How Chapleau voted

n October 14th Canadians reelected Stephen Harper to another minority government in Canada's 40th general election.

The following are the results from the Chapleau polls obtained from Elections Canada.

Carol Hughes of the NDP gained the most votes with a total of 364. Close second was Brent St.Denis with a total of 346 votes. In third,

Conservative candidate Blair Armstrong came in with 182 votes and Green Party candidate Lindsay Killen came in with a disappointing 30 votes and a total of 7 ballots were rejected.

Of the 2334 eligible voters in Chapleau, 929 opted to mark their ballot and exercise their right to vote, a mere 38.8%.

At a point in our Canadian history, voting was a privilege held by a select group of men. Over the years women and minority groups including prisoners gained the right to vote. Hard fought debates and demonstrations led to the attainment of these rights.

The lack of participation of Canadian citizens in our basic democratic right to vote was again evident in this last election.

Theoretically 1,405 people in Chapleau will abstain from complaining about their government, their taxes and



Upgrade Sultan road as route to Wawa

Most of the talk
about a bypass of Sault
Ste. Marie has centred,
of course, on the
connecting up of the
new four-lane highway
with Second Line. But
there is actually another
bypass being sought by
some that would bypass
the entire Sault area.

It is a route several hundred kilometres northeast of here that runs from Highway 129, the link between Chapleau and Thessalon, through the village of Sultan to Highway 144, the link between Timmins and Sudbury.

It is a connection that has long been pushed by Mayor Earle J. Freeborn, mayor of the township of Chapleau. The mayor is naturally looking to the benefits it would bring Chapleau, but from an outsider's perspective, it also would seem to

have merit in-that it would shorten the route between Sudbury and Wawa and undoubtedly; considering the more level terrain, be safer.

I received an anonymous letter in early summer from someone who claimed to be a Crown employee suggesting that, rather than spending money to realign the dangerous Montreal River Hill, the Ministry of Transportation should look at upgrading to ministry standard the gravelled industrialroad, owned and maintained by Domtar Inc., which runs from Sultan to Highway 144.

"All the public hearings and consultations for realignment of the hill won't keep the highway open any more days although it could result in fewer accidents at the bottom of the hill," the writer said.

"This hill is only one of a number that trucks have problems on, namely the Mile Hill, Agawa Hill, Doc Craig, Red Rock and Old Woman. Will the MTO have studies to remedy the problems at all the other locations?"

The letter

disappeared on my desk, as so many things do, for several months but when it reappeared in a cleanup, I contacted Mayor Freeborn. He forwarded me a package that had been presented to Rick Bartolucci, then minister of Northern Development and Mines, in 2004, saying that although dated the argument it puts forward, which was supported by several communities along the north shore of Lake Superior, is still relevant.

I found the concept interesting but knew there was no way I could write a word on it without seeing the road for myself so I climbed into my car at 8 a.m. on a Sunday to do just that, completing the 850-kilometre round trip in nine hours with a stop only for gas.

Highway 667 runs from 129 into the village-of Sultan. It is paved, wide, fiat and fairly straight for almost the full 37 kilometres. At Sultan, I picked up the Domtar in dustrial road, stopping to read the sign, which is in both English and French, that said:"Warning. Potentially hazardous

road conditions back. Logging operations ongoing 24 hours. Use at your own risk."

The speed limit was posted at 70 km/h the entire 80-kilometre distance to Highway 144.

I found the road basically good, the gravel mainly hardpacked, something I am told is not always the case. Also, as I was travelling in mid-October, I missed the summer's dust but on this day there was hardly any traffic

nyway.

There naturally are curves and also small hills, but this has more of a mini roller coaster effect than anything else. There were two one-lane bridges.

My assessment, which probably won't curry favour with any commercial establishment in the Sault that could see a loss of business, is that this is a project worth looking at.



Has Adoption Touched Your Life?

If you were involved in an adoption in Ontario, you need to know about an important change to your information and privacy rights.

Effective June 1, 2009, Ontario adoption records will be opened. This means adopted adults and birth parents will be given access to identifying information from birth records and adoption orders.

If the adoption order was made before September 1, 2008, adopted adults and birth parents can file a disclosure veto to prevent the release of the information.

If you want your identifying information to be kept private, you should file a disclosure veto before June 1, 2009.

born estimates the route would cut off 100 kilometres and 1 1/2 hours on a trip from Sudbury to Wawa.

To get a full picture of what this might mean for traffic between Toronto and Thunder Bay, I calculated the distances using the two routes in play now, Highway 11 to the north and the combination of Highways 400, 69 and 17 to the south, as well as the route through Sultan Freeborn is pushing.

Using a map of Ontario, I calculated the distance between Toronto and Thunder Bay to be 1,455 kilometres using the northern route, 1,392 going through the Sault and 1,302 going through Sultan.

Gordan Rennie, regional issues adviser with the MOT. told me it was estimated that "339 trucks travel between Toronto and Thunder Bay each day, with 66 per cent using Highway 17 and 34 per cent using Highway 11."

Rennie said traffic on the industrial road out of Sultan, to which the ministry contributes about \$200,000 each year toward maintenance in exchange for public access, averages less than 400 vehicles a day, including industrial trucks.

"Given the low traffic volumes, it is not a priority to transfer into the provincial highway network at this time," he said. "We have worked with Domtar Inc. over the past few years to upgrade sections of the road to ensure safe passage for the public. This year the ministry partnered with Domtar to resurface 15 kilometres of the Sultan industrial road. As well, several culverts were replaced and brushing was completed to improve sightlines.

"The ministry's priority continues to be the rehabilitation

and maintenance of existing highways and the expansion of key provincial corridors, such as Highway 11 south of North Bay, Highway 69 south of Sudbury and Highway 17 east of Sault Ste. Marie."

Of the Montreal River hill realignment, he said the project is a long-term planning study and construction is not imminent since a project of this scope could cost tens of millions of dollars.

In regard to the Sultan industrial road, other centres supporting its upgrading to ministry standard as a priority item for the government are Sudbury, Marathon, Manitouwadge, Terrace Bay, Schreiber, White River, Dubreuilville, Hornepayne and the Township of Michipicoten (Wawa). It also has the support of the Ontario Trucking Association, the Thunder Bay District Municipal League, the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities and the Sudbury Chamber of Commerce.

Domtar itself said in a letter back in 2000 that it was "prepared to participate in discussions to seek mutual benefits for the Chapleau community, the people of Ontario and Domtar Inc."

Mike Brown, MPP for Algoma-Manitoulin, didn't get back to me as to where he stands on the issue but Peter Denley, NDP candidate in the riding in the recent provincial election, said Floyd Laughren campaigned on this issue for the NDP in 1990 but when the party came to power he didn't deliver.

"It has hurt us in Chapleau ever since," Denley said, adding that anything that can cut gasoline costs in the north is worth it.

Upgrading the Sultan industrial road to ministry standard would bring savings in kilometres, time and money and provide greater safety in that it is basically a level road that would take some of the pressure off Highway 17 through Sault Ste. Marie.

As a result, although I would like to see the Montreal River Hill realignment eventually come about, I would suggest the ministry give preference to the upgrading of the road out of Sultan, which would be a much better route for truck traffic.


