Chapleau Northern Pike Ice Fishing Derby remains strong after 10 successful years

The original group of volunteers who initiated the first Chapleau Northern Pike Ice Fishing Derby in 1996 probably never anticipated the level of success and longevity the annual event would have.

Celebrating its 10th anniversary this year, the Chapleau Northern Pike Ice Fishing Derby drew a large number of participants, and offered an impressive array of prizes that made many gasp in amazement.

The ice-fishing derby may no longer pass as a novelty in Chapleau, but the event still hasn't lost its luster as one of the year's most significant tourism activities for the area.

Last week's derby attracted 536 participants, up from the previous year's 510. The increase in numbers is likely attributed to the extra prizes awarded for the derby's 10th anniversary, as well as the change in the event from a two-day to a single-day program.

At any rate, a sure reason for the derby's success is the well-oiled organization in operations since its inception. The original committee (Paul McDonald, Graham Bertrand, André Montpellier, Ingo Weber, Howard Goheen, Marcel Paquette, Leo Morin and Bill Groves) set in motion a solid plan that withstood the test of time.

This year, the organizing committee can boast in having put together a derby that is described by some ice-fishing pundits as one of Northern Ontario's best. The members of the committee are Michael Levesque, Elizabeth "Pit" Michaud, Lorraine Lemieux, Roger Perreault, André Byham and Bill

Groves.

Although he tends to approach compliments with modesty and a hint of embarrassment, the leading hand throughout the derby's 10-year lifespan is none other than Bill Groves. His commitment and dedication to the event has been nothing short of extraordinary, braving challenging obstacles that had significant impact on tourism in our region like the Gulf War, SARS, the rise in the Canadian dollar against the American currency, unreliable weather, and first and foremost, the economic woes in the forest industry felt locally.

Of course other volunteers have also brought priceless contributions to the achievement of the 10 fish derbies. A heartfelt thank you goes out to all of the individuals who gave of themselves to help make the Chapleau Northern Pike Ice Fishing Derby a resounding success.

KORPELA, Oliver George

In loving memory of Oliver Korpela, 85 years, who passed quietly at his Hanmer home on February 19, 2006. Born in Nemegos, June 18, 1920, Oliver spent his youth at his father's logging camps in the Chapleau area before enlisting in the Royal Canadian Air Force. He was later attached to the RAF Bomber Command, Squadron 50, where he piloted his Lancaster bomber on many successful missions before being shot down over Holland. He worked closely with the Dutch Resistance for 7 months and escaped many close calls with the Germans. After the liberation of Holland he returned to the Chapleau area where he ran a number of successful lumber mills located in Island Lake, Kormak and Devon. The Island Lake sawmill was the site of Ontario's first wood chipper. Oliver has worn many hats; bomber captain, lumberman, horse rancher, bush pilot, and philanthropist. He continued to fly into his late 70's and was an active member of the Royal Canadian Legion. Finlandia Koti, a Sudbury Finnish Senior's complex, sits on the many acres Oliver donated and is within a short walk of his most recent donation, a cultivated wetland park, that bears his name, located on Second Avenue near Ramsey Lake. Beloved husband of Diane (Olivier) Korpela. Predeceased by father Charlie and mother Lepi (nee Asp) and by his first wife, Ina Korpela. Brother to Henry, Elmer, Viljo and Sulo (predeceased). Loving father of Sandra Korpela, Rick Korpela (wife Tuija), Michael Korpela, Jayne Korpela and Sarah Korpela. Grandfather of ten grandchildren including; Sade Lea (Eric), Karl, Tova and Heidi. Beloved stepfather to Lorrie Fera (Rob), Blain Morin (Carol) and Derek Morin (Cheryl). Funeral service was at St. Mathews Church in Sudbury on February 23rd followed by cremation. Notice to Truckers – 2006 Spring Load Restrictions

Under the *Highway Traffic Act*, the province enforces reduced load restrictions on trucks to protect Ontario's highways during spring thaw, when road damage is most likely to occur.

REDUCED LOAD LIMITS PERIOD

SCHEDULE 1 HIGHWAYS

Pursuant to the *Highway Traffic Act*, the Reduced Load Limit Period will begin and end for those designated parts of the King's Highways listed in Schedule 1 from March 1, 2006 to April 30, 2006, inclusive.

SCHEDULE 2 HIGHWAYS

Pursuant to the *Highway Traffic Act*, the Reduced Load Limit Period will begin and end for those designated parts of the King's Highways listed in Schedule 2 from March 1, 2006 to May 31, 2006, inclusive.




