Deputy Mayor booted out of meeting *Community once again left in the dark*



The Deputy Mayor, André Byham, Michael Levesque, Principal at Our Lady of Fatima School along with Chapleau Express and MCTV representatives were

asked to leave a meeting that was slated for Thursday at 1:00 P.M. Everyone was under the impression that this was a public meeting and that clarifications were to be made as to what was behind the decision in a recent move to close the Chapleau Children's Aid Office and transferring all cases to the Kunuwanimano Children and Family Services.

A Children's Aid Society representative that came to Chapleau for the meeting was quoted to say to Deputy Reeve Byham that "This was

not a Town issue."

The local foster parents and the care of our local children is considered a "TOWN ISSUE". The loss of jobs at a time when Mayor Freeborn and Council have pledged to create 100 jobs, is a hard pill to swallow and is a 'TOWN ISSUE'

Residents were expected to be enlightened in the reasoning behind the Children's Aid Society's decision making but it was not to be.

Deputy Mayor André Byham went to the meeting of behalf of

Mayor Freeborn who could not attend due to illness.

Mayor Earle J. Freeborn had said in an earlier interview "The move is totally unacceptable. We are vehemently opposed to this negative action that will have a severe impact on child care services in our small northern community and put children at risk unnecessarily."

Michael Levesque, principal at Our Lady of Fatima School states: "I am extremely disappointed with the Children's Aid Society. I think that the way they are slipping

out the back door is shabby and is a shameless insult to all workers and foster parents who have given parts of their lives to care for children in need. It's an insult to our community. We don't know where we stand. This situation was created by the Children's Aid Society and this makes it unfair to all parties including the Kunuwanimano Children and Family Services. Why an organization entrusted with such responsibilities is allowed to treat people as such is beyond me."

Take Proper Precautions When Driving in Winter

One of the biggest adjustments Algoma-Manitoulin residents need to make with the arrival of winter is to change their driving habits. As the seasons change, so do the decisions we make to ensure our personal safety on the roads. Here are a few tips on the steps you should take to ensure your own safety during the winter driving season.

It is suggested that you have a reputable garage do a tune-up and inspection on your vehicle. Ensuring its mechanical fitness is just one more additional step to take to ensure not only your safety, but those of your loved ones traveling with you. To help you maintain control in snowy conditions, use tires

that meet Transport Canada's "snow tire" designation. You can identify these tires because they have the logo of a snowflake inside of a peaked mountain. Also, be sure to check your tire pressure regularly. As the temperature drops, the air pressure in your tire will too. It is also a wise idea to make sure that your tire valves are equipped with caps to keep out snow and ice. Never let your gas tank drop below half a tank, and be sure to add gasoline to every second tank. Be sure to keep your antifreeze, transmission, break and windshield-washer fluids topped up.

Even if you are only heading "a couple of minutes away," be

sure to wear warm clothing. An accident can happen at any time, and in the event of such a situation, there is no telling how long you may be exposed to the elements. This is one good reason to ensure that your vehicle is equipped with a winter emergency kit. This kit should include extra antifreeze and windshield-washer fluid, a flashlight with extra batteries, blankets for warmth, a candle with matches, flares, a snow shovel, extra hats and mitts, and chocolate or granola bars. All of these things can be the difference between life and death if you become stranded on the side of the road.

It is always a good idea to check local weather and road conditions before heading out on the road. Whenever possible, tell someone where you are going and when you expect to arrive. It is advisable to


take a map, just to be prepared in the event that you need to take an alternative route. Ensure that you have a cellphone, so that in the event that you do have a breakdown, you can call for assistance.

One final piece of advice for winter drivers is to take the time to properly clean off their car, windows and mirrors, and not just a peephole through the windshield. You need just as much, if not more, visibility in poor conditions, to help you keep an eye out for any potential hazards that may be occurring outside of what is going on directly in front of you.

Ontario doctors applaud measures to increase physician supply

Efforts to bring doctors back to Ontario good news for patients

TORONTO, Feb. 25 /CNW/ - Ontario's doctors welcomed the announcement today by the provincial government to invite American-based Ontario-licensed physicians back to Ontario, and to increase the number of specialist residency training spaces.

"We have previously called for strong measures to be taken to repatriate Canadian physicians back to Ontario, and for greater choice in medical training," said Dr. David Bach, President of the Ontario Medical Association (OMA).

"Today the government has taken

a step forward to ensure more patients have access to a physician."

In the OMA's 2002 physician supply report entitled Position Paper on Physician Workforce Policy and Planning, and in subsequent report updates, the OMA made a series of recommendations aimed at addressing the doctor shortage.

Included in those recommendations were the following:

1. Develop a new repatriation program aimed at recruiting Canadian-trained physicians currently practicing in the United States.

2. Improve the flexibility of choice for medical students when determining their field of practice, and facilitate the ability to change field of practice during the training period. (Specifically, the OMA called for the government to create a medical student to resident ratio of:1.2 spaces.)

"By offering greater choice for medical residents, our new doctors will be able to choose a training program in line with their interests, thereby helping to keep them in Ontario," said Dr. Bach. "Coupled with initiatives to

attract the 3,000 Ontario-licensed physicians currently practicing in the United States back to Ontario, these efforts should have an impact on physician supply."

The OMA has been working with the government through HealthForce Ontario

to help develop initiatives and strategies to recruit Canadian-licensed physicians back to Ontario and recruit recent medical

graduates to the province.

The OMA will be releasing an update on the physician supply situation in Ontario in the coming days.

McGuinty Government Strengthens Forest Industry in Ontario

\$6-Million Investment Will Help Secure 140 High-Value Jobs, Boost Province's Energy Supply

TRENTON, ON, Feb. 28 /CNW/ - Premier Dalton McGuinty today announced that the government is strengthening the forest sector and expanding renewable energy in Ontario by helping to build a new biomass co-generation plant at Norampac's Trenton mill.

"We're proud to partner with Norampac to secure local jobs and build a better quality of life for families in rural Ontario," said Premier McGuinty.

"This new co-generation plant will

create high-skill jobs, strengthen surrounding communities and help to build a stronger, greener and healthier province for years to come."

Through its Forest Sector Prosperity Fund, the government is investing \$6 million to help build a new \$27-million biomass co-generation plant.

Building the plant will help secure about 140 jobs in Trenton.

The plant will produce steam and electricity, reducing the

mill's dependence on natural gas and fuel oil. It will be fuelled by biomass made up of waste from southern Ontario sawmills. As a result, the mill will become more self-sufficient.

Premier McGuinty joined Natural Resources Minister David Ramsay, Northumberland MPP Lou Rinaldi, Mayor John Williams and Norampac executives and employees for today's announcement.

"We are committed to investing

in the businesses that help rural Ontario prosper," said Ramsay. "Our prosperity fund is supporting a key engine of our economy - the forest sector - making that industry more competitive, developing clean, renewable energy sources and securing good jobs."

"Today's announcement is good news for Trenton and for the forest industry," said Rinaldi. "Through significant partnership investments, like this initiative with Norampac, the McGuinty government is helping to foster innovation by local businesses."

"The upgrades we are making, with the assistance of the government, will help

make our Trenton operation more efficient and competitive," said Marc-André Dépin, President and Chief Executive Officer of Norampac. "The \$6-million contribution from the Forest Sector Prosperity Fund was critical to our decision to go ahead with these measures."

The government created the \$150-million Forest Sector Prosperity Fund to help forest companies invest in their own futures, and those of the communities that depend on them.

Strengthening Ontario's forest sector is just the latest example of how the McGuinty government is working to create a stronger and more

prosperous rural Ontario. Other initiatives include:


- Providing a loan guarantee of \$8 million to Tembec for an engineered wood products facility in Kirkland Lake

- Giving a \$1.65-million grant to Flakeboard Company Ltd. to upgrade its Sault Ste. Marie mill

- Investing \$1.39 million in Bowater Canadian Forest Products Incorporated's Thunder Bay complex

- Helping to build a coated structural board facility in Earlton, the first of its kind in North America, with a \$2-million grant to Grant Forest Products.

"Investing in alternative fuels, like biomass, will help boost our province's supply of energy," said Premier McGuinty. "It will also strengthen Ontario's economic advantage and build opportunity for future generations."

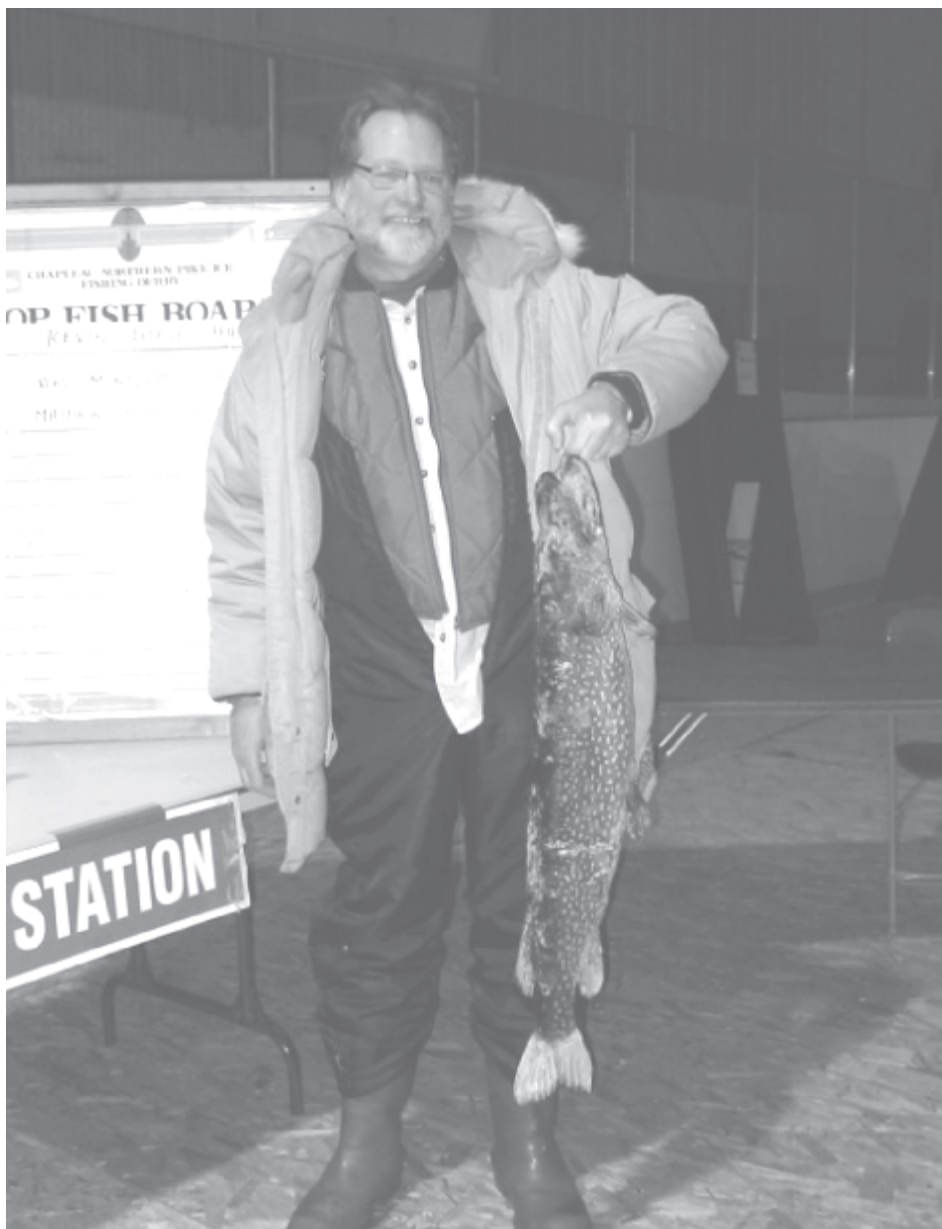



Time to change the batteries in your smoke alarms

CNW - One year ago today, an amendment to the Fire Code came into effect requiring Ontario homes to have smoke alarms on every storey, as well as outside all sleeping areas. The Ontario Fire Marshal would like to remind everyone that it's time to change the batteries in all those new smoke alarms.

"The batteries in smoke alarms need to be replaced once a

year, or if the low-battery warning chirps," said Patrick Burke, Fire Marshal for Ontario.

"With the clocks changing on March 11, this is the perfect time to also change the batteries in all your smoke alarms."

A recent review of provincial fire loss data indicates that 79% of homes that experienced a fire had

a smoke alarm installed. However, these smoke alarms activated in less than half - 47 per cent - of these fires. One of the primary reasons that smoke alarms don't work is because people remove the batteries because of frequent nuisance alarms caused by cooking activities or steam from a shower.

If nuisance alarms are a problem, never

remove or disconnect the batteries. Tampering with, or removing the batteries from your smoke alarms is against the law. The Office of the Fire Marshal

encourages anyone experiencing nuisance alarms to visit the website www.make-it-stop.ca for solutions, or contact your local fire department for advice.
