referred to as "Depart with Dignity". Part of this program is to present the retiring member with a Canadian Flag. Up until September of 2008, the Forces would request a flag that was flown at the Parliament buildings

but now that is no longer the case. Normally, the Flag that is being presented to the retiring member would fly at his or her last base or another location requested by the member.

Master Warrant Officer Bernier has requested that his Canadian Flag be raised and flown in Chapleau at the Civic Centre. On April 15th 2009 the flag will be brought to Chapleau along with a flag party of 3 soldiers in dress uniform to raise the flag at nine o'clock in the morning and lower it at four o'clock in the afternoon. Once the flag is returned to 700 Communication Squadron it will then be framed and a plaque will be placed on it with the date and location.

Frank was born in Chapleau on April 3, 1951, third son to Grace and Gene Bernier. He did his schooling in Chapleau prior to joining the Military on the 14th of February, 1969. After completion of his basic training on the east coast at CFB Cornwallis Nova Scotia, he was posted

to the Canadian Forces School of Communications and Land Ordnance Engineering (CFSCLOE) at Vimy Barracks in Kingston Ontario.

He completed his training as a Basic Radio Operator in Kingston and moved from the School to the 1st Canadian Signal Regiment in Kingston where he served until summer 1977. Both daughters, Grace and Lori were born in Kingston during this time. While serving in the Regiment he completed his first tour of duty in Cyprus in 1972-73 and a tour in Cairo Egypt 1973-74. Upon his return from Egypt, he was then posted to the west coast in Equimalt on Vancouver Island to 3rd Battalion Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry. 1974-75 he returned to Cyprus with the Battalion for his second tour. Having been coast to coast in Canada, he was posted to the 4th Canadian Mechanized Brigade Group Headquarters and Signal Squadron in Germany in 1977 where he served for 4 In 1981 he years.

was posted back to Canada, specifically, London, Ontario and served with the First Battalion Royal Canadian Regiment. He returned to the Signal Regiment in 1985 where he was deployed to Baghdad, Iraq in 1988. (In fact, Frank was fishing on Winnebagon Lake when recalled to Kingston for that deployment) In 1990 he then was posted across the road to the School of Signals where he served until 1994 when he joined 79 Communications Regiment, but still in Kingston. In 1996, he was then posted to 724 Communication Squadron in Gagetown New Brunswick where he retired from the Regular Force in 1997. He sold his house in Kingston and moved to New Lowell in Dec of 1997. He then was recruited into 700 (Borden) Communications Squadron where he will end his Military service on June 2, 2009. He is married to Dee (Nee) Coleman of Stittsville and they have 6 grand children.



LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

I am writing to request the assistance of you and your readers for two Chapleau history research projects that I am working on for my next Chapleau book.

The projects are a collaborative effort between myself, Ian Macdonald, Mike McMullen and Mike Morris. Ian has recently retired as Head of the School of Architecture at the University of Manitoba. Mike McMullen and Mike Morris both have deep roots in the Chapleau area and Mulligan's

Bay was likely named after one or more of their ancestors. We all spent some or all of our growing up years in Chapleau and have maintained a keen interest in the community and its history.

Ian is an expert on early railroad architecture and has graciously consented to write a chapter on the architecture of Chapleau with an emphasis on the C.P.R. buildings - including (but not limited to) the station, the roundhouse, the Y.M.C.A. and the older C.P.R. residential duplexes on Monk and Pine Streets.

Ian, the two Mikes and I are collaborating on a piece about the history of the Hudson's Bay Post(s) in the Chapleau area. We think that there was some sort of a post and small settlement including an Anglican church at what has come to be known as "The Old Fort" at Mulligan's Bay. We don't know for sure when the post was opened or when the Hudson's Bay Company first traded in the Chapleau area. We also know that the operation that may have been at

Mulligan's Bay was shut down and moved into the town of Chapleau some time around 1885 when the C.P.R. went through. That Chapleau location appears to have been closed about 1899.

The matter of the church is of peripheral interest only in that information about it might help to determine when the post was opened and exactly where it was located.

Unfortunately, the Hudson's Bay records are sometimes tantalizingly and frustratingly incomplete. One document refers to some sort of a

sub post located one mile from Chapleau. Its purpose was to try to prevent the Aboriginals from going into town and doing business with the Hudson's Bay competitors. The site of this location is not identified in any Hudson's Bay documents that we have examined. However we are initially hypothesizing that it might have been on the north side of the Back River about a mile east of the Cedar Street Bridge. Another possibility is that a post or sub post may have been located on the north side of the Front River near the

present site of the golf

course.

It is very important to all of us that this piece be as accurate and as well documented as possible.

We would appreciate any sharing of information, documents, photos or opinions about the topics about which we are researching and writing.



The Club President would like to apologize to Michel Sylvestre's rink. Miscalculations after the final game had placed his rink in the eight spot and not the fifth.


The Club could not do without the help of volunteers throughout the year.

Healthy foods make healthy events

Are you planning an event, and don't know what food or snacks you are going to

serve? Whether it's a party, a staff meeting, or a sports event, be creative and either prepare or purchase healthier options to energize your crowd. These days, people are

more health conscious, and appreciate when tasty, nutritious foods are available. Healthy foods don't have to be a burden. If you're crunched for time there are lots of quick, easy, and affordable options available.

To ensure you are making healthy food choices for your event, follow Canada's Food Guide, remembering some of the main points.

Offer:A variety of vegetables and fruits (e.g. fresh vegetables and fruit, canned fruit, frozen berries). Whole grain products (e.g. whole wheat bread, pita's, buns, tortillas). Meatless options (e.g. vegetarian lasagna, stir fired vegetables, vegetarian chilli). Low fat dairy products (e.g. low fat yogurt, low fat cheese, and lower fat milk). Lower fat foods (e.g. no fried foods, watch out for foods with added fat from butter, margarine and mayonnaise) . Water,

juices, and milk as your beverage.

100% fruit or vegetable

Ultimately you want to aim for: At least three of the four food groups to be included in meals. Some healthy examples are vege-tarian chili served with a warm whole grain pita, a chicken or tofuvegetable stir fry served

over a bed of brown rice, or whole grain pasta with meat sauce and a side mixed salad. At least two of the four food groups to be included in snacks. This can be as simple as serving whole grain crackers and cheese, yogurt topped with berries, or fresh vegetables dipped in hummus.

You will notice that when you serve delicious and healthy foods, it will create discussion and people will really start to connect. Expect to receive lots of compliments about the great food and your thoughtfulness for keeping everyone's health in mind.


