Founded some three years ago by Lafrenière and his good friend Gabriel Bronfman from Mexico, the group has since performed in Mexico, Canada, the US, and Europe and have been featured on live recordings for national radio in both countries. They have performed at many international jazz festivals both here in Canada and Mexico, notably the Festival International de Jazz de Montreal at which

they hope to return to this coming summer.

"We are currently planning the recording of our next album. I was in Mexico some months ago to map out ideas for the next record" says Lafrenière . "We did some pre-production track recording to help us iron out the final results" he adds.

distance has actually pushed them to find new and unique ways of making the group work. As a result, both Lafrenière and Bronfman work with collaborators in their respective countries and have now built a team of about a dozen musicians between Canada and Mexico.

Working with a diversity of ethnic backgrounds results in having to learn new languages and playing new instruments. which in turn constantly evolves their composing styles.

Lafrenière also works as a solo artist mainly on vocals, guitar, cavaquinho (a small Brazilian guitar) and a "stomp-box" which is a cigar type


box containing a music academy and microphone that is create percussion.

When working solo, Lafrenière combines the best of what he has learned on drums while performing with the two groups and breaks it down into something that is more simple, acoustic yet still very melodic and percussive. 

Jacques Tremblay has been a First Aid/CPR Instructor for over 15 years and has certified well over 1,000 First


Aiders. Why does he do it? He says it started as a hobby, but one quickly takes notice of his passion to help others during his classroom instruction.



INVITATION TO COMMENT Proposed Crown Land Use Amendment

The Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) invites public comment on its proposal to amend the Crown land use policy for two specific policy areas within MNR's Chapleau administrative district to permit the disposition of Crown land for agricultural development.

Chapleau District's land use policy for 'G1770 - General Use Areas' and 'G1802 - Vehicle Access Recreation Areas' currently prohibits Crown land disposition for the purpose of agricultural land use. This policy has been in place since the inception of the District Land Use Guidelines (1983) and was based on the understanding that the Chapleau District area was considered to be unsuitable for traditional forms of agriculture, which generally require a specific class of soil type. MNR is now proposing to allow the disposition of Crown land for the purpose of agricultural land-use, including non-traditional forms of agricultural development (i.e. commercial blueberry production, etc.) to accommodate additional sustainable economic development opportunities in this area of northern Ontario.

MNR is requesting public comments on this amendment proposal. Please ensure that all comments are received by November 17, 2008.




