ESC Trillium Coyotes claim soccer title

On May 16 and 17, Chapleau's École secondaire Trillium girls' soccer team capped off a successful season at the North Shore Secondary School Athletic Association (NSSSAA) championship tournament in Wawa. Stellar play by the team enabled the Coyotes to claim its first soccer banner.

The Coyotes' strong defensive game and scoring skills served ESC Trillium well during the tournament. The team won all five of its qualifying games,

blanking their opponents from L'Orée des Bois (Dubreuilville), ÉS Saint-Joseph (Wawa), Manitouwadge, Hornepayne and Michipicoten. In the finals, Trillium defeated Marathon 3-0 and ES Saint-Joseph 1-0 before being edged 1-0 by Lake Superior. In the championship game, however, the Trillium Coyotes were once again victorious, taking the crown by beating the team from Lake Superior by a score of 1-0 in a shootout.

As NSSSAA champions, the ESC Trillium Coyotes will host the NorWOSSA regional champion Rainy River Owls on May 25 and 26. The winner of that game will wear the regional crown and compete in the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations championships.

Chapleau water tank buckles inward creating fear of collapse before it could be properly demolished in 1977

Chapleau Moments

When the old water tank buckled inwards in April 1977, it created quite a scare for Chapleau citizens who were justifiably concerned that the landmark might completely collapse before it could be properly demolished.

The Chapleau Sentinel reported that it was brought to my attention as reeve that dents had appeared in the water tank that was no longer used after the opening of the new water treatment plant, so it sat empty on the hill bounded by Monk, Ash and Elgin streets. Had it completely collapsed, the damage would have been devastating.

I recall calling Councillor Ernie Gilbert, the chair of the public works commit-

tee, who I am positive was on duty as a councillor 24/7, and off we went to survey the situation.

There was no doubt we had a potentially serious situation. At the time, engineers from SWR Engineering Ltd. were in Chapleau doing preparatory work on the Lisgar Street extension, so we contacted them for a professional opinion. It was decided pretty quickly that the tank in its condition presented a potential danger and immediate measures must be taken to ensure the safety of citizens. The municipal solicitor agreed.

The Chapleau Sentinel reported that Monk, Ash and Elgin streets were closed to traffic and the pedes-

trian overpass, located right beside the water tank was also closed.

With the cooperation of Bourgeault Bus Lines a bus service was introduced. Residents in the immediate area as well as the CPR were advised of the situation. To the best of my memory nobody was evacuated.

As the demolition was the responsibility of the Ministry of the Environment, it was contacted and within a day consulting engineers employed by the ministry and the contractor responsible for the demolition were in Chapleau.

They attached wires to the tank to ensure its stability and advised the municipality that the immediate danger of collapse had passed and demolition would begin the next week. However, citizens were warned to be extremely careful when walking or driving in the area of the water tank while

demolition was underway.

All went well during the demolition, and the crisis passed. In an interview with The Sentinel, I said that "I was very pleased with the excellent cooperation" received from everyone. "The main thing was to ensure the safety of the citizens of Chapleau and that required prompt action. There was no way of knowing for sure if the tank would collapse and when the possibility of danger existed, the best thing to do was to take every precaution".

So, what caused it to buckle?

The engineers were not positive but believed that because it buckled inwards, a large piece of ice on top of the inside of the tank dropping to the bottom forced air out and not enough returned to replace it, caused the buckling.

After reading the news reports of the crisis some 35 years later, I recall, as I am sure most Chapleau citizens did at the time, asking myself several times a day, "What if it collapses?" But it didn't and I also recalled another use for the water tank starting in the 1950s.

As Chapleau grew so did its police department and it had one patrol car. In the evening the two officers on duty, usually Jim Collings and Don Houghton,

were not able to receive telephone calls, so it was decided to put a red light on top of the water tank. When someone called the police it would turn on and the officers would go to the Town Hall to get the message.

Now, some young people liked to come down the old overhead bridge in their cars onto Monk

Street and speed to Bucciarelli Beach, but the police often set up a speed trap which slowed them down. The solution was to have someone phone the police, the red light would go on and as soon as the officers arrived at the Town Hall, the Monk Street Speedway would open. Or so I was told. Business Summary – April 2012

The Superior East Community Futures Development Corporation (SECFDC) is a non-profit organization focusing on small business development and regional economic development. The corporation has been serving the Superior East region for over twenty years. Superior East is directed by a volunteer Board of Directors consisting of individuals representing the region. We welcome the newest

addition to the Board – Mr. Earle Freeborn of Chapleau.

At the most recent meeting of the SECFDC Board of Directors, three loans were approved totalling \$450,000. These loans leveraged \$277,750 and created or maintained 6 full-time, 5 part-time and 4 seasonal jobs. Also during the course of the meeting, the Board approved one Local Initiatives (LIF) application totalling \$3,500 which will

leverage \$220,300 in funding from community partners. The recipient of the LIF contribution was the Algoma Workforce Investment Committee.

The SECFDC loan fund can provide loans up to \$150,000 for new or existing businesses for purposes such as start ups, expansions, equipment purchases, business purchases or working capital. For existing businesses, the Flex Loan program offers loans up to \$10,000 for small projects that can be approved within a couple of days. The Local Initiatives Fund offers non-repayable contributions to non-profit organizations of up to \$3,500 for their community economic development projects.

Why is there a strike at CP Rail?

A Canada wide legal strike at Canadian Pacific Railways was initiated by the union effective May 23, 2012. According to the union the following are a few examples of why this strike is happening.

CP wants:

- to reduce future pension income for active employees; the amounts vary by income, but are significant and are up to 40%.
- to devalue past pensionable service of Unionized employees.
- to reduce Retirement Health Care benefits and eliminate benefits at age 65. A reduction of over \$20,000.00 per member.:
- CP demands represent excessive concessions to work rules, such as working 12 hours without rest, working double subdivisions, raising the 3800 monthly mileage maximum, extending Road Switcher limits to 50 miles, and no wage increase for 2012.
- CP refuses to address the fatigue management proposals, refuses to address adequate time off work to recover from the effects of fatigue, and refuses to address the problems related to earned days off.
- CP refuses to address Pool Regulation language, affecting earning ability and stability.
- CP refuses to address their own sharp practice regarding seniority freeze to temporary managers, and insists their own DB Pension benefits must continue to escalate and they must receive more.

Chapleau Recycles! The Township's Green Initiatives

Council has recently passed resolutions to become an Ontario Electronic Stewardship (OES) collector and to participate in a battery recycling program.

Return of OES Program

The success from the OES "Recycle Your Electronics" promotional event held in June 2011 demonstrated the need for this program. Chapleauites can be

proud that nearly 4 tonnes of e-waste was diverted from our landfill and recycled.

In the coming weeks, a permanent collection site will be located at the Chapleau Municipal Landfill site. Here, residents will be able to drop-off their electronic waste to be recycled.

Did you know?
There are 44 different types of home, office and portable electronics that are accepted. For a list of accepted

items, go to www.recycleyourelectronics.ca

Items dropped off will not be reused. However, we recommend that you remove and erase all data from computers and laptops, SIM cards and other storage devices in cell phones, digital cameras or digital printers prior to drop off.

Introducing Battery Recycling

The Township of Chapleau now

recycles Single Use Alkaline and Rechargeable Batteries through the Battery Recycling program with Stewardship Ontario and Raw Materials Company. Residents can drop their batteries off at the Civic Centre as well as the Chapleau Energy Services Corporation.

Batteries Accepted: Batteries found in household items such as toys, remote controls, cameras, laptops, etc. are accepted, including

- Nickel Metal Hydride
- Silver Zinc (Silver Oxide)
- Alkaline
- Nickel Cadmium
- Mercury Oxide

- Lithium Ion
- Lithium Cells

Vehicle Batteries are NOT ACCEPTED

Old Tires, Metals and More


Although Chapleau doesn't have the typical "Blue Box Program", the Township does have several green initiatives. These include being a registered collector with the Ontario Tire Stewardship, the recycling of metals from the "scrap metal" pile at the municipal landfill site, and the burning of "clean wood" at the landfill site. Chapleau Energy Services Corporation

is the collection depot for aluminum cans.

These initiatives all contribute to the betterment of our community and our environment. Little things can soon add up to make a big difference.
