Update on the softwood deal: Canadian forest companies await refunds

Canadian lumber producers hope to use their portions of \$US4 billion in duty refunds to finance growth, pay down debt, and shield

themselves from the impact of the rising loonie. Trade Minister David Emerson said he expects the deal to be finalized in 60 to 90

days, with funds arriving soon thereafter, according to the Toronto Globe and Mail. "It may be quicker than that, just

depending on the legal difficulties in finalizing the terms of the agreement," he said.

Ontario Government makes communities safer Launches Third Year Of Bear Wise Program

TORONTO

The Ontario government continues to make communities and people safer, raise awareness and reduce human-bear conflicts through its annual Bear Wise program, Natural Resources Minister David Ramsay announced today.

"Our Bear Wise phone line and website have helped

thousands of people learn more about bears and how to reduce bear problems and our educational electronic book has been a hit with students and teachers," said Ramsay. "Together we are making a difference and improving community safety and awareness." Another component of the Bear Wise

program, now in its third year, is funding for communities to become more bear aware. Last year, the province funded 97 Bear Wise projects in 76 communities. One of those communities was Elliot Lake. In the second year of the Bear Wise program, the city got 238 bear calls, down dramatically from 509 calls in 2003,

before the program was in place.

"We've used the money from Bear Wise to purchase bear proof garbage containers, do local advertising on avoiding bear problems and this year, we hope to work on our landfill site," said Elliot Lake mayor George Farkouh. "By working with the

Ministry of Natural Resources, the Friends of Algoma East and the community, we've noticeably reduced our bear problems."

The Bear Wise program is based on four cornerstones reporting, response, prevention, and education and awareness.

« Notre ligne téléphonique et notre site Web du programme Attention : Ours ont aidé des milliers de personnes à en apprendre davantage sur les ours et à réduire les problèmes associés aux ours, et notre livret éducatif sur support électronique a beaucoup de succès auprès des élèves et des enseignants, a déclaré M. Ramsay. Nos efforts collectifs donnent des résultats. Ils accroissent la sécurité publique et la sensibilisation de la population. »

Grâce à une autre facette du programme Attention : Ours, dont c'est la troisième année, les collectivités reçoivent une aide financière pour mieux connaître

le comportement de l'ours noir et prévenir ainsi la nuisance et les dangers qu'il peut causer. Le gouvernement provincial a financé, l'an dernier, 97 projets dans 76 collectivités. Elliot Lake était l'une d'elles. Durant la deuxième année du programme Attention : Ours, la municipalité a reçu 238 appels au sujet de problèmes associés à des ours : une baisse spectaculaire par rapport au nombre d'appels (509) qu'elle avait reçus en 2003, avant le lancement du programme.

« Nous avons utilisé les subventions du programme Attention : Ours pour acheter des poubelles à l'épreuve des ours et faire de la publicité locale pour montrer aux gens à prévenir les problèmes d'ours, et nous espérons, cette année, nous occuper de notre décharge, a dit le maire d'Elliot Lake, M. George Farkouh. En

collaborant avec le ministère des Richesses naturelles, les Amis d'Algoma-Est et la population locale, nous avons nettement réduit nos problèmes d'ours. »

Le programme Attention : Ours repose sur quatre pierres angulaires : déclaration, intervention, prévention et sensibilisation.

Les personnes qui ont un problème associé à la présence d'un ours peuvent composer, sans frais, le numéro de la ligne Attention : Ours (1 866 514-2327), 24 heures par jour, tous les jours, durant la saison d'activité des ours. S'il s'agit d'une situation extrêmement grave qui met la vie en danger, il faut composer le 911 ou appeler le service de police local.

BEAR WISE



Are you attracting bears
to your **neighbourhood?**

Bears thrive in the wild on berries and nuts, but when their natural food supply runs low, bears will venture out to residential areas. Drawn by the smell of other foods and garbage, bears will follow their noses – right to your neighbourhood. Once they find a source of easy food, they will come back again and again.

You can help keep bears out of your neighbourhood by correctly managing those things that attract them.

Garbage

- Put garbage out on the morning of garbage day, and not the night before
- Store indoors until morning of pick up or trip to the dump
- Keep meat scraps in the freezer until garbage day
- Place garbage in containers that have tight fitting lids
- If eating outdoors, put wrappers and scraps in the garbage, not on the ground
- Frequently clean garbage and recycle containers

Bird feed (including seed, nectar and suet)

- Feed birds during winter months only

Pet food

- Feed pets indoors

Fruits and vegetables

- Avoid landscaping with trees, shrubs or plants that produce foods known to attract bears (some examples include crab apple trees, mountain ash, beech, and oak)
- Remove vegetables and fallen fruit from the ground
- Pick all ripe fruit from trees and bushes

Outdoor grills

- Thoroughly clean grills and barbecue pits after every use

Composters

- Keep meat, fish or sweet food (including fruit) out of your composter



Plan Inspection Pineland Forest 2006-2026 Forest Management Plan

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR), Domtar Inc. (Timmins) and the Pineland Local Citizens Committee wish to advise the public that the 2006-2026 forest management plan for the Pineland Forest has been completed and approved.

The forest management plan outlines the long-term strategic direction for the management of the forest, the details of harvest, renewal and tending operations and access road locations for the first five-year term 2006-2011.

This notice advises the public of a formal opportunity to examine the MNR-approved forest management plan prior to its implementation. The MNR-approved plan will be available for public inspection during normal office hours (and by appointment during non-business hours) for a period of 30 days (**May 7, 2006 to June 7, 2006**) at each of the following locations:





ATTENTION OUTDOOR POOL AND HOT TUB OWNERS


The Council of the Township of Chapleau wishes to advise all citizens of Chapleau that it has taken measures to ensure community safety regarding swimming pools.

"SWIMMING POOL" means any privately-owned outdoor body of water, including a hot tub, which is designed to be used for swimming, diving or bathing in which the depth of water at any point can exceed 600mm (23 1/2 inches).

(North Bay) The North East Region Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), Ministry of Transportation (MTO) and several northern community road safety committees have teamed up again this year, to help motorists avoid wildlife collisions on roadways this spring and summer through the Stay Alert! Stay Alive! road safety

campaign.

Food tray liners carrying wildlife collision prevention messages will be distributed to restaurants located in various communities and/or adjacent to major highways throughout the North East Region (NER). These educational materials feature wildlife silhouettes appearing in night time

driving conditions, and the following, safety tips:

-SLOWDOWN!

Visibility is greatly reduced at night and so is your reaction time!

- Avoid driving during dusk or dawn if possible
- Use high beams when possible
- Scan the road continuously, shoulder to shoulder
- At night, watch for

reflection of animal's eyes - they will blink, glow and move

-Drive cautiously through areas identified as high risk by wildlife crossing signs

-ALWAYS slow down when passing wildlife - they may suddenly jump into your lane

- Keep braking after an animal has crossed - there are usually more
- NEVER attempt

extreme manoeuvres to avoid a collision

-Don't assume the animal will move out of your way - most freeze when in a vehicle's headlights

-Check your Speed!

"Building public awareness about the very real possibility of encountering wildlife on Northern Ontario roadways is an important first step," explains Inspector

Mark Andrews, Unit Commander North East Region Traffic and Marine.

"Motorists must take on the personal responsibility for their safety and that of their passengers by remaining alert to the driving hazard when they are behind the wheel."



Conservatives Failing Northern Ontario With First Budget

The Conservative government's first budget fails to address the real needs of Canadian families and to move the country forward. Given the strong fiscal record the Conservatives inherited from the former Liberal government it is outrageous that this government is raising the low income tax rate, cutting spending by \$1 billion a year without identifying which programs will go and excluding any real vision for the future of Canada's prosperity.

For their part, The NDP helped pave

seats for their party.

The Conservatives are throwing fiscal prudence out the window and spending savings from program cuts before they even have them in the bank. The budget fails to maintain fiscal responsibility bringing Canada perilously close to a deficit by eliminating fiscal prudence and spending budget cuts before they are made. Eliminating Liberal income tax cuts in favour of a 1 per cent GST cut has been panned by every serious economist in the country as a plan that will benefit higher-income Canadians at the expense of the more needy. In addition, the Conservatives are hiking the low income tax rate to 15.5 percent, which means many people who got a refund for the 2005 tax year will end up paying in 2006.

Their budget also fails on such important matters as climate change, real

child care choices for parents, education and innovation. Sadly, the very pressing needs of Canada's Aboriginal peoples have also been neglected. Rather than honouring the historic Kelowna Agreement signed last November, which would have substantially improved the lives of our First Nations people, the Conservative government has chosen to ignore them, cutting planned funding by 80 per cent, from \$5.3 billion to just over \$1 billion.

If the Conservatives continue down this road, they will undo all of the work that the previous Liberal government did to put Canada at the head of the G-7 nations. And in the end, the wealthy will benefit, while those most in need will be left behind. Cynically, this Budget is more about short-term political gain at the expense of long-term prosperity and productivity.

Brown Welcomes Announcement of Increased Funding for Community Care Access Centres

Algoma and Manitoulin-Sudbury Community Care Access Centres to Receive \$2,930,400

Mike Brown, MPP for Algoma-Manitoulin welcomed the announcement today by the Government of Ontario of increased funding to community care access centres serving Algoma-Manitoulin.

"I am very pleased to see that both the Algoma and Manitoulin-Sudbury Community Care Access Centres will be receiving this funding," said Brown. "Home care and community support services offer greater dignity and quality of life for people of all ages, especially our seniors and vulnerable people, and this funding will aid greatly

in ensuring that these people get the care they need, when they need it."

Through this announcement, \$1,539,900 will go to the Algoma Community Care Access Centre and \$1,390,500 will go to the Manitoulin-Sudbury Community Care Access Centre to be used for home care, end of life care, nursing, personal support and in-home rehabilitation services.

The increase in home care funding is also due to improvements in the pay and benefits for personal support workers. These improvements are being made in response to a report on the Community Care Access Centres' (CCACs) Request For Proposal process.






