal culture and inclusiveness.

The Community Wellness Worker program is designed to deliver primarily client and participantbased services to Aboriginal individuals, families and children. The priority focus of programming is related to reducing service providers (both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal), to better understand services that are provided to Aboriginal clients and how these services can be enhanced to support a strong, healthy, and balanced Aboriginal community.

As a result of this networking the CWW program has partnered with Chadwick Home in the coordination of the Phenomenal Women project. Nominations were received by local individuals for women who they felt inspired them or have made positive contributions to our community. These Phenomenal Women and their guests were invited to an evening social acknowledging their contributions and honouring them on March 8th, International Women's Day.

Other partnership initiatives with the CAP-C and Healthy Babies, Healthy Children programs have resulted in a Sultan Community Outreach session and another being planned for March 22nd. March Break activities for Aboriginal families will be held at CAPA from March 12th to 15th beginning at 11:00 am. Craft projects for children and adults will be available as well as outdoor activities on Wednesday the 14th. On March 19th a Nutrition Food Bingo will be held at CAPA from 6:30 8:30 and a Spring Feast is scheduled for March 27th. In addition.

Women's Wellness Circles are offered every second Tuesday from 1:30 3:30 pm, free of charge for interested individuals.

The Chapleau Headlight

by Vince Crichton September 22, 1916

France, September 3, 1916. Dear Mr. Smith,

Secretary, Y.M.C.A. I was just

reading Jack Bank's letter in the Headlight this morning and thought I would write to you to let you know what we are doing. I came out of the front line trenches last night and got back to my dear old dug out at (censored).

This night marching is something fierce especially as you cannot see where you are going. We are continually falling over barbed wire and into shell holes. When we were coming through a shallow part of the trench where Fritz's trench is only (censored) away we had to go through one at a time and on the double which was some fun as we all had our packs on our backs. I came out of the hospital a few weeks ago. I had blood poison in both hands and my left arm caused by small shell splinters about the

size of pin heads but I consider myself very lucky as my chum was killed about six feet from me. He was struck just above the right eye and never spoke afterwards. I was so glad to get back to my dug out last night. I just crawled in and went to sleep scarcely taking time to take my pack off.

I was pleased to hear of the success of the Chapleau Platoon. I would try to describe things here but it is impossible. There are no houses left for miles and all one can see for miles is a beautiful cathedral now in ruins. The guns are coughing away continually and we have a First of July fire display every night. Hoping you and your family are well, Yours, Earl J. Freeborn, P.S. Remember me to all the boys.






