Stacy Roberts will be working full-

time at the Chapleau Medical Centre. She will be working in collaboration with Dr. Huggins and locum physicians. She will also work in partnership with the healthcare team at Services de sante de Chapleau Health Services and other community health care providers including Sudbury District Health Unit, Turning Point and the Chapleau Diabetes Education Program to name a few.

Nurse Practitioners (NPs) are RNs with advanced university education and decision-making skills in assessment, diagnosis and healthcare management. NPs offer a variety of health care services including the ability to diagnose and treat minor illness and/or injuries such as ear infections, perform annual physical checkups, routine prenatal check-up, well baby exam, update immunizations, order and interpret diagnostic tests including x-rays, ultrasounds, PAP tests and mammograms,

write prescriptions, provide counselling and education to promote healthy living, provide treatments and/or procedures, and make referrals to family physicians, specialists and other health professionals

Originally from Longlac, Roberts obtained her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Lakehead University in Thunder Bay. She worked in Geraldton, Red Lake and Ear Falls before returning to school to pursue her Primary

Health Care Nurse Practitioner Certificate from COUPN (Council of Ontario University Programs in Nursing)-Lakehead site. Stacy has worked as a Nurse Practitioner for the past two years at the Wawa Family Health Team in Wawa. She has recently relocated to Chapleau with her husband Steve who works at Tembec.
