Chapleau Cree Auto / Truck (C.C.A.T.) will commence operations Monday June 2, 2008, and will run 8:30 AM

4:30 PM (weekdays). After a highly successful trial testing period, Chapleau Cree First Nation will be holding the official

Grand Opening, on Saturday May 31, 2008, of its auto and light truck service and repair business. This occasion will also mark the launch of the garage's function as the area's authorized Kal Tire distributor.

Referring to this new commercial development, Chapleau Cree First Nation Chief, Keeter Corston, commented, "I think this new business is a great opportunity for Chapleau Cree First Nation and for vehicle

owners in the whole area. I'm optimistic about its success because I know the quality workmanship of the people we have working there, including our newly acquired mechanic, Allan Barsalou. All told, you just don't find better anywhere!"

Why is it innovative? Out of the physical and human resource capacity of its Public Works Garage, Chapleau Cree First Nation has been able to create a repair and service business,

accredited to do vehicle certifications, that is now officially ready to serve the full general public, with further physical plant expansion plans slated for the next 18 month period. This is an adaptation of the standard business incubation model.

How to avoid encounters with black bears while enjoying the outdoors

If you are a hiker, cyclist, jogger, berry picker or anyone who plans to spend some time in "bear country", it's important to know how bears behave and what to do if you encounter one. Bears are shy and usually avoid humans; often, you won't see a bear even if they are close by. Bears are smart, curious, powerful and potentially dangerous

and don't like to be startled. When enjoying the outdoors in bear country, you should:

- Make noise as you move through wooded areas especially in areas where background noise is high such as near streams. Singing, whistling or talking will alert bears to your presence giving them a chance to avoid you.
- Travel with others.
- Be aware of your surroundings:
 - Do not wear music headphones
 - Keep an eye out for signs of bears such as tracks, claw marks on trees, flipped over rocks or logs or fresh bear droppings.
- Carry and have readily accessible a whistle or an air horn, and bear pepper spray. Know how to use the spray – practise on a stationary object to get a feel for how the

canister sprays and to know its limitations.

- Consider carrying a long-handled axe, particularly if you are in "back country."
- Avoid strong fragrances that may cause a bear to be curious; put any food you are carrying in sealed containers in your pack.
- If you are out with a dog, control it; uncontrolled, untrained dogs may antagonize a bear and the bear could follow the dog back to you.
- Scan your surroundings especially while berry picking. Remember to rise slowly from your crouched position so you don't startle any nearby bears. They may not recognize you as human in a crouched position. If you encounter a bear:
 - Drop any food that you are carrying.
 - If the bear is not

paying any attention to you, slowly and quietly back away while watching the bear to make sure it is not following you. Do not approach the bear to get a better look.

- If the bear is aware of you, raise your arms to make yourself look as big as possible and speak in a firm but non-threatening voice while looking at the bear and backing away.
- Watch the bear to gauge its reaction to you. Generally, the noisier the bear is, the less dangerous it is. If a bear huffs, pops its jaws or stomps its paws on the ground, it wants you to back away and give it space.
- If the bear approaches you, be aggressive – use your whistle or air horn, yell, stand tall, wave your arms and throw objects.
- If a bear keeps advancing and is

getting close, use your bear pepper spray and anything else to threaten or distract the bear – bears will often first test to see if it is safe to approach you.

- Stand your ground – do not run or climb a tree. Bears can run and climb better and faster than humans.
- If the bear makes

contact, fight back with everything you have. If you are concerned, contact the local Ministry of Natural Resources office in the area you are going to be in to determine whether there have been any reports of bear encounters or conflicts.

Taste for caviar leads to high fines

NEWS May 13, 2008 Two Toronto men have been fined \$20,000 for fishing violations related to the illegal harvest of a sturgeon and the purchase and transport of sturgeon eggs. Sergiy Pak, 44, of Richmond Hill, pleaded guilty to unlawfully buying and transporting sturgeon eggs and was fined \$15,000. Roman Weig, 53, of Thornhill, pleaded guilty to fishing without a licence and unlawfully transporting sturgeon eggs; he was fined \$5,000. In addition to the fines, both men have been prohibited from possessing a fishing licence for one year and were placed on probation and must

not commit any similar violations for a period of two years. Court heard that on November 22, 2007, Pak and Weig were checked by a Conservation Officer while transporting two large sturgeon caught in Blind River. Weig did not have a valid fishing licence. During an inspection of Weig's vehicle, a cooler containing almost 18 pounds of fresh sturgeon eggs was found, which Pak admitted he had purchased. Justice of the Peace Pierre Leclerc heard the case in the Ontario Court of Justice, Sudbury, on May 13, 2008. To report a natural resource violation, call

In 2007, in the Sudbury & District Health Unit's service area, 22 per cent of the bites from dogs occurred to children 10 years of age or younger. Sometimes these dogs are strangers, but more often they are family pets or the pets of close relatives or friends. Children can avoid these encounters by following some simple rules when around animals.

- Do:
1. Always ask the owner's permission before petting a dog.
 2. Always approach dogs slowly and carefully.
 3. Stay away from stray dogs.
 4. Stay calm around

dogs. Don't scream. Stand still.

- Don't:
1. Don't make loud noises around dogs.
 2. Don't bother a dog while it is sleeping or eating.
 3. Never tease a dog.
 4. Never try to help a hurt dog; get an adult to help.

By teaching your child how to behave responsibly around dogs, you will reduce the chance that your child will be bitten, and you will also enhance the relationship they have with their dog.

In 2007 the Sudbury & District Health Unit investigated 266 animal bites or suspect rabid animal contacts. Human contact occurred in all of the

cases and resulted in 52 people being vaccinated with post-exposure prophylaxis treatment.

Rabies is a virus that is fatal if you are infected and not treated.

If you come in contact with, or are bitten by any animal, immediately wash the


wound with soap and water and get medical attention as soon as possible.

May is when we start spending more time outdoors, and chance encounters with neighbourhood pets and wild animals increase. It's also a time when we could come in contact with rabid animals. Rabies is always present in our wildlife and the possibility of a

domestic animal becoming infected cannot be overlooked.

"Cats and dogs in the Sudbury & District Health Unit area must be immunized against rabies and have a current certificate of vaccination to protect both you and your family," says Richard

**Canada must fight
for a seat at the
United Nations
Security Council,
says St. Denis**

Canada was a founding nation of the United Nations. It was a Canadian who wrote the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. A Prime Minister of this country, Lester B. Pearson, won the

Nobel Peace Prize for creating Peace-keeping. Canada led the battle for the International Criminal Court and the fight against land mines. Canada was a champion of multilateralism at the United Nations.

Since then, Canada remained a leader at the United Nations. Yet in two

years, Prime Minister Harper has diminished our place at the United Nations to a point where he is contemplating abandoning Canada's campaign for a seat at the Security Council in 2011 because he thinks Canada might lose.

Canada has in the past won election to the Security Council, the most powerful body at the United Nations, every ten years. In 2001, when Canada was still respected as a world leader, the previous Liberal government served notice that Canada would seek another two year term when the election is held in 2010.

Paul Heinbecker, who was Canada's ambassador to the United Nations from 2000 to 2004, was quoted in the

Globe and Mail recently saying that "it looks like it's going to be harder this time than last time" due to "the cumulative effect of change in Canadian policies, including Middle East votes, our climate change policy, and the policy of aid concentration, which lessens the connections with Canada of a large number of countries."

Canada has had a seat more often than any other country except for the permanent members. Whenever Canada has asked for its place, it has been given a place. The Prime Minister seems to be afraid that for the first time, our place will be denied at the Security Council.

It is an embarrassment that the Conservative government led by Stephen Harper has diminished

Canada's international reputation to the degree that, for the first time, Canada may not be able to get a seat at the Security Council. Canadians expect and deserve more from their Prime Minister and incompetent Minister of Foreign

Affairs Maxime Bernier. The Conservatives need to regroup and start to work towards rebuilding Canada's international reputation, a reputation that was well respected before Mr. Harper became Prime Minister.

**Police Officers
keeping Ontario safe.**

Throughout the year we reflect and recognize those who affect our lives in various ways. Our last report focused on Nurses Week. But May 11-17th was also Police Week, a special time for us to reflect upon and thank our officers for the dedication and courage they demonstrate to protect us.

Every day, thousands of men and women put their lives on the line to ensure our personal safety. Every day, they go to work, leaving their families at home so they can protect ours. Whether they are dealing with threats

that are new or growing, like Internet predators, drugs, grow-ops, guns and gangs, or problems they have faced for years, like dangerous offenders, youth crime and the cycle of domestic violence — police officers are working to make Ontarians safer.

Policing is dangerous work that takes a special commitment. Sometimes our officers make the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty — a tragedy which affects us all. Our government has always been committed to helping the police services across Ontario make this province a safer place.

Our govern-

ment invested over \$37 million to put 1,000 new officers onto Ontario's streets. We also continue to fund the previous government's 1,000 officers program, because we believe in the importance of the role of police officers in protecting you and your neighbours. Our government also increased the Ontario Provincial Police complement by another 200 officers, the largest increase in over a decade.

To help our officers, we unveiled the Guns and Gangs program, a \$68 million investment to help police and prosecutors rid our streets of guns and gangs. Our government invested \$1.5 million in the Crystal Meth Elimination Project, a team of specialized officers who provide expertise to the OPP Drug Enforcement team. We've also dedicated 149 new officers to fight organized crime, including grow-ops

and meth labs.

Since 2004, our government has invested \$1 million each year in the OPP's Child Pornography section. We have built upon this investment with an additional \$5 million over five years to combat Internet crimes against children.

But fighting crime is about more than just investments. As your local MPP, I have been involved in the passing of new laws that reinforce the efforts of our officers. Our government has passed a law which requires hospital personnel report gun shot wounds to police, to help identify possible victims or perpetrators of crime. We have passed the Mandatory Blood Testing Act, which allows police officers and victims of crime find out quickly if they have been infected by certain viruses while carrying out their duties.

And in 2008, our government amended Christopher's Law to make the Sex Offenders Registry more effective. It requires a wider group of sex offenders be registered, including those on intermittent sentences and those on bail awaiting appeal. It also provides police with more tools to track down these offenders. This registry is accessed over 400 times a day by police forces across Ontario.

Our government is committed to helping Ontario's police officers make this province safer for all of us. This Police Week, I urge you, when you see a police officer, take a moment to thank them for what they do. It is the sacrifices that they make, that ensures the security that we enjoy.
