Pizza Hut/KFC was sold on May 22nd to Rick Smith and Elaine Marte, a local couple.

In 1978 as Syd's auto mechanic's licence was still literally "in the mail" the opportunity of purchasing the Service Station from Gulf Canada arose. The young couple jumped at the chance and have never looked back.

Then on a Sunday afternoon in 1982, Syd received a call from Mr. Dick Hoath asking him if he would be interested in purchasing his Shell Bulk Plant, as he wanted to retire. Syd

said he'd talk it over with his wife Gail, and by 4:00 P.M. that day, it was agreed that they would be involved in owning a bulk plant. The O'Rileys operated the bulk plant until 1995. Plans to build a new bulk plant were cut short by an offer to purchase and subsequent sale to the McDougall family of Sault Ste. Marie.

In 1989 the O'Rileys purchased Chapleau Auto Parts and Small Engines from Matt and Lise Castonguay. They added on to the Service Station to accom-modate the auto parts and continued operating from this site until 1996 when increased business dictated larger premises for the parts business.

The building on Monk Street which once housed Frankow's Rentals was purchased and completely refurbished to accommodate the ever expanding parts business.

In order to fill the void left by the move Gail decided to open a Coffee and Donut Shop which she christened Miss Muggins and they

brought in the first fast food franchise in Chapleau when they opened Pizza Hut KFC Express.

It was during the construction of the Pizza Hut KFC express that the O'Rileys were approached by the Martel Family to sell the Auto Parts Syd and Business. Gail agreed to sell the business thinking that they had enough to keep them busy with Syd's and the new Miss Muggins, Pizza Hut KFC Franchise.

Syd and Gail remember with a laugh the opening of the Pizza Hut KFC Express. The Regional Director from Pizza Hut was in town for the opening and advised against advertising the opening as he stated "word of mouth" would get the word out. Did it ever! "We opened for the supper hour on March 27th. 1997. The lineup continued out the door, the phone rang off the hook and fifteen newly trained employees worked feverishly to keep up with the orders." says Gail O'Riley. "Syd looked at the clock and four hours had passed by as if it had been fifteen minutes"she

Although selling the business has been bittersweet, retirement beckoned, and Syd and Gail know they have left the business in good and capable hands.

"Throughout the past thirty years, we have been privileged to have made many friends and customers that always supported us in our many endeavours" O'Riley says. "It is gratifying to see that Elaine and Rick are receiving the same support that we always be-nefitted from." she adds.

Elaine and Rick are pleased to be able to take over such a well established business. Gail and Syd have worked hard over the years to grow this business and it is a compliment to them and the staff that work there. "These are some big shoes to fill and we only hope that we can continue to do the business justice." says Rick Smith.

The new owners will be hosting a Grand Opening in the very near future in conjunction with a Customer appreciation day. Gail and Syd will be on hand to help. Watch for more details on this exciting day in this edition of the Express.





Is a new or used car for you?

(NC)—New or used that's the question that is constantly put to the pros. Consider these tips if you decide to go the route of purchasing.

Market Favours New

Given the strong Canadian dollar, now is a great time to buy a new car, according to Chartered Accountant Charles Seguin, president, Triaveluin Retail Advisors in Aurora.

"The market is changing daily, with incentives including low or even no interest, revamped base-price strategies and competitive dealer reductions. Canadian cars will always be more expensive than U.S. cars due to environmental and safety rules, but the old price differential has been greatly reduced on most models."

Used Cars?

While used cars have advantages and disadvantages, the main advantage is a better price. "Plus you do not pay GST on a private sale," says Chartered Accountant Anil Chawla, Deloitte & Touche LLP in Mississauga. "Buying a car that is six to nine months old can save on the purchase price – new cars depreciate as much as 30 per cent in the first year.

"While you pay less upfront, your operating and maintenance costs are higher, and many used cars don't have warranties or the newer safety features. You don't know what's under the hood, so ask two key questions: Who has driven it? Has it been in an accident? The vendor should disclose the car's history in writing, especially with a private sale. Also ask to have the repair log history, problems and service record."

If you are buying a used car, Seguin advises using either a car dealer with older models on the lot, or a member of the Used Car Dealers Association of Ontario (http://www.ucda .org/).

Green, Safe and Loaded

Seguin says a big advantage of a new

showing the car's car is greater fuel efficiency and emissions control, which is now available on all new cars from small compacts to SUVs. Add upgraded safety features like air bags and electronic traction control, and a new car starts to justify its cost, especially if you plan to drive it for several years. You'll see few or no repair costs over the first two years and lots of toys

like TV screens in mini vans to keep the kids happy.

"Pride of ownership and confidence come with a new car," adds Chawla. "It can be satisfying to know that no one else has driven

Do Your Homework

Whether it's a new or used car, you're still spending a lot of money, so consider other important

factors such as usage, family safety and dependability, as well as price.

Chawla advises checking Consumer Reports for new and used cars. And make sure you test-drive the car first. When buying a brand new model, be aware that its performance and track record are largely unknown – it may take three or four years to correct any

glitches. To save costs, investigate buying a demonstration model from your dealer, which has been driven by a senior employee and has about 10,000 km on it.



Debunking the four myths of healthy eating for kids

(NC)—As a concerned parent, you want to give your kids the healthiest foods possible. Good for you. But be warned. There are some myths associated with kids and healthy eating that should concern you. Here are four of them: Myth #1: Kids should be on a low-fat diet.

Truth: Children need a healthy balanced diet that includes healthy fats because their developing brains require these elements to grow properly. Healthy fats include unsaturated fat found in olive oil, peanut oil, canola oil, tuna, and salmon plus a reasonable level of saturated fats in meat, cheese, whole milk and butter. Avoid trans fats, a.k.a. "hydrogenated" o r " p a r t i a l l y hydrogenated" fats. Not sure if a product contains these industrial fats? Just check the label before you buy.
Myth #2: Low-fat

foods have fewer calories.

Truth: Sometimes this is true. But other times the removed fat is replaced by other ingredients that can have as many calories as the fat they replaced, or even more. Again, check the product label to avoid getting more calories than you bargained for from low-fat foods.

Myth #3: Fruit juice is always the best choice. Truth: 100 per cent fruit juices are part of a healthy diet, but be warned that they can pack a high sugar punch, especially orange and apple juice. Many nutritionists recommend limiting the amount of juice you drink or diluting the sweetness with water. So enjoy juice in moderation, but also be sure to drink lots of water and milk

Myth #4: Kids don't

like healthy foods.

Truth: "Hungry kids eat what is closest and easiest to consume. 





- Unsealed wall openings and cracks.

Your hardware store or renovation centre carries weatherstripping adapted to each of these sources. You would do well to install weatherstripping before winter, since its installation will be easier and more efficient before the cold hits.

How to detect air leaks? To detect air leaks in your home, you could hire a contractor or opt for a simple, yet effective method: do the job yourself using the flicker test. This test consists in slowly moving a smoke pen where air leaks are most likely to be, that is, around doors and windows as well as along the edge of walls, floors and ceilings. The

smoke will stir when an flexibility of weatherair leak is present.

An indispensable tool, the Comfort Plus smoke pen makes it possible to detect air leaks quickly and efficiently. "Unlike a candle or incense stick, the smoke pen not only avoids possible wax or ash messes, but is much safer," said François Gagné of RCR International inc., a recognized pioneer in the insulation of doors and windows. "It releases a steady stream of smoke for approximately 30 minutes, allowing you to conduct 60 thirtysecond smoke tests. It contains no hazardous or corrosive substances."

The smoke pen is an efficient tool for detecting air leaks as well as for testing smoke detectors, ventilation systems, fireplaces and chimneys.

You will be surprised by how many places need to be sealed. Often, tiny, seemingly innocuous openings can cause significant increases in energy costs.

As well, check the quality and stripping around door and window frames. Replace it when it shows signs of wear using an appropriate product. To check the airtightness of your garage door, turn on the light at night or use a flashlight, then close the door and inspect it from the outside. If you spot light around the door, you've got air leaks.

For a healthy environment these

small measures will make it possible for you to reduce your energy consumption and, by the same token, your costs while ensuring the comfort of your home. And remember, it's the sum total of all our individual actions, as modest as they might be, that yields impressive results on a collective scale.
