Ontario Junior Hockey League announced Wednesday that Jordan Carroll of the Sudbury Cubs has been

he Northern named the 2011-12 recipient of the Carlo Cattarello Trophy, which is presented annually to the NOJHL's Most Valuable Player.

Heading into his club's final regular season game this evening vs. North Bay, the 20-yearold Sudbury product has been an offensive force during the entire 2011-12 campaign. Not only will he finish as the league's leading scorer he is also among the elite in the entire 133-team Canadian Junior Hockey League. After 49 games, while still having one game to play, Carroll leads all of the CJHL in goals scored with 69 and sits second overall in total points with 135, which includes 66

assists. The five-footnine, 180-pound Cub's forward has also been a model of consistency having only been held off the score sheet once all season. Carroll is currently riding an impressive 40-game point streak and has already shattered Sudbury team single season records for goals, assists and points. He also leads the league in shorthanded markers (9), shares top spot in power play efforts (18) and is tied for second in game-winners (7).

His offensive

output is the most the NOJHL has seen in 20 years when John Stos racked up 173 points for the Rayside Balfour Canadians in 1991-92 on 67 tallies and 106 helpers. That campaign two decades ago also marked the most goals any skater in the NOJHL has scored since Carroll has this season when Mike Dore lit the lamp 77 times in 44 games for Rayside Balfour.





REPORT FROM Queen's Park BY Mike Mantha

In the north, many of us come from generations of Miners. We all have family, friends and loved ones working in the industry. However nothing is more tragic than losing a loved one in a mining accident, especially if those accidents could possibly have been prevented.

On Wednesday, the United Steelworker local 6500 released the results of their investigations into the deaths of miners Jason Chenier. 35, and Jordan Fram, 26. Chenier and Fram died on the evening of June 8, 2011 when an uncontrolled torrent of wet ore material burst out of the number 7 ore pass at Vale Inco's Stobie mine

At a press conference at Queen's Park, United Steelworkers told the media that their local 6500 members had been complaining for weeks about problems in the

and buried them.

Mining Safety number 7 ore pass. However, management neglected to address their concerns, and

requests went unanswered.

Their 207-page report revealed that senior managers knew about the severity of the situation. They had been told on numerous occasions that the water accumulating in the area could be very hazardous when mixed with the rock and sand, and could trigger a blast of material down the ore

Management allowed two drain holes and continued dumping of "wet muck" into the ore passes; this led to temporary blockages. It was also revealed that Chenier had set up guardrails at different locations to prevent the passing of material into the ore pass and also to keep workers out of the area due to the pooled water. However we have been told that management directed the removal of these barricades at least three times.

We know that occasionally tragic accidents can happen; however, the United Steelworkers probe into the Brazilian-owned Vale Inco mine have made it clear that the company ignored safety precautions and failed to

enforce health and safety regulations which, according to USW, would have prevents these deaths.

After these disturbing revelations, Nickle-Belt MPP France Gélinas and I went into question period to demand some answers.

I requested that the Premier direct the Minister of Labour to conduct a full and public investigation into the causes of these fatalities so that tragedies like this can be prevented in future.

My colleague MPP France Gélinas called on the Attorney General to direct his Assistant Deputy Attorney General-Criminal Law to

determine whether charges under the Westray provisions of the Criminal Code of Canada should be laid against Vale-Inco officials.

Deaths like these are completely unacceptable. The USW investigation suggests that negligence and failure to adhere by basic health and safely regulations caused these unnecessary deaths. As Critic for Northern Development and Mines I am committed to ensuring that the Premier directs his Ministries into full and extensive inquiries into these and other deaths and mining safety in general so that these tragedies are never repeated.

Illegal activity in game preserve leads to fines

A Foleyet man has been fined \$1,385 for illegal hunting and fishing activities within the Chapleau Crown Game Preserve.

Wilfred Trochimchuk pleaded guilty to a number of offences, including possession of a firearm in the game preserve, operating an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) without a helmet, making a false statement to a conservation officer and possessing more than the allowed limit of

Wilfred Trochimchuk pleaded guilty as was fined \$250 for possession of a firearm in the game preserve, \$85 for operating an all-terrain vehicle without a helmet, \$750 for making a false statement to a conservation officer and \$300 for possessing four walleye over the limit.

Court heard that in October 2009. conservation officers met Trochimchuk in the Chapleau Crown Game Preserve, where hunting

is prohibited. He was in possession of a loaded sawed-off shotgun capable of harvesting moose and other big game, although he possessed an archery hunting tag for a bull moose. Trochimchuk said the shotgun was required for bear protection. He made false statements to officers regarding the location of his camp, from where he produced four walleye beyond the legal limit. The shotgun and all walleye were seized and later forfeited to the Crown.

Justice of the Peace Alex Spence heard the case in the Ontario Court of Justice, Timmins, on February 16, 2012.



Submitted by Robin Greer Myth Sea salt is natural so it's better for you than table salt. :THE TRUTH: Sea salt, just like kosher and gourmet salt, has about the same amount of sodium as table salt. It is not a healthier choice. Too much sodium can be harmful to your health. The differences between sea salt and table salt are taste, texture and how they are made. Table salt is mined from dried-up ancient salt lakes. Some table salts include

iodine, a nutrient that helps prevent thyroid disease. Sea salt is made by evaporating seawater and tastes different depending on where it's from. Whichever salt you choose, use less. For a flavour boost, sprinkle food with orange or lemon juice, garlic, herbs or spices.

Myth: "Cooking meals at home takes way too much time." THE TRUTH: Getting a healthy, home-cooked meal on the table doesn't take as much time as you think. Simple, nutritious foods can make tasty meals, and planning meals in advance lets you use your time wisely. For example, try making

"planned extras" (leftovers on purpose) that can be used for another meal, or make big batches of food on weekends, freeze small portions and defrost on nights when time is tight. Cooking at home doesn't mean never using convenience foods. Healthy versions of convenience foods, like pre-washed, readyto-eat vegetables or precut fresh meat skewers, can be time savers that help get meals to the table quickly.

Myth "Certain foods, like grapefruit, cabbage soup or celery, can burn fat and make you lose weight quickly." THE TRUTH: Sorry! There is no food that burns fat or makes you lose weight more quickly. Weight loss diets that focus on single foods, like grapefruit, cabbage soup or celery, are restrictive and lack nutrients needed for good health. It's true that when you eat only one type of food, like cabbage soup, you might eat less and take in fewer calories than you need and maybe lose weight at first. But in the end, these diets are boring, don't create healthy habits you can

stick with, and don't help with long-term weight loss. The best way to lose weight is to eat healthy foods in the right portions and be active.






