

that I cannot fathom, Moore's agent and the publishers he approached saw little merit in this fascinating tale. John and Ruth

was never published

until 2008. For reasons

checked out a number of locations along the Algoma Central and Canadian Pacific Railways. In the winter of 1946 they stumbled across the location that proved to be the answer to their dreams. It was a promontory on Dog Lake near Gutelius, a whistlestop no longer on VIA Rail timetables. Gutelius is a few miles west of Missanabie. The following summer they began construction. By freezup they moved in - after hauling over 40 tons of building supplies by boat from Missanabie. They made it through the first winter, hiking to Missanabie every two weeks to pick up their mail.

At one point they discovered some ancient Aboriginal artifacts right on their own property.

In the spring of 1948, the year of the terrible forest fires, the Moores carved a garden out of the Dog Lake bush. It yielded bumper crops of twenty-two kinds of vegetables. Later that summer Ruth returned

to Indiana to give birth to Dian, the first of their three children.

The home features a beautiful field stone fireplace and curving flag stone walkway from the dock to the front door. John didn't like pine very much so he imported walnut from Indiana for much of the inside finishing carpentry.

After three hard back-breaking years in the bush the Moores had had enough. John's book about their experiences and a subsequent novel continued to be rejected by publisher after publisher.

But the John

and Ruth did not totally abandon their home in the wilderness. John took a job teaching English at Wayne State University in Detroit and the family (which included two more children) summered at Dog Lake until 1956 when they sold the place to an Illinois businessman.

good financial report card Township handed

axpayers of Chapleau appear to have benefited on a policy of sound fiscal management on the part of its leaders last year.

This was the underlying theme as the township council and administration heard a detailed report on its financial

performance in 2007 presented by its accounting firm KPMG, last Monday.

"You held the line for a fairly positive result," stated Don Gariok, senior partner with the Sudbury accountants. Gariok led council through a detailed analysis of the municipality's financial performance in a budget totaling approximately \$6 million dollars.

While the township managed to continue to pay down debt, last year it dropped \$150,000, it also increased capital spending. A new fire truck, the refurbishing of the railway overpass and a new Zamboni ice maintenance machine for the

Moore arena were among the largest expenditures.

Notable for contributing to a drop of overall revenues to the township coffers, were a decrease in fuels sales at the airport, due to a lack of flying in a low forest fire season and a drop in revenue due to the cancellation of the Nature Festival.

Mayor Earle J. Freeborn described the annual financial statement as a clear picture of how well we did.

"It makes council feel confident we're going in the right direction. He noted the community continues to get a lot of capital expenditure work done.

En mêlant l'utile à l'agréable, un retraité contribue à assainir l'environnement



Une récolte pas comme les autres. Sur la photo, quelques-unes des canettes qui ont été récupérées au cours de l'été.

Vous avez peut-être remarqué son véhicule bleu stationné au bord des autoroutes en vous demandant bien ce que ce monsieur faisait là. Enfin le mystère est éclairé!

A p r è s s a retraite en novembre 2000, Jean-Pierre Côté meublait ses heures à entretenir sa propriété et ses véhicules et à faire du camping pendant l'été.

Or en 2006 dans le but de se mettre

en forme, M. Côté se mit à prendre des randonnées pédestres. Puisque son parcours journalier l'amenait le long des autoroutes, il se rendit compte de l'énorme quantité de bouteilles et de canettes vides jetées au bord du chemin.

Cette constatation se transforma en un rituel annuel: celui de ramasser vieilles canettes et bouteilles jetées le long des autoroutes de la région, jusqu'à Sultan en empruntant l'autoroute 129 Sud, au-delà du lac Horwoods ur l'autoroute 101 Est, et enfin jusqu'à Wawa sur l'autoroute 101 Ouest.

La cueillette se fait aux deux côtés du chemin. Une fois s t a t i o n n é s u r l'accotement, M. Côté se met ensuite à parcourir 3 kilomètres à pied dans un sens, puis revient sur ses pas de l'autre côté du chemin tout en continuant sa cueillette

Depuis 2006, M. Côté a récupéré 6,368 canettes, un exploit qui vaut à lui seul une économie de 1,356 litres de carburant qui auraient normalement servi à la production de canettes neuves et de 2,928 bouteilles. Chose plus inquiétante, la grande majorité des rebuts est composée de canettes et de bouteilles de De plus, la cueillette rapporta 80 grands sacs verts remplis de canettes de boissons gazeuses.

M. Côté a donc su se mettre en forme tout en assainissant l'environnement et peut-être même en prévenant les feux de forêt. "Parfois on a du mal à toucher les bouteilles tant le soleil le s a rendues brûlantes", dit M. Côté, "et les voilà couchées sur l'herbe desséchée" ajoute-t-il.

Même s'il ne se donne pas officiel-lement le nom de recycleur, ce rôle semble bien lui coller à la peau, si l'on en juge par le nombre de feuilles de carton et boîtes de canettes vides entreposées dans son garage prêtes à être emportées au poste de recyclage.

Un e fois revenu de ses randonnées, c'est là que le travail commence. Chaque canette destinée à l'usine de recyclage est écrasée au moyen d'un presseur à main modifié. "Le mot s'est donné que je collectionne les canettes " déclare M. Côté. "Il m'arrive parfois d'arriver à la maison et d'en retrouver une poche pleine qu'on a laissée au devant de ma porte" ajoute-t-il.

Comme le soulignent d'autres

articles qui ont paru dans le Chapleau Express, le recyclage est possible si on y met de la volonté et un effort honnête pour préserver l'environnement, faisant ainsi perdurer le site d'enfouissement et réduire les dépenses fiscales. Tout ce qu'il faut pour mettre le tout en marche, c'est l'effort d'individus comme M. Côté.



Missanabie names that also show up are Fletcher, Souliere, Mackenzie and Allen. Also making several appearances is Dick Mulligan, the prospector who mysteriously disappeared in the late 1950s.

John Moore was a master of description. His account of nights spent in the hotel in Missanabie and what was probably the Queen's Hotel in

Chapleau are hilarious. The word pictures he paints of Chapleau in the late 1940s, trips up highway 129, his description of the churches and the simple pleasure he got from gorging himself on milk at Broomhead's dairy are priceless. His story about the magic table that jumped around a room and accurately predicted scores of hockey games not yet played is simply

amazing. Likewise his tale about the Irish lumber camp cook who drowned in the early part of the last century – with his pockets full of gold nuggets.

Shortly after the publication of my book on the Chapleau Game Preserve I became aware of John Moore's amazing story. I managed to get in touch with Dian Moore and she invited me to meet her in Missanabie in the summer of 2006. She

arranged for tourist operator Mike Gratton to take us out to see the home that her parents had built. It is very much the same as it was in the late 1940s and is now owned by Ernie Martel of Missanabie who rents it to tourists.

On that visit to Missanabie I persuaded Dian to bring her father's wonderful manuscript back to life and in August of 2008 it was published by Trafford Publishing of

Vancouver. Because I think it is such an important part of Northern Ontario history I am helping Dian with marketing and distribution in

Canada. Other than minor out-of-pocket costs for postage and some advertising, I will receive no income from the sales of this remarkable book.



Backyard bonfires OK with

Questions by a Township councillor surrounding backyard bonfires within the community have been answered.

Earlier this



summer, councillor Rose Bertrand, responding to inquiries from some ratepayers, asked for clarification of the rules for those who wanting to light a small bonfire for a family back yard wiener roast or similar activity. Turns out, the municipality has a bylaw on its books regulating this activity and prescribing times for setting fires and precautions to be taken.

"Reading our bylaw, you need a permit to have one," stated councillor Bertrand. She foremost is the suggested inserting a notice in the weekly newspaper which would outline the details and also that their would be enforcement of the bylaw.

Councillor Doug Greig wondered what constitutes a yard fire and the description of what can be burned. An inspection of the

bylaw indicates there are several restrictions residents should be aware of before applying for a permit, which is free.

First and

requirement to obtain a permit from the Fire Department.

Apparently those who drafted the regulations had family back yard gatherings in mind when they wrote that fires are not allowed out of doors between the hours of eight oclock in the morning and eight o-clock in the evening.

And there are

restrictions on what can be burned. Don't burn kitchen garbage, construction materials made of or containing rubber plastic or tar. And only dry materials can be burned.

Don't send the kids out to start any fire. The bylaw clearly states no person shall set any fire out of doors except in the presence of a competent adult

who has to be there constantly.

The bylaw also takes neighbours into consideration when it states no outside fire, which causes inconvenience, or irritation to others is permitted.

Not adhering to the bylaw could be costly. It sets out a fine of not more than \$2,000 for anyone convicted of an offence.

He raised his concerns during the regular meeting of the township municipal council last Monday after earlier observing two municipal workers under the Leisure and and Culture Services

While the township will inquire into the availability of the machine, Councillor Greig suggested it should be put to use on the front entrance to the municipal building. "It would look a lot better," he concluded.


