Possession and Acquisition Course Offered by the Chapleau Education and Training Coalition

Soon will be the time of the year when it seems that half of the population of Chapleau dress up in orange clothing, load up their ATV's and head straight for the forest. This is a serious yearly ritual for our local hunters.

The interest in hunting continues to be high in the Chapleau region which is one of the best hunting regions in Ontario. It is not surprising that the

interest in obtaining the possession and acquisition license and the hunting license is highly desired. Thanks to a devout local sportsman, our Deputy Mayor, André Byham, these licenses can be obtained locally.

André taught his first course in 1979. André is presently the only qualified person in Chapleau to give these courses. Always interested in nature and

being a teacher, he was approached by the end

of the 70's by local residents who asked him to take on this initiative.

The possession and acquisition license is required for those who wish to possess and buy a firearm. The future hunters must acquire both qualifications before taking possession of a firearm and hunting.

Those interested can register for a course, which is usually offered during the weekends, by contacting the Chapleau Education and Training Coalition at 864.9434.

Armand Garnet Ruffo's award winning movie 'A Windigo Tale' selected to be shown at two Ontario film festivals this Fall

Chapleau Moments

Armand Garnet Ruffo's award winning film, *A Windigo Tale* which deals with the intergenerational impact of the residential school system in Canada, framed as both a mystery and a ghost story of sorts, will be shown at two film festivals in Ontario this Fall.

On September 22, it will be shown at the Cinefest Sudbury Film Festival (<http://cinefest.com/films/windigo-tale/>) and in Toronto on October 24 at the Imagine-Native International Film Festival. (<http://www.imagenative.org>)

Born and raised in Chapleau, Armand now is a

professor at Carleton University, and in an email says he did "A lot of moving around, different schools and jobs, constantly writing," after leaving his home town.

"Then in 1989 I got a scholarship to attend the writing program at The Banff Centre in Alberta, and that more or less gave me the encouragement (and courage, I guess) to continue. I'm still at it after all these years supplementing my income by teaching literature and creative writing at Carleton University in Ottawa. And now the film stuff... one thing leads to another.

"Most recently a poem of mine will appear in the 2010

Best Canadian Poetry anthology (Tightrope Books)"

"Although both my parents came from out of town, my mom from Biscotasing and my dad from Metagama," Armand said, "I grew up in Chapleau and did my primary and secondary schooling there. For a kid growing up in the 70's, it was a marvelous place that offered the kind of freedom few kids in the city can even imagine. What comes to mind are the amazing lakes we have up there -- I probably spent just as much time in the water as I did on land. (If I wasn't in school I was probably out fishing!)"

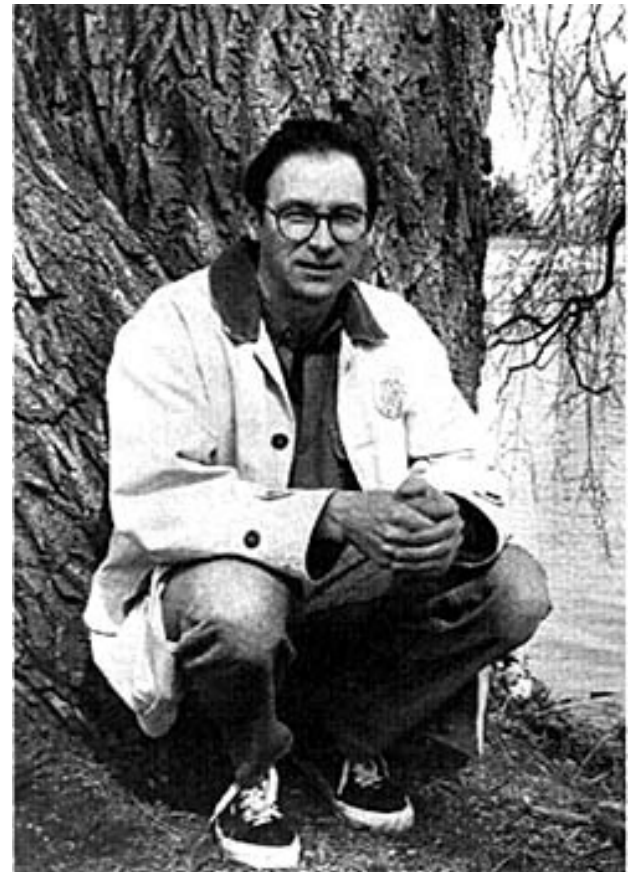
"And yes, as you noted, (in an email to him) I played some hockey like most kids in town, but for me it was mostly on the back river or midnight at the arena. This brings me to the friends I had growing up and the sense of community.

In this regard, Chapleau was second to none. It is these things that I continue to carry with me through life.

On Native wiki.org an entry reveals that Armand has also taught creative writing at both the Banff Centre for the Arts and the En'owkin International School of Writing in Penticton, British Columbia. (http://www.nativewiki.org/Armand_Garnet_Ruffo)

It adds that he is a former director of the Centre for Aboriginal Education, Research and Culture and his work is strongly influenced by his Ojibwe heritage. "His first collection of poetry, *Opening in the Sky*, reveals an abiding interest in the complexities of Aboriginal identity in a multicultural society. His second book, *Grey Owl: The Mystery of Archie Belaney*, further raises difficult questions about voice and identity, aboriginal culture, human rights and the environment." His third collection of poetry, *At Geronimo's Grave*, employs "Geronimo's life as a metaphor for the many abandoned native people on this continent, trapped in the slow-moving vehicle of another culture which is taking them nowhere.

"His latest book in progress, *Norval Morrisseau: Man Changing Into Thunderbird*, is a

creative biography of the renowned Ojibwe painter and founder of the Woodland School, Norval Morrisseau, *Copper Thunderbird*. In addition, he has written plays, stories and essays, which continue to appear in literary periodicals, including *Red Ink*, *Rampike*, *CVIL*, and *absinthe*, and anthologies in both Canada and the United States."

Armand first wrote *A Windigo Tale* as a play in 2001 winning a CBC Arts Performance Award. Then he decided to turn it into a movie, which he wrote and directed.

Armand explained in a recent email to me: "As for the movie that I wrote and directed, it is called *A Windigo Tale*, and it essentially deals with the intergene-

rational impact of the residential school system in Canada. As you probably know from the numerous reports culminating in the Prime Minister's (Stephen Harper) apology in 2008, for the longest time what went on in those schools was Canada's dirty little secret. Generations of Native children were literally torn from their families and forced to assimilate, most often brutally, into Euro-Canadian society. Stories of physical and sexual abuse are rampant.

"Anyway, my story takes its title from the evil Windigo manitou, which according to Ojibway mythology is an insatiable cannibalistic creature, because I think what went on in

Initiatives culturelles:

Chapleau est très riche en culture. L'immigration et les migrations nous ont amené des résidents de tous les coins du monde. Chaque culture célèbre son héritage à travers la langue, la danse, des mets uniques,

l'artisanat et des traditions. Chaque culture a des trésors spéciaux à partager.

Chapleau est un portrait authentique du patrimoine culturel Canadien et cet attribut est invitant pour nos visiteurs. Avec ceci à l'idée, nous pouvons faire la différence en organisant des célébrations, des activités, des festivals pour mettre en vedette les multiples cultures de

Chapleau et attirer des visiteurs à notre communauté pour qu'ils apprennent à célébrer et de vivre nos cultures.

Nous pouvons élaborer et maintenir un système élaboré de pistes longeant la bordure de la rivière et ensuite rejoignant les points d'intérêts de Chapleau. L'affichage avec de l'information intéressante motiverait nos voyageurs d'arrêter et de demeurer à Chapleau pour profiter de ce qu'il y a. Le tout serait relier à l'histoire de Chapleau et son développement comme une communauté.

On doit avertir

de cette piste à partir de l'endroit où la grande route 101 rencontre la grande route 129 pour lancer une invitation aux gens de visiter cette piste.

Chapleau a été bien reconnu pour ses succès du passé tel que le Festival de la Nature, le tournoi de pêche, le Trade Show pour en mentionner quelques uns. Revitalisation Communautaire:

Notre site Web doit être maintenu et amélioré constamment.

Comment y arriver sans faire faillite budgétaire?

Il y a un besoin urgent de maintenir en ordre les atouts que nous possédons déjà. Plusieurs individus, groupes et organisations adressent déjà certains problèmes d'entretien ce qui rend efficace et économique certains travaux de revitalisation.

Il faut également prendre de petites bouchées à la fois et établir des objectifs à court terme et à long terme. À une période de temps où l'argent est rare, il faut prendre les éléments

du plan de revitalisation et les morceler en petits projets dont on peut avoir les moyens budgétaires et dont les octrois sont disponibles à ce moment. Quelques éléments comme les affiches ne sont pas très dispendieuses et sont nécessaires à la viabilité économique de notre communauté.

Il faut aussi être connaissant des agences provinciales et fédérales qui offrent des octrois pour le développement. On doit surveiller la fréquence avec laquelle ils soumettent des offres d'octrois pour bénéficier pleinement des occasions présentées.

Nous devons bénéficier pleinement des ces octrois car ceci soulage le fardeau des taxes payés par les citoyens.

Pour que notre Chapleau rayonne, il serait préférable d'encourager des partenariats avec des organisations, des commerces et des groupes. Ceci nous permet de multiplier nos efforts ce qui résulte dans un sens de fierté, d'unité et d'accomplissement. Un Chapleau uni est un Chapleau Fort.

those schools was a kind of consumption of the human spirit. Of course, I didn't simply want to write a didactic expose so the story is framed as both a mystery and a ghost story of sorts.

"Due to financing issues it took much longer than expected to finish it -- making a feature film in Canada is no small feat. But it is now finished and has been garnering attention and even winning a few awards. It won Best Picture and Best Actress (Jani Lauzon) in Edmonton (at the Dreamspeakers Film Festival) in June, and it was recently

selected to close the ImagineNative International Film Festival in Toronto in October."

He added: "I could go on and talk more about the film and what made me want to make it, but I think it is best simply to see it. Lastly, I should add that although my parents have passed on, I still have family on Fox Lake Reserve, and I try to get up there and onto the lakes whenever I can."

Armand mentioned playing "midnight" hockey in the old Chapleau Memorial Community Arena. Let me explain. Armand was a member of the 1970-71

Chapleau Midgets hockey team that I was coaching, and I had made it clear that the players were to be on time for practice at eight a.m. Saturday morning. It was amazing. When I arrived shortly before eight, there they were all dressed sitting in the dressing room ready to go.

Some time later Jamie Doyle, the team captain told me that they arrived at the arena around midnight, entered through a back door and played shinny all night, adding this way they were sure to be on time.

Congratulations to Armand on his literary achievements and I hope that if any readers are in Sudbury or Toronto this Fall when A Windigo Tale is being shown, they will attend, and yes as he notes, Chapleau was "second to none" as place to grow up. My email is mj.morris@live.ca



Poste de Maire

Résumé de biographie

-Né à Chapleau, Ontario. Etudes à l'école de Chapleau jusqu'au grade 13.

-Début du travail au CPR à l'âge de 12 ans jusqu'à l'âge de 33 ans comme mécanicien-pompier de locomotive. Simultanément, j'ai suivi un cours par correspondance de ICS sur l'administration des Chemins de fer que j'ai réussi avec succès.

J'ai nettoyé le terrain, construit et fait fonctionner le Pellow's Cottage de 1953 jusqu'en 1962 sur la rivière Chapleau. Il est actuellement la propriété de monsieur Hugh Kuttner.

J'ai suivi des cours hors faculté de l'université Queens tout en travaillant sur les chemins de fer et en étudiant à la maison. J'ai ainsi obtenu une partie du diplôme en lettres. Je me suis inscrit en 1958 et ai

complété mon diplôme en l'espace de deux ans... J'ai ainsi obtenu une licence en Economie et

Psychologie. En 1960, j'ai été accepté à l'Université de Toronto et j'ai obtenu en 1964 un diplôme de docteur en chirurgie dentaire terminant dans les premiers 5% de la faculté. J'ai vendu ma clientèle la première fois à London Insurance Co. et à un étudiant animé d'esprit d'entreprise à qui j'avais enseigné à l'Université Western. J'ai racheté cette clientèle lorsque leur association a mal tourné.

Leur façon de fonctionner a fait qu'ils se sont retrouvés sous contrôle judiciaire. Je l'ai racheté de ce contrôle judiciaire, remise sur pieds et l'ai revendue à nouveau.

J'ai suivi des cours de français à l'Université Western

au au Fanshawe collège de London. Je commets encore des erreurs, cependant j'essaie et je m'amuse beaucoup. Les occasions et les besoins de parler et de pratiquer les langues sont assez limités.

J'ai enseigné à l'Université de Toronto ainsi qu'à l'Université Western à temps partiel pour une période de dix ans. J'ai acheté mon premier édifice commercial alors que j'étais étudiant. J'avais dix dollars en poche et la banque ainsi que le courtier ont accepté mon offre. Cet édifice m'appartient toujours.

En 1975, à une intersection achalandée de la ville, j'ai démolit 9 maisons pour lesquelles j'avais obtenu une entente globale et construit un édifice de 4 étages à vocation professionnelle. J'ai dirigé une clientèle de 15 fauteuils de dentiste à l'étage supérieur, engageant plusieurs dentistes et du person-

nel de soutien pour un total de 24-36 personnes. J'ai suivi les cours du Ontario Real Estate Board en 1990 sauf celui de courtier. J'ai obtenu 98% au niveau de l'évaluation. J'ai alors été mon propre courtier.

J'ai agi comme président du Capital Funding pour une maison de retraite à London évaluée à 6,5 millions. Cette résidence fonctionne de façon autonome maintenant. Je demeure Président Honoraire.

J'ai été élu au plus haut poste de Masonic Fraternal organization de l'ontario en 1988. Il y avait à ce moment 90,000 membres. Les actifs en argent associés à l'immobilier se chiffrent à plus de 15 millions. Il existe 568 loges en Ontario. Recueillir de l'argent pour faire la charité est notre priorité.

J'ai été Potentate des shriners en 1991 pour le sud-ouest de l'ontario, avec

les quartiers généraux à London. Les hôpitaux pour enfants sont la priorité de cet oragnisme. Plus de 1.8 millions de dollars est amassé chaque jour en Amérique du Nord pour les hôpitaux Shriners pour enfants (grands brûlés et orthopédie). Il y a 4500 membres à London. J'ai été orateur invité dans toutes les provinces canadiennes sauf Terre-Neuve. Cet honneur m'a aussi été conféré du Maine aux Carolines et aussi loin qu'en Indiana aux États-Unis. Des distinctions spéciales m'ont également été accordées au New Hampshire, Vermont, en Nouvelle-Ecosse, Saskatchewan, au Massachusetts, à Vancouver, Toronto, Banff, Baltimore et d'autres endroits. Ces honneurs m'ont été décernés pour mes habiletés de meneur, des projets innova-



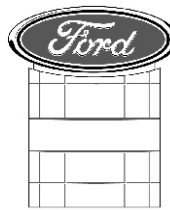
