

Representatives from the Township of Chapleau attended a FONOM conference this p as t week in Mindemoya, Manitoulin Island. FONOM, the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities, is held every year in May, where members of



Northern Ontario municipalities meet with Ministers from a number of Ontario ministries to discuss a variety of topics of interest.

Mayor Earle Freeborn and Deputy-Mayor Keith (Buddy) Swanson attended the event, held this year from May 5 to 7. According to Mayor Freeborn: this is an excellent opportunity for Municipal leaders to meet and discuss common issues in the North, and learn of best practices that were implement in other communities".

Some topics that were entertained during

the conference include gas rates for Northern Ontario, brainstorm on possible health breaks, solutions for dealing with insurance rates, opportunities in the forestry and mining sectors, municipal financial management, to name a few.

"Generally, these types of conferences help our provincial politicians become better aware of our regional issues, and assist them in finding possible solutions for current problems and challenges", concludes Mayor Freeborn.

PLANNING ACT, R.S.O. 1990 NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF A **ZONING BY-LAW BY THE TOWNSHIP OF CHAPLEAU**

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Township of Chapleau passed By-law 2004-17 on the 14th day of April 2004, under Section 34 of Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the by-law by filing with the CAO of the Township of Chapleau not later that the 1st day of June 2004, a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the by-law and the reasons in support of the objection.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a zoning by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF BY-LAW 2004-17 By-law 2004-17 is a by-law to amend By-law 89-19 the Comprehensive Zoning By-law for the Township of Chapleau. The purpose and effect of Bv-law 2004-17 is to rezone the lands described below from Institutional (I) to Residential Two (R-2). This change will permit the entire building located at 26 Pine Street West to be utilized as a

A Successful Third Year for the Chapleau Learning Centre



The Chapleau Learning Centre, situated in the annex to the Public School, 24 Pine Street, has just completed its third successful year of operation. This past year, the Centre has operated in partnership with the Algoma District School Board and is funded by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU).

Instructor/Manager, Janet Hazen, reports that Chapleau Learning Centre has served over 30 learners this past year from September to the present. The Centre offers basic literacy and numeracy training, as well as computer skills and employment readiness training.

Through a Human Resources Skills Development Canada (HRSDC) Job Creation Partnership program, in collaboration with Literacy Network Northeast and Chapleau Learning Centre, Marilyne Gagnon Doyles uccessfully

participated in a Workforce Skills Training Research project.

She identified the employment needs of adult learners and the labour market needs of the region, focusing on the Chapleau area. Through contact with local employers, Marilyne developed job profiles and relevant learning activities to enhance the delivery of workforce specific literacy training for adults.

NAFTA Panel delivers significant victory to Canada on softwood lumber

The Canadian softwood lumber Panel has once again rejected all of will be difficult for the ITC to do the reasons that the U.S. International Trade Commission (ITC) gave in reaching its finding that imports from Canada threatened the US lumber industry. Given the Panel's powerful and unanimous rejection of the ITC's key findings, it

anything but finally accept that the only conclusion it can reach is that Canada's softwood lumber exports pose no trade threat to the U.S. industry. This will bring the case to a close with the complete revocation of the antidumping and countervailing

duty orders. The Panel has given the ITC 21 days to issue a new decision consistent with the Panel's rulings. The Canadian Lumber Trade Alliance worked together to present a joint submission to the NAFTA Panel.



- Your injuries and the damage to the car you were in.Any apparent injuries to others
- involved in the accident.

- The company name and the municipal licence number on the tow truck, if applicable.
- What happens next?

Once your claim is reported, the claims adjuster assigned to your file will contact you. In some cases the adjuster will want to meet with you in person, in other cases the entire claim will be handled over the telephone.

Your adjuster will determine how much of your claim is covered by your insurance policy, explain the coverage it provides, and help guide you through the entire claims process. Be sure to ask your claims adjuster about anything you don't understand




