period in Duncannon Lake and transferred in oxygenated tanks to Kilpatrick Lake where they were released. A total of 78 walleye were transferred to their new home. It is hoped that the walleye will spawn in the spring and that a thriving walleye population in a lake where none had previously existed will be the end result of the project. Ironically Duncannon

Lake was stocked with walleye over 10 years ago and is now the donor lake for several live walleye transfers in the area. Trap nets catch fish unharmed where they are measured, weighed and tagged prior to being released. Many other non-targeted species are caught including northern pike, lake whitefish and suckers which are released unharmed.

The Oddfellows have been involved in these types of projects for almost 12 years including the stocking of Duncannon and Gale Lakes. Some other projects that they have done include building and erecting pine marten nest boxes, wild rice planting and the planting of small game forage foods such as white clover.

The funding for these projects is made possible by the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources Community Fisheries and Wildlife Involvement Projects or commonly referred to as CFWIP. These are available to all service groups, clubs, organizations and individuals by application.

The Oddfellows are planning on transferring an additional 80 walleye next year into Kilpatrick Lake to complete the project. Both the MNR and the Oddfellows would like the public's cooperation in live releasing any walleye caught while angling on Kilpatrick Lake until a viable fishery is established.

NDP platform will devastate Northern Ontario

Elliot lake -The NDP platform, pushed out the door on a Sundayy afternoon, offers little more to Northern Ontarians than job-killing taxes on local businesses, Brent St. Denis said today.

"At a time when our industries are barely keeping their heads above water, Jack Layton is proposing to hit employers here in Northern Ontario with a \$50-billion tax hike," said St Denis.

He said the NDP plan to dramatically increase taxes on all business by \$50 billion would cause extensive job losses and hammer an already struggling economy. Put safety first during moose hunt

The Ministry of Natural Resources Northeast Region will be conducting heightened enforcement activity this fall. In particular, from October 11-25 during the regular gun season for moose conservation officers will be checking hunters regarding hunter orange requirements and safe use of firearms. Regular gun season for moose generally opens on October 11 in

the Northeast Region resulting in medical for resident hunters. treatment by a

Fines range from \$100 to \$250 for offences involving these matters. In more serious cases, offenders could face fines of up to \$25,000 or imprisonment, or both.

To ensure a safe and lawful hunt, hunters are reminded of the following:

·All hunters must wear solid hunter orange clothing (minimum of 400 sq. inches) and a hunter orange cap, except during a "bows-only" season. Mesh type construction vests are not acceptable.

·All persons in possession of a firearm for the purpose of hunting should not handle or discharge it or cause it to be handled or discharged without due care for persons or property.

Any hunting injury caused by the discharge of a firearm

treatment by a physician must be reported to a conservation officer.

If you are in an area

inhabited by wildlife or on the way to or from an area inhabited by wildlife, you cannot have a loaded firearm in a vehicle, motor-boat, or aircraft. It is illegal to discharge a firearm from any of these modes of transportation.

·You cannot shoot from, down or across a public road.

·You may not have in

your possession, in an area usually inhabited by wildlife ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour after sunset, a firearm unless it is encased and unloaded.

Under the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act, a firearm includes air guns, bows and crossbows, along with traditional rifles and shotguns. A firearm is considered loaded if there is a cartridge in the chamber or a magazine that is attached to the firearm. Bows, crossbows, and

muzzleloaders have various definitions of 'loaded'.

Conservation officers may also enforce Small Vessel Regulations and sections of the Liquor Licence Act. Anglers and hunters are reminded that alcohol affects the ability to safely handle firearms and motorized vehicles or vessels and increases the risk of exposure while in the outdoors


